MOTION OF THE PUBLIC STAFF TO COMPEL

NOW COMES the Public Staff, by and through its Executive Director, Christopher J. Ayers, and moves the Commission to compel Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC d/b/a Red Bird Water (Red Bird or Company), to fully and promptly respond to Public Staff Data Request No. 13 as detailed below. In support of this motion, the Public Staff respectfully shows the Commission the following:

1. On June 7, 2021, Red Bird and Total Environmental Solutions, Inc. (TESI), filed with the Commission an Application for Transfer of Public Utility Franchise and for Approval of Rates seeking authority to transfer the water and wastewater utility systems and public utility franchise serving Lake Royale Subdivision in Franklin and Nash Counties, North Carolina, from TESI to Red Bird and approval of rates.

2. On July 11, 2023, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearings, Establishing Discovery Guidelines, and Requiring Customer Notice (Scheduling Order) scheduling deadlines for the completion of discovery in this matter and the filing of testimony. Under Item 6 of the discovery guidelines, the objecting party shall file any objections with the Commission, with a copy of the relevant discovery request attached. The party seeking discovery then has two business days to file a motion to compel, and the objecting party has one business day thereafter to respond.

3. On August 25, 2023, Red Bird filed a Motion for Extension of Time to File Testimony requesting an extension of time, *nunc pro tunc*, to Wednesday, August 30, 2023, to file direct testimony, that the deadline for the Public Staff and intervenors, if any, to file testimony be extended to September 19, 2023, and that the October 3, 2023 due date for filing any rebuttal testimony by Red Bird remain the same as set in the Scheduling Order. The Commission granted this motion on the same day.

4. On August 24, 2023, the Public Staff sent Red Bird its Data Request No. 13, with the subject line of "Affiliates."

5. On August 30, 2023, the Company filed objections to Data Request No. 13 in these dockets. Specifically, the Company objected to each of the six items in the data request: 13-1, 13-2, 13-3, 13-4, 13-5, and 13-6. (Exhibit A)

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6. In response to each of the items, Red Bird asserts that the information sought is "overbroad, unduly burdensome, and neither relevant to any issues that are or may be involved in these dockets, nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence." Red Bird also objects to each item "on the basis that it is vague, ambiguous, and indefinite, and calls for speculation."

7. According to the Explanation of Corporate Structure filed by Red Bird on August 2, 2022, (Exhibit B) in these dockets, "[i]n North Carolina, Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC, holds (or will hold) all acquired utility assets and will operate as a regulated utility. Red Bird Utility Holding Company, LLC, the intermediate holding company, is the sole member of Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC and North Carolina Central States Water Resources, LLC, the state holding company, is the sole member of Red Bird Utility Holding Company, LLC. . . . CSWR, LLC ("CSWR") is the sole member of North Carolina Central States Water Resources." The document further indicates that CSWR was acquired by U.S. Water Systems, LLC (US Water), in late 2018. (CSWR/Central States Water Resources Corporate Entity Organizational Chart filed on August 2, 2022, attached as Exhibit C).

8. The website of Scienswater (Sciens), <u>https://scienswater.com/</u>, indicates that it is "a fundamental research-driven investor that identifies pockets of opportunity in the water sector that benefit from long-term macro factors but are uncovered, under-researched and misunderstood, and consequently undercapitalized by the capital markets. Sciens makes control investments in the U.S.

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water infrastructure and related companies where it can generate both yield and capital appreciation through application of value-added strategies, developed through over 25 years of private equity investment experience." (Webpage accessed August 31, 2023, and attached as Exhibit D). Under the "Our Portfolio" tab, Central States Water Resources is the first entity listed as part of Sciens's portfolio. (Exhibit E) Further, three members of Sciens's Investment Opportunity Fund Investment Team as listed on its website and in Exhibit D, John Rigas, Daniel Standen, and Tom Rooney are also three of the four members of CSWR's Board of Directors, as listed on the attached Registration Report from the Missouri Secretary of State dated April 18, 2023. (Exhibit F) Further, the fourth member of CSWR's board is Josiah Cox. Mr. Cox is President of three Red Bird affiliates: Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC; Central States Water Resources, Inc. and CSWR, LLC. (See Testimony of Josiah Cox, lines 6-8, filed in these dockets on August 30, 2023).

