

WASTEWATER RATE DESIGN

On July 10, 2023, Aqua filed a Motion on Wastewater Rate Design requesting that the Commission reject the Public Staff's rate schedule for Sewer Utility Service Schedules of Rates for all Aqua NC systems filed on July 3, 2023, and issue an order approving Aqua's revised wastewater schedule of rates for Rate Years 1 through 3. In support of its Motion, Aqua argues that the Public Staff's calculated rate design in the July 3, 2023 filing produces a 30/70 fixed/variable ratio for metered sewer customers, which is in direct conflict with the 60/40 fixed/variable rate design agreed to by the parties in the Stipulation and approved in the Rate Order. According to Aqua, the Public Staff's calculated rate design for its Aqua Uniform Sewer rate division (ANC Sewer) produces a fixed/variable revenue ratio of 60/40 for the total revenue requirement of ANC Sewer, which includes not only metered but also unmetered (flat rate) customers, resulting in a 30/70 fixed/variable rate design for metered sewer service. Using the Public Staff's rate design calculations, Aqua provides the following example calculation of a residential volumetric sewer customer with average monthly usage of 5,000 gallons of water, demonstrating the resulting 30/70 fixed/variable rate design for metered sewer service:

Base Facility Charge (fixed) <1" meter	\$28.60
Usage (variable)	<u>\$67.25</u>
Total Bill	\$95.85
Fixed % (\$28.60/\$95.85)	29.8%
Variable % (\$67.25/\$95.85)	70.2%

Further, Aqua maintains that the Public Staff's calculation in the present proceeding is inconsistent with the previously authorized 80/20 fixed/variable calculation used to determine the ANC Sewer monthly metered service rates per the Commission's final order in its last general rate case proceeding, Docket No. W-218, Sub 526 (Sub 526 Proceeding), for the exact same affected customer class. Aqua states that applying the volumetric sewer rates approved in the Sub 526 Proceeding to a residential volumetric sewer customer with average monthly usage of 5,000 gallons will result in an 80/20 fixed/variable rate design for metered sewer service as shown below:

Base Facility Charge (fixed) <1" meter	\$60.43
Usage (variable)	<u>\$14.95</u>
Total Bill	\$75.38
Fixed % (\$60.43/\$75.38)	80.2%
Variable % (\$14.95/\$75.38)	19.8%

Aqua states that it erroneously initially agreed with the Public Staff's rate design but upon further review realized that the revenue from the unmetered customers was included for the target ratio in the rate design calculation, which resulted in a flawed fixed/variable rate design. Aqua states that its corrections are limited to the Sewer Utility

Service Schedules of Rates for all Aqua NC systems found in Appendix A-1, page 4 of 9 and page 5 of 9 of the Public Staff's July 3, 2023 filing.

On July 12, 2023, the Public Staff filed a Response to Aqua's Motion on Wastewater Rate Design. In its Response, the Public Staff states that during the evidentiary hearing in this matter, Public Staff witness Darden testified that the Public Staff's recommended rate design for ANC sewer was based on total fixed revenue as compared to total variable revenue (or service revenues), whereas Aqua's proposed rate design was based on the average metered residential sewer customer bill. Tr. vol. 7, 61-62. The Public Staff asserts that the Schedules of Rates filed on July 3, 2023, are based on the Public Staff's recommended 60/40 fixed/variable ratio and the methodology described by witness Darden during the evidentiary hearing. The Public Staff contends that its recommended rate design better achieves the 60/40 ratio agreed to by the parties and ordered by the Commission. The Public Staff further states that its rate design also gives customers greater control over their total bill, thereby promoting efficiency and conservation while also maintaining revenue stability for Aqua.

On July 13, 2023, Aqua filed a Reply to the Public Staff's Response. In its Reply, Aqua states that in settlement the parties agreed to a 60/40 fixed (base rate) to variable (volumetric rate) ratio for metered customers. Aqua points to part III.A. of the Stipulation, which states: "The Stipulating Parties further agree that rate design in this case should be based on a 60/40 ratio of fixed/volumetric (or base/usage) revenues **for metered sewer service rates.**" Stipulation at 18 (emphasis added). Aqua states that the Public Staff's response relies on testimony by witness Darden that was based on the Public Staff's pre-settlement position. According to Aqua, the Public Staff did not file any settlement testimony addressing the 60/40 rate design, and it is inappropriate for the Public Staff to rely on witness Darden's pre-settlement litigation position when the testimony conflicts with the Public Staff's settlement agreement. Aqua notes that the Public Staff's Response at paragraph 4 states that the Stipulation provides for a 60/40 ratio of fixed volumetric revenues. Aqua argues that there is a critical omission in the Public Staff's statement because the Stipulation provides for a 60/40 ratio of fixed volumetric revenues "for metered sewer service rates."

DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSIONS

After the evidentiary hearing in this matter concluded, the parties filed a Partial Settlement Agreement and Stipulation on March 31, 2023. Section III.A. of the Stipulation provides:

- A. Fixed/Volumetric Rate Design. The Stipulating Parties agree that rate design in this case should be based on a 35/65 ratio of fixed/volumetric (or base/usage) revenues for water service rates. The Stipulating Parties further agree that rate design in this case should be based on a 60/40 ratio of fixed/volumetric (or base/usage) revenues for metered sewer rates. Unmetered residential sewer rates should remain flat.

Stipulation at 18. In accord with this agreement made between the parties, in the Rate Order the Commission found in Finding of Fact No. 26:

26. It is reasonable and appropriate that Aqua's rate design for water utility service provided to its residential customers should be based on the following fixed/variable ratios which were agreed upon in the Stipulation: 35%/65% for the Aqua Uniform Water Rate Division; 35%/65% for the Brookwood Water Rate Division; and 35%/65% for the Fairways Water Rate Division; and 60%/40% for the Aqua Uniform Sewer Rate Division and 60%/40% for the Fairways Sewer Rate Division. It is reasonable and appropriate that unmetered residential sewer rates remain flat.

Rate Order at 14.

The Commission concludes that the language regarding the fixed to variable ratio rate design in the Stipulation, which was approved in its entirety by the Commission and incorporated into the Rate Order, requires that the rate design for metered sewer customers be set to achieve a 60/40 fixed/variable ratio thus, the revenue from unmetered customers should not be included for the target ratio in the ANC Sewer rate design calculation. The Commission finds that the example calculation provided by Aqua, in Item 7 of its July 10, 2023 Motion, for a residential volumetric sewer customer with average monthly usage of 5,000 gallons of water demonstrates the resulting 30/70 fixed/variable rate design for metered sewer service resulting from the Public Staff's calculations. Therefore, the Commission is persuaded by Aqua's argument that the rate design filed by the Public Staff on July 3, 2023, results in a 30/70 ratio for metered sewer customers by calculating a 60/40 ratio for all sewer customers, including unmetered (flat rate) customers, rather than a 60/40 ratio for metered sewer customers. Accordingly, the Schedules of Rates and Connection Fees and Notice to Customers, attached to this Order, accepts Aqua's corrections filed on July 10, 2023, to the Sewer Utility Service Schedules of Rates for all Aqua NC systems found in Appendix A-1, page 4 of 9 and page 5 of 9 of the Public Staff's July 3, 2023 filing. Further, the Commission has revised the customer notices for each rate year filed by the Public Staff on July 3, 2023, with respect to ANC Sewer to reflect the Commission's decision approving Aqua's corrections.

Finally, with respect to any stipulations presented to the Commission for approval by Aqua and the Public Staff in future proceedings, the Commission instructs the parties to come to full agreement on all aspects of the stipulated issues, including the revenue requirement and rate impacts, and to clearly reduce all components and details to writing in the stipulation to the extent necessary to convey the parties' agreements prior to submittal to the Commission for approval.

Based upon the foregoing and the entire record, the Commission finds that good cause exists to accept the revenue requirements filed jointly by Aqua and the Public Staff on June 26, 2023, and to approve the Schedules of Rates and Connection Fees and Notices to Customers attached to this Order.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That the revenue requirement filed jointly by Aqua and the Public Staff on June 26, 2023, reflecting the decisions in the Rate Order and the Order on Reconsideration are hereby accepted;

2. That the Commission shall issue by further order of the Commission the customary schedules which summarize the gross revenue and overall rate of return that Aqua NC should have the reasonable opportunity to achieve in WSIP Rate Years 1, 2, and 3, based on the final revenue requirements approved by the Commission;

3. That the WSIP Rate Year 1 Schedules of Rates, attached hereto as Appendices A-1 and A-2, are hereby approved and deemed to be filed with the Commission pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-138, and are hereby authorized to become effective for service rendered on and after June 5, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

4. That the Schedules of Connection Fees for Uniform Water and Uniform Sewer, attached hereto as Appendix A-3, and the Schedule of Water and Sewer Improvement Charges, attached hereto as Appendix A-4, are hereby approved and deemed to be filed with the Commission pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-138, and are hereby authorized to become effective for service rendered on and after the issuance date of the Rate Order and shall remain in effect until further order of the Commission;

5. That the Notices to Customers, attached hereto as Appendix B-1 (RY1), Appendix B-2 (RY1), and Appendix B-3 (RY1) shall be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered to all affected customers in each relevant service area, respectively, in conjunction with the next regularly scheduled billing process;

6. That the WSIP Rate Year 2 Schedules of Rates, attached hereto as C-1 and C-2, are hereby approved and deemed to be filed with the Commission pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-138, and are hereby authorized to become effective for service rendered on and after January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024;

