Now Duke Energy would like to change the agreement that was part of my decision to go with solar. Based on what I can tell from the proposal, it could drastically change my costs with a higher monthly charge for access to the grid and less payback for the energy that I send to Duke. The plan changes are very complicated and need your counsel to make them a viable system for consumers.
