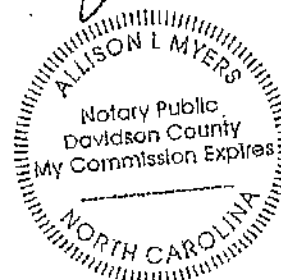

Accordingly, the Commission will conduct a hearing in High Point, North Carolina, beginning on Monday, June 23, 2014 at 7:00 p.m., High Point Courthouse - The Washington Courtroom, 505 East Green Drive, High Point, North Carolina 27261 and continue on Tuesday, June 24, 2014 at 10:00 a.m., at the same location, for the purpose of receiving public comment on the matter of area code relief for the 336 area code. The evening hearing on June 23, 2014 shall be conducted for the sole purpose of receiving testimony and comments from members of the public. Members of the public who are unable to attend the evening public hearing on June 23, 2014, will be allowed to testify on the morning of June 24,

2014. The Commission will receive testimony from all formal parties, including the industry participants; the Public Staff, Attorney General, and any other interveners, during the hearing. The formal parties shall present a summary of their written comments and be prepared to respond to questions from the Commission.

Pursuant to G.S. 14-269.4, absent certain specific exceptions, it is unlawful for any person to possess or carry, whether openly or concealed, any deadly weapon, not used solely for instructional or officially sanctioned ceremonial purposes, in any building housing any court of the General Court of Justice. Therefore, weapons are strictly prohibited at the hearings scheduled in this docket in county courthouses. Everyone entering the county courthouse shall pass through a metal detector, and any weapons found will be seized.

Persons desiring to send written statements to the Commission should submit their statement supporting the industry recommendation, or any alternative proposal, on or before June 27, 2014, and should include any information that those persons wish to be
