I have a house in Warsaw which charges \$13.47 for 3000 gallons of treated water. How can Utilities want so much to pump water from the ground through lines that are at best just adequate to supply the houses if no one is using sprinklers. I have to treat my water due to the minerals. Glasses come out cloudy when washed. I drink water run through a reverse osmosis unit. The story is Utilities, Inc. let two employees go because the supervisor had an employee running tests on the wells that was not qualified. It is so bad that the Pander County Board of Commissioners have directly contacted the Utilities Commission.
