This UTILITY, EFFLUENT, AND FORCE MAIN EASEMENT AND IRRIGATION AGREEMENT (the "Effluent Easement") is made and entered into as of the ______ day of March, 2021, by Paasch Developments, LLC ("Golf Club"), and Currituck Water & Sewer, LLC, a North Carolina limited liability company ("Utility Company").

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC is the current owner of the wastewater system (defined below); and

WHEREAS, TATE TERRACE REALTY INVESTORS, INC., a Virginia corporation, and JERNIGAN ENTERPRISES, a North Carolina general partnership executed that certain Contract and Agreement, dated October 21, 1996, relating to the development of certain real property more particularly described therein located in Currituck County, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Jernigan assigned all of its right, title and interest in and to the Contract and the property to Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, TATE TERRACE REALTY INVESTORS, INC. conveyed those certain tracts of land being Tracts 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D and 1E as described in that plat entitled "Mill Run Exempt Subdivision" dated May 8, 1997 prepared by Bissell Professional Group and recorded in Plat Cabinet F, Slides 166, 167 and 168 of Currituck County, North Carolina, Public Registry, the same being a portion of that property acquired by Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc. by Deed recorded June 17, 1994 in Deed Book 342, Page 296, Currituck County Public Registry to Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc. pursuant to that certain Deed, dated June 20,1997 duly recorded in the Office of Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina; and

WHERAS, contemporaneous with the execution of the Deed, Tate Terrace Reality Investors, Inc. and Mill Run Golf and Country Club, LLC executed that certain Agreement regarding Restrictive Covenants, dated June 20, 1997, and recorded in Deed Book 407, Page 331; and

WHEREAS, contemporaneous with the execution of the Deed, Tate Terrace Reality Investors, Inc. and Mill Run Golf and Country Club, LLC executed that Contract Addendum and Agreement date June 20, 1997, and recorded in Deed Book 407, Page 338; and

WHEREAS, contemporaneous with the execution of the Deed, Mill Run Golf and Country Club, LLC executed that certain Performance Deed of Trust, dated June 20, 1997, and recorded in Deed Book 407, Page 361, in favor of Tate Terrace Reality Investors, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc., with the consent of Mill Run Golf and County Club, LLC, assigned all of the right, title, interest and obligation to and under the Agreement, the Contract, the Contract Addendum and the Deed of Trust to Sandler at Mill Run, LLC., as evidenced and recorded in Deed Book 422, Page 297 in Currituck County Public Registry; and

WHEREAS, Sandler at Mill Run, LLC conveyed to Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC., via the March 1999 Agreement, among other property, the all rights possessed by Sandler at Mill Run, LLC under the Contract [dated October 21, 1996], Contract Addendum [dated June 20,1997], and recorded at the Office of Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina in Deed Book 407, Page 338

WHEREAS, Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC and Utility Company have entered into the Acquisition Agreement (defined below) whereby Utility Company will acquire certain Wastewater facilities to serve Eagle Creek (defined below) and the surrounding area, and own and operate the facilities as a utility company regulated by the Commission (defined below) and DEQ (defined below) for wastewater service, including all of the rights and easements detailed in the aforementioned Contract and Contract Addendum; and

WHEREAS, Utility Company is in the business of providing water and wastewater services, such as Eagle Creek, and

WHEREAS, the Golf Club owns and operates an Effluent Irrigation System (defined below) that is utilizing reuse quality effluent from the Eagle Creek Wastewater System to irrigate the golf course and other areas, and

WHEREAS, both Golf Club and Utility Company desire to revise, amend, and restate those certain rights and obligations as more fully detailed in the Contract, the Contract Addendum, referenced herein, in order to update and modify the rights and obligations of the Parties to make it more consistent with the current operation and maintenance of the wastewater collection, treatment and disposal system; and

WHEREAS, the Utility Company is preparing to install new force mains that will bring wastewater from off-site developments and return reuse water to off-site disposal areas, a portion of which will cross the golf course property,

NOW, WHEREFORE, in consideration of good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Golf Club, Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC and Utility Company intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

