BY THE CHAIRMAN: On June 15, 2017, Fresh Air II, LLC, filed a verified Complaint regarding two interconnection requests described as Complainant Younts PV1 and Complainant Round Hill PV1 (collectively, the Complainants) in the above-captioned docket against Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC).

On June 20, 2017, the Commission issued an Order serving the Complaint on DEC and directing DEC to either satisfy the demands of the Complainants and so advise the Commission, or file a response to the Complaints on or before July 20, 2017.

On July 18, 2017, DEC filed a motion for extension of time, requesting that the Commission allow DEC one additional week to satisfy the demands of the Complainants or to respond to the Complainants. In support of its motion, DEC states that the Complaint is complex in nature and requires significant time to review and analyze, and that DEC has worked diligently toward preparing its answer; however the press of other business has delayed completion of the filing. In addition, DEC states that the additional time will allow counsel for DEC to engage in discussions with counsel for the Complainants on the matters set forth in the Complaint. Finally, DEC states that counsel for the Complaints has authorized DEC to state that Complainants do not oppose the requested extension.


The Chairman finds good cause to grant DEC's motion for extension of time and to set July 27, 2017, as the deadline for DEC to either satisfy the demands of the Complainants and so advise the Commission, or file a response to the Complaint.
