NOW COMES NC WARN, through the undersigned attorney, with a correction to paragraph 45 on page 27 of its comments on the utilities' 2014 integrated resource plans ("IRPs") and a request for an evidentiary hearing filed in this docket on February 20, 2015. The paragraph should read as follows:

Distributed solar energy

45. The second main component for a responsible energy future is for a renewable energy build-up to account for 7% of total electricity sales over the planning horizon, including both retail and wholesale sales in North Carolina, and 18% of total capacity. Solar photovoltaic ("PV") systems are a tremendous resource that can provide reliable electricity when we need it, with costs continuing to fall steadily. North Carolina currently has 722 MW of installed solar capacity, the fourth largest in the United States. In North Carolina, there are approximately 331 solar companies that employ 3,100 people, with an economic impact of \$787 million in 2013 *alone*. ⁴⁷