1. Definitions.

- a. "Acquisition Agreement" shall mean that certain Agreement for the transfer and operation of the Wastewater Utility System, dated as of April _____, 2021, executed between Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC and Utility Company.
- b. "Eagle Creek" shall mean the property known as the Eagle Creek community located off Survey Road in Currituck County, North Carolina, which shall consist of approximately 429 residential lots, school and a golf clubhouse, athletic fields, trail system and other recreation and amenity areas.
- c. "DEQ" shall mean the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality.
- d. "Effluent Easement" shall mean this Effluent and Force Main Easement and Irrigation Agreement, including all exhibits and schedules hereto, if any, as may be amended from time to time over:
 - i. Tract 1E Parcel ID: 0015000084D0000[Global PIN: 8031-01-4061];
 - ii. Tract 1D Parcel ID: 0016000001A0000[Global PIN: 8030-19-9824];
 - iii. Tract 1C Parcel ID: 0015000084C0000[Global PIN: 8031-41-8248];
 - iv. Tract 1A Parcel ID: 0015000084A0000[Global PIN: 8031-43-7597];
 - v. Tract 1B Parcel ID: 0015000084B0000[Global PIN: 8031-53-1728];

and including all certain tracts of land containing 159.91 acres in Moyock Township, Currituck County North Carolina as shown on "Mill Run Exempt Subdivision" plat, dated May 8, 1997 by Bissell Professional Group, and recorded on plat book '1244, Pages 459, and Plat Cabinet F, Slides 166, 167, and 168 of Currituck County, North Carolina Registry to which reference is hereby made for a more particular description.

- e. "Effluent Infiltration and Storage Pond" shall mean the 7.4 million gallon irrigation water storage pond, owned and operated by Utility Company in which the Reuse Effluent (as defined below) will be stored after treatment at the WWWTP (as defined below), and from which the Reuse Effluent will then be pumped to be sprayed on the Spray Areas (as defined below).
- f. "Golf Course" shall mean the golf course and areas appurtenant to the golf course at Eagle Creek owned by Golf Club, including Golf Course rough, buffers, cart paths and access areas.
- g. "NCUC" shall mean the North Carolina Utilities Commission.
- h. "Permit" shall mean the permit for the operation of the Wastewater Treatment System and Spray Irrigation Facilities. (each as defined below) issued by DEQ, as the same may be modified or renewed from time to time.
- i. "Reuse Water" shall mean the wastewater that has been treated by Utility Company to the point that it meets the quality standards required by the permit.
- j. "Reuse Water Pumping Station shall mean that certain pump house, pumps and controls to be located near the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond, the

- function of which will be to pump Reuse Water to and through the Spray Irrigation Facilities at Eagle Creek.
- k. "Spray Areas" being all that certain tracts of land Tracts 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D and 1E containing 159.61 acres in Moyock Township, Currituck County North Carolina as shown on "Mill Run Exempt Subdivision" plat, dated May 8, 1997 by Bissell Professional Group, and recorded on plat book '1244, Pages 459, and Plat Cabinet F, Slides 166, 167, and 168 of Currituck County, North Carolina Registry to which reference is hereby made for a more particular description and generally shall mean all areas on the Golf Course, Golf Course buffers, Golf Course rough, Golf Course cart paths, and Golf Course access areas, and other specific tracts of land at the Eagle Creek Golf Club that have been or could be permitted by DEQ for spray irrigation of Reuse Water.
- l. "Spray Irrigation Facilities" shall mean all Reuse Water irrigation lines, Reuse Water Pumping Station, pumps, booster pumps, irrigation and spray devices, controls and other devices used in the application of Reuse Water from the Effluent Irrigation and Storage Pond, as shown on Exhibit A Irrigation Plan Layout dated February 4, 1998 and prepared by Bissell Professional Group, upon the Spray Areas located within Eagle Creek, together with all the appurtenant easements.
- m. "Utility Easement Area" "being all that certain tracts of land Tracts 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D and 1E containing 159.61 acres in Moyock Township, Currituck County North Carolina as shown on "Mill Run Exempt Subdivision" plat, dated May 8, 1997 by Bissell Professional Group, and recorded on plat book '1244, Pages 459, and Plat Cabinet F, Slides 166, 167, and 168 of Currituck County, North Carolina Registry to which reference is hereby made for a more particular description and generally shall mean all areas on the Golf Course, Golf Course buffers, Golf Course rough, Golf Course cart paths, and Golf Course access areas, and other specific tracts of land at the Eagle Creek Golf Club that have been or could be permitted by DEQ for spray irrigation of Reuse Water.
- n. "Wastewater Treatment System" shall mean the WWTP, the collection system that delivers wastewater to the WWTP, the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond, the upset pond, all lift stations, the Reuse Water Pump Station and other facilities used in the collection, treatment, holding and disposal of recovered water, except the Spray Irrigation Facilities.
- o. WWTP shall mean the wastewater treatment plant located within the Eagle Creek development.

