2	CHAIR MITCHELL: Good morning. Let's come
3	to order and go on the record, please. I'm Charlotte
4	Mitchell, Chair of the Utilities Commission and with
5	me this morning are Commissioners Brown-Bland,
6	Clodfelter, Duffley, Hughes, and Kemerait.
7	In compliance with the State Government
8	Ethics Act, I remind members of the Commission of
9	our duty to avoid conflicts of interest, and inquire
10	as to whether any member of the Commission has a
11	known conflict with respect to matters coming before
12	us?
13	(No response)
14	The record will reflect that no conflicts
15	have been identified, so we will proceed with Public
16	Staff, Item Number 1.
16 17	Staff, Item Number 1. MR. METZ: Good morning. I'm Dustin Metz
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17 18 19 20 21 22	MR. METZ: Good morning. I'm Dustin Metz with the Public Staff's Energy Division. Item P1 is a proposed order for establishing a general rate case and suspending rates for Duke Energy Progress. I have one amendment to the proposed order. DEP filed a Performance Based Ratemaking

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proposed rates for up to 300 days. Accordingly, 1 2 Ordering Paragraph 2, the proposed order should read 3 that the proposed new rates are suspended for up to 4 300 days pursuant to or upon General Statute 62-133.16. 5 With that amendment, I recommend the 6 7 Commission approve the proposed order. COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval 8 9 of the recommendation as amended. 10 COMMISSIONER HUGHES: I'll second. 11 CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and 12 seconded that the item be approved as recommended by 13 the Public Staff. Questions or discussion on that motion? 14 15 (No response) Hearing none, all in favor, indicate with 16 17 an aye. 18 (All Commissioners say aye.) 19 CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed? 20 (No response) 21 That motion carries. 22 Thank you, Mr. Metz. 23 We'll proceed to Public Staff, Agenda Item 24 2.

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1 MR. THOMAS: Good morning, Commissioners. 2 My name is Jeff Thomas. Item 2 is a request by Duke 3 Energy Carolinas and Duke Energy Progress for approval of their Green Source Advantage Bridge 4 5 Program and associated tariffs GSA-B. The Public Staff recommends that the 6 7 Commission approve the request and issue the 8 proposed order. 9 CHAIR MITCHELL: Commissioner Kemerait. 10 MS. KEMERAIT: Mr. Thomas, I also see that 11 Ms. Fentress and Mr. Jirak are here from Duke, and I 12 think that my questions might be better answered by 13 either or both, Ms. Fentress or Mr. Jirak. 14 CHAIR MITCHELL: Or to the extent that 15 Duke has a witness that's available to respond, 16 please do come up. 17 Should I step down or stay? MR. THOMAS: 18 CHAIR MITCHELL: No. Stay up there, 19 Mr. Thomas. 20 MS. FENTRESS: Good morning, Chair 21 Mitchell and Commissioners. My name is Kendrick 22 Fentress. I'm appearing on behalf of Duke Energy 23 Carolinas and Duke Energy Progress in this matter, 24 and we do have two subject matter witnesses with us

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1 here today to respond to any questions. I believe Commissioner Kemerait indicated she had some. 2 I'm going to let them introduce themselves, if that's 3 all right, and I'll step out of the way. 4 5 CHAIR MITCHELL: Thank you, Ms. Fentress. MR. SNOOK: Chair Mitchell, Commissioners, 6 7 Leland Snook, Managing Director of Pricing Solutions 8 for Duke Energy. 9 MS. CUMMINGS: Chair Mitchell, Commissioners, Layla Cummings, Energy Policy North 10 11 Carolina with Duke Energy. 12 CHAIR MITCHELL: Good morning to both of 13 Commissioner Kemerait. vou. 14 MS. KEMERAIT: Thank y'all for being here. 15 I have a couple of questions to make sure that we 16 understand this GSA Bridge Program. And the first 17 is about how the 350 megawatts that would be 18 allocated to the GSA Bridge Program, how it relates 19 to the 2021 appropriations bill under Section 20 11.19(f1) and (f2). And my understanding is that 21 that 350 megawatts in the appropriations bill had 22 been reserved for an eligible customer that would be 23 owning and operating a manufacturing facility. And 24 so what relation does the 350 megawatts in this GSA

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Bridge Program have or not have to the reserved 1 2 capacity in the appropriations bill? MR. SNOOK: Chair Mitchell, Commissioner 3 4 Kemerait, there is no relation. This is additional 5 capacity. COMMISSIONER KEMERAIT: So the 6 7 350 megawatts would still remain reserved for the eligible facility, the manufacturing facility; is 8 9 that correct? 10 MR. SNOOK: Yes, that's correct. 11 COMMISSIONER KEMERAIT: And then on -we'd like to also better understand how the 12 13 250 megawatts of the GSA Bridge Program capacity 14 will be provided. And I think the Application talks 15 about that it would be 45 percent of third-party 16 owned renewable capacity from the Carbon Plan. Is 17 my understanding correct? And can you explain 18 basically where this 250 megawatts would be coming 19 from? 20 MR. SNOOK: Yes. Chair Mitchell, 21 Commissioner Kemerait, it would be provided by third 22 parties and it would count towards the 45 percent. 23 COMMISSIONER KEMERAIT: And how will it be 24 allocated? Is it going to be part of the 2022 solar

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1 procurement or some other solar procurement later --2 solar procurement program? MS. CUMMINGS: So this capacity would be 3 4 available once it's approved. It will be -- there's 5 a couple of different paths that this capacity can come from, but it will not be taken out of whatever 6 number, target volume, the solar procurement has set 7 So if you had, for instance, a PPA project that 8 up. 9 dropped out of the procurement right now in Step 1 10 or didn't make it to Step 2, or even beyond, if they 11 didn't win after Step 2, that person could go 12 contract with another customer and then could come 13 to the Company with a GSA Application. 14 COMMISSIONER KEMERAIT: So then, 15 Ms. Cummings, it would be outside of the 2022 solar 16 procurement; is that correct? 17 MS. CUMMINGS: That is correct. 18 CHAIR MITCHELL: Any additional questions? 19 (No response) I'll make a motion to move 20 MS. KEMERAIT: 21 this matter to executive conference. 22 COMMISSIONER DUFFLEY: Second. 23 CHAIR MITCHELL: Any objections to the 24 motion on the table?

12	Item 3 is a request by Piedmont Natural
13	Gas Company for approval of bi-annual adjustment of
14	rates under Appendix C of its Service Regulations.
15	Public Staff has reviewed the proposed
16	rate adjustments and recommends that the Commission
17	approve the proposed order allowing Piedmont to
18	adjust their rates as provided in Schedule A of the
19	Application.
20	COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval
21	of the recommendation.
22	COMMISSIONER HUGHES: Second.
23	CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and
24	seconded that the item be approved as recommended by
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1	the Public Staff. Are there any questions or
2	discussion on that motion?
3	(No response)
4	Hearing none, all in favor indicate with
5	an aye.
6	(All Commissioners say aye.)
7	CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed?