9. On the September 8, 2021 episode of the podcast "(Don't) Waste Water"¹ at approximately 20:30, Sciens partner, Alexander Loucopoulos, said regarding Sciens's relationship with CSWR, "we own the company and we drive the strategy . . . we're controlling and building a business"

10. Data Request No. 13 seeks information regarding affiliates of Red Bird and this information is critical for the Public Staff to gain an understanding of the corporate structure of Red Bird, parent companies, and other affiliates in order

to determine the financial viability of Red Bird. Knowledge of the affiliates and corporate structure will allow the Public Staff to target and narrow future data requests so that they seek the appropriate information and allow the Public Staff to determine its position on Red Bird's application in the most efficient manner.

11. For instance, in Redacted Attachment K.1 – Financials filed on January 24, 2022 (Exhibit G), the cash flow assumptions on page four indicate that "Funds Provided by Owner change year-over-year to bring the Cash Balance at End of Year from a negative dollar amount to \$0." The projections for the first year estimate an operating loss of \$166,612, while the following four years project a positive net income. According to the Statement of Cash Flows, Red Bird expects the following cash flows from financing activities in Year One of the 5-year period captured in Exhibit G: \$534,972 of proceeds from long-term debt; \$534,972 of proceeds from equity; and \$118,465 of funds provided by owner. It will be necessary to understand who the "owner" referenced is, how that "owner" is funded, and other financial arrangements between the "owner" and other affiliates.

12. Public Staff Data Request No. 13 is partially a follow-up to Public Staff Data Request No. 10, where Red Bird indicated that it had no information about the ownership of US Water, the sole owner of CSWR, LLC; whether US Water owns other entities; or whether US Water has affiliates. Red Bird further stated that it did not have access to US Water's financial statements or tax returns. (See Responses to Items 1 - 5 of PSDR 10, attached as Exhibit H).

13. In assessing the financial viability of Red Bird, the Public Staff is seeking information regarding the upstream ownership of Red Bird and the funding commitments and arrangements between US Water; CSWR, LLC; and/or Sciens (or any of the entities listed as part of Sciens's portfolio on Sciens's website, including, but not limited to, Integrated Water Services, Inc.; CROM, LLC; Sciens Water Finance Corporation; and/or Sciens Water Digital Holdings (collectively, the Sciens Portfolio entities)).

14. CSWR's response to Item 1(a) indicating that it has no legal, financial, or operating relationships or affiliations with Sciens frankly strains credulity given that Sciens's website lists CSWR as part of its portfolio and that one of its partners publicly stated that Sciens owns and controls CSWR. CSWR either knows or should know information regarding its relationships and affiliations with Sciens or other Sciens Portfolio entities.

15. Public Staff Data Request No. 13 seeks information necessary to identify which Sciens Portfolio entities, if any, are affiliates or vendors of Red Bird. Moreover, it is vital that the Commission and the Public Staff have information regarding the existence of transfers, sales, expense allocations, agreements, and similar arrangements between Red Bird and any direct or indirect affiliates, because transfers, sales, expense allocations, agreements, and similar arrangements may necessitate such things as regulatory conditions, reporting requirements, approval of agreements, and audits.

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16. In Data Request No. 13, Item 6, the Public Staff requests copies of all discovery responses produced by any affiliate of Red Bird in a rate case filed in Missouri by a Red Bird affiliate, Confluence Rivers Utility Operating Company, Inc. (Confluence Rivers),² in Docket No. WR-2023-0006. In that matter, on August 10, 2023, the Missouri Public Service Commission ordered Confluence Rivers to produce Investment Memoranda prepared by CSWR and transmitted to US Water's Board of Directors for the purposes of requesting funding associated in total or in any part with Confluence Rivers or potential Missouri acquisitions over the past four and a half years (Exhibit I). Should these memoranda contain information regarding CSWR's request for funding for itself or its affiliates' North Carolina operations, the information would certainly be relevant in this matter. Should the memoranda only contain Missouri-specific information, the memoranda would still be reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence pursuant to Rule 26 of the North Carolina Rules of Evidence because the Public Staff would be able to understand how financing is arranged between CSWR and its affiliates and tailor future data requests to seek similar information that is North Carolinaspecific in a manner that is not overly broad or burdensome. Moreover, this request for information is not overly broad or burdensome in that it requests

copies of information already gathered and provided by CSWR in the Missouri proceeding.

