BY THE CHAIRMAN: On January 24, 2018, Charlotte A. Mitchell filed a Motion to Withdraw as Counsel in the above-captioned dockets, pursuant to Commission Rule R1-7 and Rule 1.16(b) of the North Carolina Rules of Professional Conduct, requesting that the Commission enter an order allowing her to withdraw from serving as one of the attorneys of record on behalf of the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association (NCSEA) in the above-captioned dockets.

Ms. Mitchell states that she has been appointed and confirmed to serve a term on the North Carolina Utilities Commission, and that Peter H. Ledford will continue to serve as counsel of record on behalf of NCSEA in these dockets. Further, Ms. Mitchell states that she has provided notice of her withdrawal to NCSEA, and that she believes that her withdrawal can be accomplished without resulting in any material adverse effect on the interests of NCSEA.

After careful consideration, the Chairman finds that there is justifiable cause to grant the Motion.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Charlotte A. Mitchell is allowed to withdraw as counsel for NCSEA in the above-captioned dockets.
