BY THE COMMISSION: On March 8, 2019, the Commission issued a Scheduling Order in the above-captioned docket that, among other things, scheduled the hearing in this matter for Tuesday, June 4, 2019, set dates for interventions and the filing of testimony, and required Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC) to publish notice of the proceeding. Due to a scheduling conflict, the Commission finds good cause to reschedule the hearing for Tuesday, June 11, 2019, to reset the dates for intervention and filing of testimony, and to revise the public notice to be published by DEC.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:


1. That a public hearing shall be, and is hereby, scheduled for Tuesday, June 11, 2019, at 9:30 a.m., in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, for the purpose of considering the annual fuel charge adjustment proceeding for DEC;
2. That any person having an interest in this proceeding may file a petition to intervene stating such interest on or before Monday, May 20, 2019;
3. That the direct testimony and exhibits of the Public Staff and other intervenors shall be filed on or before Monday, May 20, 2019;
4. That DEC may file rebuttal testimony and exhibits no later than Thursday, May 30, 2019;
5. That DEC shall publish the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in a newspaper or newspapers having general circulation in its service area once a week for two successive weeks beginning at least 45 days prior to the hearing;
6. That DEC shall file affidavits of publication on or before the date of the hearing; and

7. That the parties shall comply with the discovery guidelines established in the Commission's previous Scheduling Order.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing on an annual fuel and fuel-related charge adjustment proceeding for Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC). The public hearing has been scheduled to begin Tuesday, June 11, 2019, at 9:30 a.m., in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. The proceeding is being held pursuant to the provisions of N.C.G.S. § 62-133.2 and Commission Rule R8-55 for the purpose of determining whether an increment or decrement rider is required in order to reflect changes in fuel and fuel-related costs over or under the base fuel rate established for DEC in its last general rate case. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

DEC filed an application and testimony relative to the subject matter of the proceeding on February 26, 2019. By its application, DEC requests Commission approval for an increase in DEC's fuel and fuel-related costs currently in effect, with the changes being effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2019. DEC's request, excluding the regulatory fee, would result in increases of 0.1068 cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for residential customers, 0.0779 cents per kWh for commercial customers, and 0.0556 cents per kWh for industrial customers. If approved, the net effect of DEC's request would be to increase the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,000 kWh of electricity by \$1.07.

Specific information about DEC's application may be obtained from the Office of the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, Raleigh, North Carolina, where a copy of DEC's application is available for review by the public, and on the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net.

The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Correspondence concerning the fuel adjustment proceeding and the hearing scheduled thereon should be directed to the Public Staff. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any information which the writers wish to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of the matter. Such statements should be addressed

The Attorney General is also authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. 
Written statements are not evidence unless the writers appear at a public hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their written statements.

Persons desiring to intervene as formal parties should file a petition under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-5 and R1-19 on or before Monday, May 20, 2019. Such petitions should be filed with the Chief Clerk of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300. The direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses to be presented by intervenors should also be filed with the Commission on or before Monday, May 20, 2019.