17. The Public Staff moves the Commission for an order compelling Red Bird to fully and promptly respond to each item of the Public Staff's Data Request No. 13 that is the subject of Red Bird's objections in this docket.

WHEREFORE, the Public Staff moves:

1. That the Commission direct Red Bird to fully and promptly respond to all portions of Public Staff Data Request No. 13 within a deadline the Commission deems reasonable.

2. For such other and further relief as the Commission may deem just and proper.

Please describe any and all past or present legal, financial, or operating relationships, affiliation, or similar arrangement between US Water Systems, LLC; CSWR, LLC; and/or Scienswater (or any of the entities listed as part of Scienswater's portfolio on Scienswater's website,¹ including, but not limited to, Integrated Water Services, Inc.; CROM, LLC; Sciens Water Finance Corporation; and/or Sciens Water Digital Holdings (collectively, the Scienswater Portfolio entities)).
- b. Please describe any and all anticipated future involvement, affiliation, relationship, or similar arrangement between the entities listed in 1.a.

Objections and Response: Red Bird objects to this Request on the basis that it seeks information that is overbroad, unduly burdensome, and neither relevant to any issues that are or may be involved in these dockets, nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery

of admissible evidence. Red Bird also objects to the Request on the basis that it is vague, ambiguous, and indefinite, and calls for speculation.

Subject to those objections and without waiving same, Red Bird responds as follows:

- a. US Water Systems, LLC, is the sole owner/member of CSWR, LLC, and as such provides equity capital to CSWR, LLC, which it uses to make equity investments in its affiliated utility operating companies, including Red Bird. CSWR, LLC has no legal, financial, or operating relationships or affiliations with Sciens Water or any of the other entities listed on Sciens Water's website.
- b. Other than its current relationship and involvement with US Water, LLC, CSWR, LLC has no information regarding any planned future legal, financial, or operational involvement, affiliation, or relationship with Sciens Water or any of the other entities listed on Sciens Water's website.

Request 2: Midwest Water Operations, LLC

- a. Please describe any and all past or present legal, financial, or operating relationships, affiliation, or similar arrangement between US Water Systems, LLC; CSWR, LLC; Scienswater; and/or Midwest Water Operations, LLC.
- b. Please describe any and all anticipated future involvement, affiliation, relationship, or similar arrangement between any of the entities listed in 2.a.

Objections and Response: Red Bird objects to this Request on the basis that it seeks information that is overbroad, unduly burdensome, and neither relevant to any issues that are or may be involved in these dockets, nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Red Bird also objects to the Request on the basis that it is vague, ambiguous, and indefinite, and calls for speculation.

Subject to those objections and without waiving same, Red Bird responds as follows:

- a. CSWR, LLC's past and current relationships with Midwest Water Operations, LLC, have been solely of a vendor/customer nature. CSWR, LLC has no information regarding past or present legal, financial, or operating relationships, if any, between Midwest Water Operations, LLC, and either US Water Systems, LLC or Sciens Water.
- b. CSWR, LLC anticipates any future relationships it may have with Midwest Water Operations LLC would be of a similar vendor/customer nature. CSWR, LLC has no information regarding possible future relationships between Midwest Water Operations, LLC and either US Water, LLC or Sciens Water.

Request 3: ClearWater Solutions, LLC

- a. Please describe any and all past or present legal, financial, or operating relationships, affiliation, or similar arrangement between US Water Systems, LLC; CSWR, LLC; Scienswater; and/or ClearWater Solutions, LLC.
- b. Please describe any anticipated future involvement, affiliation, relationship, or similar arrangement between any of the entities listed in 3.a.

