BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On December 31, 2019, Aqua North Carolina, Inc. (Aqua or Company), filed an application with the Commission seeking authority to adjust and increase its rates for providing water and sewer utility service in all of its service areas in North Carolina effective January 30, 2020. On January 21, 2020, the Commission issued an Order Establishing General Rate Case and Suspending Rates declaring this proceeding to be a general rate case and suspending the proposed new rates for up to 270 days pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-134.

On February 14, 2020, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearings, Establishing Discovery Guidelines, and Requiring Customer Notice for, among other things, public hearings to be held in six locations across the State for the purpose of receiving public witness testimony from Aqua's customers.

On March 31, 2020, the Commission issued an order postponing the scheduled public witness hearings, pursuant to Governor Roy Cooper's Executive Order No. 116, and successive Executive Orders relating to North Carolina's State of Emergency and the State's coordinated response and protective actions, including the statewide "stay at home" order issued on March 27, 2020, and extended in part on June 24, 2020, to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic.

On June 23, 2020, the expert witness hearing began in accordance with the Commission's initial scheduling order, but in order to best comply with North Carolina's current pandemic protections, was recessed until July 6, 2020, at 1:30 p.m., when the expert witness hearing will resume using WebEx, a conferencing service which enables hearings to be conducted and attended by remote means.

Based on the foregoing, the Presiding Commissioner finds good cause to reschedule the public hearings to be held in two separate sessions on August 3, 2020, solely for the purpose of receiving the testimony of public witnesses in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g). Conducting the hearing by virtual means will permit customers from all Aqua service territories across North Carolina to participate without

regard to geographical limitations. The Commission reserves the right to limit testimony at the public witness hearings pursuant to Commission Rule R1-21(g)(5).

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That the public witness hearing is on Aqua's applications are scheduled to be held by virtual means on August 3, 2020;
- 2 That the first session for public witness testimony will begin at 1:30 p.m. and end at the conclusion of the last witness' testimony or at 4:30 p.m., whichever is earlier; and the second session will begin at 6:30 p.m. and end at the conclusion of the last witness' testimony or 10:30 p.m., whichever is earlier;
- 3. That the public hearing sessions are held solely for the purpose of receiving the testimony of public witnesses in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g). The Commission reserves the right to limit testimony at the public witness hearing pursuant to Commission Rule R1-21(g)(5);
- 4. That Aqua is required to file verified reports addressing all customer service and/or service quality complaints expressed during each public witness hearing held on August 3, 2020, within 20 days of the conclusion of the public witness hearing. The Public Staff shall and other intervenors may file a verified response and any comments to Aqua's reports on or before September 4, 2020;
- 5. That the Notice to Customers, attached as Appendix A, shall be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered by Aqua to all affected customers no later than July 10, 2020, and Aqua shall submit to the Commission the attached Certificate of Service properly signed and notarized no later than 20 days after the date of this Order; and
- 6. That Aqua shall also provide notice of public hearing to its customers by prominently posting a copy of this Order and attached Notice to Customers on its website.

Notice is hereby given that Aqua North Carolina, Inc. (Applicant), 202 MacKenan Court, Cary, North Carolina 27511, has filed an application with the North Carolina Utilities Commission for authority to increase rates for providing water or sewer utility service in all its service areas in North Carolina. On February 14, 2020, the Commission issued an order that, among other things, scheduled public hearings in six separate geographical locations for the purpose of receiving public witness testimony from Aqua's customers across North Carolina and required the Company to send customers a notice listing the present and proposed rates. In response to the declared State of Emergency and consistent with the Governor's executive orders, the public hearings were postponed by Commission order issued on March 31, 2020, to assist in preventing the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). The Presiding Commissioner now finds good cause to reschedule the public witness hearings, and in the interest of protecting the public, promoting good public health, and lessening the spread of the coronavirus, the public witness hearing will be held remotely via WebEx with telephonic access available in two sessions.

During each public hearing session on August 3, 2020, the public witnesses will be allowed to testify in the order in which they are registered.

Only individuals registered with the Public Staff by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 30, 2020, will be allowed to testify at the hearing sessions.
