NOW COMES New River Light & Power Company ("NRLP"), through its attorney, and submits the following Report:

- 1. Pursuant to paragraph 38 of Stipulation dated as of January 19th, 2018, entered into between NRLP and the Public Staff, and Finding of Fact No. 41 of the Order issued by the North Carolina Utilities Commission (the "Commission") on March 29, 2018, filed and entered in the captioned Docket, NRLP is required to work to (i) develop rate schedules and energy efficiency and demand side management programs that take advantage of the detailed usage data and other capabilities of its AMI metering system, recognizing that NRLP may not implement energy efficiency or demand side management programs so long as it is a party to the Electric Service Agreement with Blue Ridge Electric Membership Corporation ("BREMCO"), and (ii) report its progress to the Public Staff within 180 days of the Order.
- 2. In accordance with the foregoing, NRLP reports the following:

Representatives of NRLP have discussed with members of the Public Staff and, with the input of the Public Staff, are in the process of developing a pilot, residential, prepaid metering program that utilizes the capabilities of its AMI system. NRLP remains, however, a party to the Electric Service Agreement with BREMCO and, therefor, continues to be constrained in its ability to develop energy efficiency and demand side management programs.
