Stat. § 62-133.4(c) and Commission Rule R1-17(k)(6) for the purpose of comparing PSNC's prudently incurred gas costs with costs recovered from all of the utility's customers served during the test period. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

PSNC filed testimony relating to the subject matter of this hearing on June 1, 2020.
