Hello NC Utilities Commission,

I am an interested citizen of NC and very concerned about Duke Energy's out-of-control policies with regard to the existential threat of climate change.

Duke is, unfortunately, a monopoly and, with your help, is able to get away with avoiding its responsibility to get on board with reducing and ultimately stopping the burning of fossil fuels.
