BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On October 5, 2009, Nucor Steel-Hertford (Nucor) filed a petition to intervene in the above-captioned docket. Nucor states that it owns and operates a steel recycling facility located in Hertford County, North Carolina, which produces steel plate, and that it is a customer of Dominion North Carolina Power (DNCP). As a customer of DNCP, Nucor states that it has an interest that is directly affected by the outcome of this proceeding.

On October 13, 2009, the Public Works Commission of the City of Fayetteville (FPWC) filed a petition to intervene in the above-captioned docket. FPWC states that it is directly affected by the adequacy of the capacity, reserve margins, and system planning of Progress Energy Carolinas, Inc. (PEC), as well as other utilities that purchase and sell power in wholesale markets in North Carolina.

The Presiding Commissioner is of the opinion that good cause exists to allow the interventions by Nucor and FPWC.