Objections and Response: Red Bird objects to this Request on the basis it seeks information that is overbroad, unduly burdensome, and neither relevant to any issues that are or may be involved in this Docket, nor reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Red Bird also objects to the Request on the basis that it is vague, ambiguous, and indefinite, and calls for speculation.

Subject to those objections and without waiving same, Red Bird responds as follows:

- a. CSWR, LLC's past and current relationships with Clearwater Solutions, LLC have been solely of a vendor/customer nature. CSWR, LLC has no information regarding past or present legal, financial, or operating relationships, if any, between Clearwater Solutions, LLC, and either US Water Systems, LLC, or Sciens Water.
- b. CSWR, LLC anticipates any future relationships it may have with Clearwater Solutions, LLC would be of a similar vendor/customer nature. CSWR, LLC has no information regarding possible future relationships between Clearwater Solutions, LLC and either US Water, LLC, or Sciens Water.

Request 4: Goods and Services between Affiliates

- a. Are any of the entities listed in response to questions 2 and 3 above providing goods or services to North Carolina CSWR, LLC; Red Bird Utility Holding Company, LLC; and/or Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC?

a. Clearwater Solutions, LLC, as successor in interest to Midwest Water Operations, LLC, currently provides operations and maintenance service on a contract basis to

Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC. Neither Clearwater Solutions, LLC nor Midwest Water Operations provides any services to North Carolina CSWR, LLC or Red Bird Utility Holding Company, LLC.

- b. See response to DR 13.4(a) above.
- c. A copy of the contract between Clearwater Solutions, LLC, and Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC, will be provided to Public Staff when his response is served.

Request 5: Goods and Services between Other Entities of Interest

Objections: Red Bird objects to this Request on the basis that the requested production of "all discovery responses" provided "by any Affiliate or Red Bird" in connection with a Missouri rate case is overbroad, unduly burdensome, and seeks documents that are neither relevant to any issues that are or may be involved in these dockets, and that this request is not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Red Bird also objects to the Request on the basis that it is vague, ambiguous, and indefinite.

Red Bird also objects to this request on the grounds that under North Carolina Session Law 2023-67, entitled "An Act to Expedite Transfer of Water or Wastewater Public Utilities," the issues presented in these dockets, which concern the proposed transfer of TESI's utility assets and franchise to Red Bird, are limited to the following:

[Whether] the proposed grant or transfer, including adoption of existing or proposed rates for the transferring utility, is in the public interest, will not adversely affect service to the public under any existing franchise, and the person acquiring said franchise or certificate of public convenience and necessity has the technical, managerial, and financial capabilities necessary to provide public utility service to the public.

The request for production of discovery responses provided by a Red Bird affiliate in connection with a rate case before the Missouri Public Service Commission seeks materials that are neither relevant to any issues involved in these dockets, nor is the request reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence.

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Explanation of Corporate Structure

The entity/corporate structure in place in North Carolina for Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC's affiliate group – consisting of the utility operating company, an intermediate holding company, and a state holding company – is a legacy structure that predates the acquisition of CSWR, LLC, by U.S. Water Systems, LLC, in late 2018. Prior to that acquisition, affiliates operating in Missouri and Arkansas – which were the affiliated group's only operations at that time – utilized an identical three-tiered structure. After U.S. Water System's acquisition, the legacy structure was replicated in each new state the affiliate group entered.

In North Carolina, Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC, holds (or will hold) all acquired utility assets and will operate as a regulated utility. Red Bird Utility Holding Company, LLC, the intermediate holding company, is the sole member of Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC and North Carolina Central States Water Resources, LLC, the state holding company, is the sole member of Red Bird Utility Holding Company, LLC. Neither the intermediate or state holding companies have assets or employees, so their existence adds no operating or administrative costs to the utility operating company.