7. That the WSIP Rate Year 3 Schedules of Rates, attached hereto as D-1 and D-2, are hereby approved and deemed to be filed with the Commission pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-138, and are hereby authorized to become effective for service rendered on and after January 1, 2025, and shall remain in effect until new rates are authorized by further order of the Commission;

8. That at least 30 days prior to implementation of rates effective for Rate Years 2 and 3, Aqua shall provide notice to customers of the rates to be implemented as of those respective effective dates. The Notices to Customers for Rate Year 2 are attached hereto as Appendix E-1 (RY2), Appendix E-2 (RY2), Appendix E-3 (RY2). The Notices to Customers for Rate Year 3 are attached hereto as Appendix F-1 (RY3), Appendix F-2 (RY3), Appendix F-3 (RY3).


9. That prior to providing notice to customers in Rate Years 2 and 3 that Aqua and the Public Staff shall jointly file revised notices for approval by the Commission if necessary to reflect any adjustments to bulk purchased water and sewer rates approved by the Commission pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-133.11 during the WSIP period; and

10. That Aqua shall file the attached Certificate of Service, properly signed and notarized, not later than ten days after the Notices to Customers are mailed or hand delivered to customers.

All nondomestic and industrial waste is subject to Aqua NC's Sewer Use Rule. The Sewer Use Rule can be accessed at [anc-sewer-use-rule-june2023.pdf](#) ([aquawater.com](#)) and is also available from Aqua NC upon request. The Sewer Use Rule requires utility customers to provide advance notice of any nondomestic or industrial waste discharge into the Utility's sanitary sewer systems and to meet certain effluent limitations and pretreatment requirements. Violation of the Sewer Use Rule may result in disconnection. Reconnection will require reimbursement of the Utility's actual costs incurred as a result of the violation. Repeat violations may result in permanent disconnection.

As part of the Sewer Use Rule, the Utility may require installation and/or proper operation of grease traps on grease producing commercial facilities. Failure to properly operate grease traps will result in disconnection of service pursuant to Commission Rule R10-16.

Notes:

- 1/ The Utility, at its expense, may install a meter and charge the metered rate.
- 2/ In most areas, connection charges do not apply pursuant to contract and only the \$70.00 meter installation fee will be charged to the first person requesting service (generally the builder). Where Aqua NC must make a tap to an existing main, the charge will be \$800.00, and where main extension is required, the charge will be 120% of the actual cost.
- 3/ Individual connections outside franchised service areas may be made pursuant to this tariff in the following circumstances: (1) upon request of a bona fide customer as that term is defined in Commission Rule R7-16(a)(1); (2) the customer shall be located either within 100 ft. of a Franchised Service Area or located within 100 ft. of an existing Aqua NC main; and (3) the request may come from no more than two customers located in the same area (requests for more than two connections require an application for a new franchise or a request for approval of a contiguous extension). To connect such a customer, Aqua NC shall file a notice with the Commission in Docket No. W-218, Sub 177, at least 30 days before it intends to make the tap. This notice shall include an explanation of the circumstances requiring the tap and an 8.5" x 11" map showing the location of the tap in relation to Aqua NC's existing main. If the Public Staff does not object to the tap within the 30-day period, or upon written notice within that period from the Public Staff that it will not object, Aqua NC may proceed with the connection.
- 4/ Actual cost for such a connection shall include installation of a 6" or smaller main extension (if necessary), tap of the main, service line, road bore (if necessary), meter box, meter, backflow preventer (if necessary), and Aqua NC's direct labor costs. Aqua NC shall give a written cost quote to the customer(s) applying for connection before beginning the installation work.
- 5/ When service is disconnected and reconnected by the same unit owner within a period of less than nine months, the entire flat rate and/or base charge rate will be due and payable before the service will be reconnected.

If sewer disconnection is required, after all reasonable efforts have been made by the Utility to encourage the customer to comply with the provisions of the tariff, the Utility may install a valve or other device appropriate to cut off or block the customer sewer line.

Prior to disconnection, the Utility shall give the customer written notice at least seven days prior to disconnection. Said notice shall include, at the minimum, a copy of this reconnect provision, the estimated cost to make the cut off, and install the valve or other device.

In the event that an emergency or dangerous condition is found or fraudulent use is detected, sewer service may be cut off without notice. In such an event, notice as described above will be given as soon as possible.

Upon payment of outstanding balance, actual cost of termination and reconnection and other fees (for example, deposit if required by the Utility), the Utility shall restore the service no later than the next business day.

^{6/} Aqua NC is authorized to include on its monthly water bill the charges resulting from sewer service provided by the Town of Cary, the Town of Fuquay-Varina, Wake County, and various Commission appointed emergency operators where specifically approved by the Commission. Aqua NC will bill the Town of Cary, the Town of Fuquay-Varina, Wake County, or the appointed emergency operator \$2.00 per month per bill for providing this service.




