NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the
North Carolina Utilities Commission has
scheduled a public hearing to be held
online via Webex on Monday, November 16, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. The purpose
of the hearing is to receive public witness testimony regarding the application of Bethel NC 11 Solar, LLC, for a
certificate of public convenience and
necessity (CPCN) to construct a 150MWAC solar photovoltaic (PV) electric
generating facility to be located in Pitt
County, North Carolina, and to be operated as a merchant generating facility.
A link to view the hearing will be available at www.ncuc.net. Members of the
public that would like to testify must
register in advance of the hearing, no
later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 9, 2020, by contacting the Public Staff by calling 866-380-9816.

In support of its application, the Applicant filed the direct testimony of Linda Nwadike, as well as several exhibits. In summary, construction of the 150-MW solar PV facility is anticipated to begin on or about the second quarter of 2022, with the expected commercial operation date being as early as the fourth quarter of 2022. The location of the proposed facility is east of NC Highway 11 South and north of NC Highway 30 in the Town of Bethel, Pitt County, North Carolina. The facility will interconnect with the electric transmission system owned by Virginia Electric and Power Company, dPo/a Dominion Energy North Carolina (DENC), affording it access to the PJM regional transmission organization, and the Applicant is negotiating a long-term power purchase agreement with a load-serving entity. The expected service life of the facility is 50 years.

On August 19, 2020, the Public Staff filed a Notice of Completeness stating that the Public Staff has reviewed the application as required by Commission Rule R8-63(d) and that the Public Staff considers the application to be com-

plete. Additional information about the application is available for review by the public on the Commission's website and online docket system at www.ncuc.net. The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any information that the writers wish

to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of

the matter. Such statements should be addressed to Mr. Christopher J. Ayers, Executive Director, Public Staff, 4326 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4326.

The Attorney General is also authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Statements to the Attorney General should be addressed to The Honorable Josh Stein, Attorney General, 9001 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina, 27699-9001. Written statements may be emailed to utility AGO@ncdoJ.gov. Written statements will be considered by the Commission in reaching its decision but do not receive the same consideration as testimony provided by public witnesses at a hearing.

Any person desiring to intervene in the proceeding as a formal party of record should file a petition under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-5 and R1-19 on or before Thursday, October 29, 2020. Such petitions should be filed with the Chief Clerk of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4325. The direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses to be presented by intervenors should also be filed with the Commission on or before Thursday, October 29, 2020.

The Commission may cancel the public witness hearing if no substantial written complaints regarding the proposed facility are received by the Commission's Chief Clerk on or before Friday, November 13, 2020.
