

Neustar, Inc., in its role as the North American Numbering Plan Administrator (“NANPA”), submits the following Amended Motion for Extension of Time for the filing requirement in the Order Approving All-Services Distributed Overlay Option to Provide Area Code Relief dated August 13, 2014 (“Relief Order”). In the Relief Order, the Commission requires that the schedule for implementation of the all-services distributed overlay in the 336 area code be filed for informational purposes within 30 days of the date of the Relief Order. As explained below, NANPA and the industry members may not be able to schedule and conduct a meeting, come to consensus on a schedule, and file the consensus schedule with the Commission within the 30 days.

On August 13, 2014, the Commission issued the Relief Order approving an all-services distributed overlay as the relief plan for the 336 NPA. As part of that order, the Commission requires that the schedule for implementation of the all-services distributed overlay in the 336

area code be filed for informational purposes within 30 days of the date of the Relief Order. Therefore the current deadline for filing the implementation schedule is September 12, 2014.

BASIS FOR EXTENSION

To comply with the ordered deadline, NANPA must schedule a meeting for industry members and provide the industry with two weeks' notice prior to the meeting. NANPA issued the notice and the meeting was held on September 4. Following the meeting, NANPA will publish the minutes of the meeting and will give the industry members time in which to review and offer changes to the minutes. This review period is typically seven days after which the minutes become final. Seven days after September 4 is September 11, only one day before the filing deadline. Without an extension of time, NANPA and the Industry would only have one day after the minutes have become final in which to produce the filing. Such a tight timeframe does not allow for any scheduling problems that might arise or provide any extra time for revisions or changes to the meeting minutes or to the filing itself.


In order to ensure that there is enough time for the industry to arrive at a consensus decision with regard to the relief implementation schedule and for industry members to review and offer changes to the schedule and to the filing, NANPA requests a 30 day extension to the filing requirement.

NANPA has contacted each party listed on the service list and has confirmed that none have any objection to the request for an extension of time.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, NANPA respectfully requests the Commission promptly enter an order extending the current implementation schedule filing deadline by 30 days.