CSWR, LLC ("CSWR") is the sole member of North Carolina Central States Water Resources. CSWR employs all administrative, professional, and other personnel providing affiliated services to Red Bird Utility Operating Company, LLC and all its various state utility operating company affiliates. Costs incurred by CSWR are either direct charged to an affiliate or are allocated using the Massachusetts allocation methodology. CSWR also provides its utility operating affiliates equity capital necessary to make acquisitions and to fund required capital improvements, and provides working capital to fund day-to-day operations until compensatory rates can be established.

Central States Water Resources, Inc., is the designated manager of all affiliated limited liability companies both inside and outside North Carolina, and exists solely for that purpose. Central States Water Resources, Inc. has no assets or paid employees, and performs its managerial responsibilities using CSWR personnel.


CSWR/Central States Water Resources Corporate Entity Organizational Chart

ORDER REGARDING OPC'S MOTION TO COMPEL

Procedural History

On July 31, 2023,¹ the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC) issued data request (DR) 3069, which requested copies of the quarterly Investment Memorandums that are prepared by "CSWR" and transmitted to US Water Systems LLC (US Water) for the purposes of requesting funding.²

On August 4, OPC filed its *Motion to Compel* (Motion) regarding DR 3069. The Commission subsequently sought further detail as to what corporate entity OPC intended, Central States Water Resources, Inc. (commonly abbreviated to "CSWR") or the corporate entity named with the acronym, CSWR, LLC. OPC responded that the OFFICIAL COPY

documents that reference the quarterly memoranda are titled with the name "Central States Water Resources" without either an Inc. or LLC designation.

OPC stated its belief that the document is referencing Central States Water Resources, Inc. (CSWR, Inc.); however, OPC stated its understanding that CSWR, Inc. does not have any employees. Thus, OPC suggested that the quarterly Investment Memorandums would have to be prepared by employees of CSWR, LLC, as it is the only Central States Water Resources entity to have employees.

Confluence Rivers Utility Operating Company, Inc. (Confluence Rivers or "the Company") is owned by Confluence Rivers UHC, LLC³, which is owned by Missouri CSWR, LLC, which is owned by CSWR, LLC, which is owned by US Water. CSWR, Inc. was the previous parent company until CSWR, LLC was purchased by US Water from CSWR, Inc. CSWR, Inc. now acts as the manager of CSWR, LLC and Confluence Rivers.

On August 9, the Company filed its response (Response). Confluence Rivers raised an objection as to relevance, argued that CSWR, LLC is not a party, and objected that DR 3069 is overly broad.

Discovery

The Commission's rules of procedure provide that discovery before the Commission may be obtained by the same means and under the same conditions as in civil actions in circuit court.⁴ Particular to the Commission, parties may use DRs as a means of discovery.⁵

Missouri Supreme Court Rule 56.01(b)(1), provides that parties may obtain discovery regarding any matter, not privileged, that is relevant to a pending action or reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Missouri's courts have indicated that there are two aspects to relevance - logical relevance and legal relevance.⁶ Logical relevance simply means that the questioned evidence tends to make the existence of a material fact more or less probable.⁷ In determining legal relevance, the court, or administrative agency, must weigh "the probative value of the evidence against the dangers to the opposing party of unfair prejudice, confusion of the issues, undue delay, waste of time, cumulativeness, or violations of confidentiality. Evidence is legally relevant if its probative value outweighs its prejudicial effect."⁸ Supreme Court Rule 56.01 also provides that the party seeking discovery has the burden of establishing relevance.

Relevance

OPC's Motion stated that CSWR, LLC drafts and submits quarterly memorandums to US Water for purposes of requesting funding (i.e. financing) to capitalize its investments in CSWR's current systems and in its acquisitions of new systems.⁹ OPC noted that cost of capital and capital structure are major drivers of Confluence's requested rate increase. Thus, OPC argues, CSWR's request for capital is directly relevant.

The Company's Response argued that the information presented by CSWR, LLC is not relevant as the Commission must decide just and reasonable rates, and any expectation of an individual investor has no import to the question of what rates the

Commission should order. The Response did not address cost of capital or capital structure.

