PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Good Let's come back to order and go on the afternoon. record. We are still in the case of W-1300, Sub 60. And we have witnesses already sworn in and on the stand, if they would return to the stand.

MS. HEDRICK: Commissioner, before we get started, I have a few preliminaries I'd like to address with the Commission, if that's all right.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Okay. And before you do that, realize right now we're in open session.

MS. HEDRICK: I don't think there's anything in the preliminaries that needs to be in closed session.

The first thing we wanted to let the Commission know was that we had reached out to the Public Staff last week to see if we could potentially reach a resolution on some of the issues that are before the Commission.

Legal counsel for the parties had a productive discussion both Thursday and Friday, and I believe we have a meeting scheduled with both of our respective clients next Wednesday.

MR. STYERS: Tentatively, uh-huh.

MS. HEDRICK: And we're hopeful that, after that, we will be able to present a joint stipulation for the Commission to consider that may help resolve a lot of the issues that are before you. So we don't --

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: You just said "a lot". You're not saying "all".

MS. HEDRICK: I think it will resolve most of everything, other than what I'm going to address shortly.

So the second thing is that we have filed a motion this afternoon. It was just filed. I think you may not have seen it yet.

But this was filed in an overabundance of caution since there has already been an inadvertent disclosure of confidential information in this case to a third party.

And since a letter has been sent to the Public Staff asserting certain rights as it relates to that confidential information, we've asked the Commission -- a little unusual -- to enter an Order that Mr. McDonald, as the controlling owner of Old North State, has the right to set who is listed on

the service docket.

And that motion's before you. I'm happy to answer any questions you might have about that, but otherwise, we just want to thank you in advance for your consideration of that motion.

And then, finally, as part of our discussions with the Public Staff, the Public Staff recommended and we agree that the Motion to Transfer the Pipeline that was filed the week before last should be refiled in its own docket. So unless there's any objection from the Commission, we plan do that as soon as possible.

And knowing that the Commission has questions about that pipeline, we have prepared and are willing -- I think you have a copy already of a confidential comprehensive timeline of the events surrounding that pipeline.

We will -- we plan to attach that as a confidential exhibit to the refiled motion when we file it in its own docket.

Mr. McDonald's, obviously, here today and can answer any questions that you have about that exhibit, but we do plan to address that more comprehensively in a separate docket once we've had

a chance to work with the Public Staff to address some of the value considerations that were raised last week.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: And do you plan to move that in this docket as well?

MR. STYERS: Uh-huh.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Okay. And I got a nod, a positive nod.

MS. HEDRICK: Yes.

MR. STYERS: Yes. Yes. Yes.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: And --

MR. STYERS: I assume that may need to be done on redirect or however, or even as an exhibit in response to a Commission question.

We'll leave that up to the Chair to determine that.

But that is -- that is -- was requested by the Commission. It's a lengthy document, but we wanted to be as thorough as possible in its content to help explain how we got from Point A to Point B both from a regulatory, a financing, and from an operational perspective.

So -- but realizing that it doesn't -- that there is still legal issues pertaining to that, and it pertains more -- I mean less to the

rate case in the past than it is going forward to a sewer rate case, because it is, in fact, a sewer pipeline, the Public Staff recommended, and we agreed with the Public Staff, that that should be dealt in a separate docket.

And so that's -- just didn't have time to get that filed before today but wanted to let you know.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: And is your intentions that the pipeline motion, as it's been filed --

Well, we filed an MR. STYERS: No. application to transfer it in this docket last week.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Uh-huh. And that filing will remain in this docket, correct? MR. STYERS: It certainly may. work with the Clerk's office, and the Commission has said no objection.

It was certainly filed to -- quite frankly, as we discussed, to show how the \$5 million note payable would actually be repaid.

But yes, it can be left in this docket. And we'll work with the Commission's instructions

and the Clerk's instructions how they would like for us to file a parallel application to be considered in discovery and by the Commission in another docket.

COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Okay. Very good.

And, Ms. Hedrick, you mentioned the recent motion filed, and I have not reviewed it or seen it. But I take it it is tantamount to having counsel help set -- help review what the service list should be.

MS. HEDRICK: My understanding is that the former partner of the business is still listed on the service list. There have been requests by the client to have him removed, and that has not happened. And so we filed this Motion hoping that maybe we could get that accomplished.

We have worked with the Public Staff. Very graciously, they have -- we've worked out how things will be served going forward if that doesn't get fixed immediately, but -- so we don't think that any confidential information will be disclosed to him going forward. But that is the impetus behind the Motion.