CSWR, LLC is not a party

Confluence Rivers' Response argued that DR 3069 does not limit its request to presentations regarding Confluence Rivers, but included all presentations and memoranda created by CSWR, LLC, which Confluence Rivers argued is not regulated by the Commission. Confluence Rivers argued that the Commission has previously recognized that a holding company is a non-regulated entity, even when it owns an entity that is regulated. The Company asserted that CSWR, LLC is not a party and DRs are limited to parties. However, OPC's DR 3069 is not an inquiry to CSWR, LLC; rather, it is a request to Confluence Rivers.

OPC's Motion argued that the Commission previously stated that CSWR, Inc. appears to meet the definition of a water and sewer corporation. OPC's Motion connected CSWR, Inc. to CSWR, LLC because CSWR, LLC has employees and CSWR, Inc. does not.

Overly Broad

The Response argued that DR 3069 is overly broad, as it is not limited to Investment Memoranda associated with Confluence Rivers or potential Missouri acquisitions. Thus, it necessarily requests information for separate corporate entities operating in states other than Missouri and for transactions having nothing to do with Missouri. The Response also argued that DR 3069 is overly broad as it requests four and a half years of information, which necessarily involves dated information that is not relevant to a rate determination in this case.

Decision

The Commission is expressly required by Section 393.140(12), RSMo, to examine the dealings of regulated entities with their unregulated counterparts to review if operations are kept substantially separate and apart. Further, costs incurred at the CSWR level may be allocated to the individual utility operating companies such as Confluence Rivers. Therefore, it is necessary to verify the legitimacy of the expenses and costs, including capital, which Confluence seeks to recover from ratepayers. Ultimately, in a general rate case the Commission inquires as to, and prescribes the apportionment of, capitalization, earnings, debts and expenses where necessary. Additionally, Section 393.270.4, RSMo, allows the Commission to inquire into any factor it deems relevant when determining a proper rate.

The President of Confluence Rivers, Josiah Cox, is also the President of CSWR, LLC and the President of CSWR, Inc. – each of which is an affiliate of Confluence Rivers.¹⁰ Mr. Cox names CSWR, LLC as the managing affiliate for Confluence Rivers, and indicates that CSWR, LLC's corporate communications department is involved in boil advisory notifications for Confluence Rivers.¹¹ Confluence Rivers witness Todd Thomas described CSWR, LLC as a holding company that operated utility companies.¹² Mr. Thomas also described CSWR, LLC's role as having operational/managerial

oversight over Confluence Rivers.¹³ The above facts indicate a greater involvement in utility operations and management by CSWR, LLC than that of a typical holding company.

The Commission finds that the requested information is relevant as it involves funding requests for CSWR, LLC's current systems – which includes Confluence Rivers. As to Confluence Rivers' argument that CSWR, LLC is simply a holding company, the Commission distinguishes its prior decisions as those cases did not involve questions that the holding company and its individual officers were working for both or were managing or operating the regulated utility or providing regular financing to the regulated utility. This finding of relevance is consistent with the statutory requirements of Section 393.140(12) to examine the dealings of regulated entities with their unregulated counterparts to review if operations are kept substantially separate and apart, and to inquire as to, and prescribe the apportionment of, capitalization, earnings, debts and expenses fairly and justly to be awarded to or borne by the regulated utility.

The Commission finds that, in this case, the time period of four and half years for requested documents is not overly broad. However, the Commission agrees with Confluence Rivers that DR 3069 is overly broad in that it necessarily requests information for separate corporate entities operating in states other than Missouri and for transactions having nothing to do with Missouri. Therefore, the Commission will limit Confluence Rivers' required answer to Investment Memoranda associated in total or in any part with Confluence Rivers or potential Missouri acquisitions.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. OPC's Motion to Compel is granted in part. Confluence Rivers shall respond to and provide a full and complete response to OPC's DR 3069, limited to those Investment Memoranda or portions thereof that are associated in total or in any part with Confluence Rivers or potential Missouri acquisitions.

2. This order shall be effective immediately upon issuance.