2. Utility Easements

 a. Golf Club hereby grants such Utility Easements over the Golf Course Property in favor of Utility Company and its successors and assigns as are necessary for Utility Company's collection, treatment and disposal of wastewater for the

purpose of constructing, laying, maintaining, installing, repairing, operating, upgrading, and replacing wastewater collection, treatment and disposal facilities which are necessary and/or required to provide wastewater service to Utility Company customers. Golf Club agrees that Utility Company notify Golf Club of the location of utility easement and that Golf Club will agree in good faith to the location of the underground utility easements across the Golf Course Property provided, however, no such utility easement shall be established in locations which unduly interfere with the operation of the Golf Course. The facilities constructed or to be constructed shall not unduly interfere with the construction of any improvements constructed or to be constructed on the Golf Course Property.

- b. Golf Club hereby grants to Utility Company, its successors and assigns access for connection to any and all wastewater lines, irrigation lines, mains, pipes, laterals, lift stations, pump stations, and appurtenances.
- c. Force Main Route. In accordance with the notification provision contained herein, Utility Company intends to construct a wastewater force main through the Easement Area. The route for the force main is shown on Exhibit B Proposed Land Development Plan dated February 17, 2021.

3. Treatment and Storage.

a. Utility Company will treat wastewater in its WWTP and discharge the recovered water into the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond. The Reuse Water will be treated by Utility Company to meet appropriate standards established by DWQ in its Permit No. WQ 0014306, and any modified or successive permits issued by DEQ. The amount of flow based upon the DWQ application for approval is permitted to be 350,000 gallons per day ("gpd").

4. Withdrawal and Spray Irrigation.

a. Golf Club shall be responsible for operation maintenance, and repair of the: Reuse Effluent Pumping Station that withdraws the Reuse Effluent from the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond and for the daily operation of the Spray Irrigation Facilities, as shown Exhibit C, under the direction of Utility Company's certified spray irrigation operator.

5. Spraying Activities and Reports.

a. Golf Club will cause its superintendent to spray the Reuse Water onto the DEQ approved Spray Areas. The spray irrigation shall be performed in compliance with all DEQ requirements subject to oversight by Utility Company's and Utility Company's certified spray irrigation operator as the DEQ permittee. Golf Club will cause its superintendent to provide to Utility Company all of its monthly application rates including amounts withdrawn from the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond, amounts sprayed on each DEQ approved Spray Area, application rates and all other Reuse Water spray· irrigation information

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required on Utility Company's monthly reports to DEQ. This information shall be provided in a timely manner each month.

6. Maintaining Effluent Storage Pond Level.

a. Utility Company shall require its certified spray irrigation system operator to monitor the level of the reuse water in the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond and to maintain the level in the Reuse Water Irrigation and Effluent Storage Pond at or below the DEQ required freeboard. During the spring, summer, winter and fall months, Golf Club shall remove Reuse Water from the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond and spray it onto the Spray Area to the maximum extent practicable, so as to maximize storage capacity for winter months when demand for irrigation water is low. During winter months, Golf Club shall remove Reuse Water from the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond and spray it onto the Spray Area as conditions permit. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require Golf Club or its superintendent to take any action that would constitute a violation of the Permit or of any law or regulation.

7. Minimum Required Withdrawal.

- a. Golf Club shall cause its superintendent to remove from the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond and spray onto the Spray Areas all of the available Reuse Effluent up to a maximum annual amount of 117 million gallons. Should DEQ approve a flow reduction for the Wastewater Treatment System, there will not be a reduction in the 117 million gallons Golf Club is required to spray onto the Spray Areas on an annual basis. [note: currently the Eagle Creek system allows the irrigation of up to 262,625 gpd based on installed irrigation, which could be increased to the permit number of 321,000 gpd with additional spray heads.]
- b. From time to time, there may not be enough Reuse Water to adequately irrigate the Golf Course. When there is an inadequate supply of Reuse Water, Golf Club in its reasonable discretion shall have: the right to pump water from other Utility Company approved sources into the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond, which shall be used to irrigate the Spray Areas.
- c. Golf Club is currently and shall continue spraying Reuse Water onto the Spray Areas.
- d. At such time in the future as additional Reuse Water becomes available beyond the 117 million gallons on an annual basis, then Golf Club shall have first option in Golf Club's reasonable discretion to utilize this additional Reuse Water for spray irrigation on the Spray Areas while complying with the DEQ Permits.

8. Utility Company's Right to Assume Spraying Operations.

Golf Club shall operate the Spray Irrigation Facilities in such a manner and with sufficient frequency to distribute Reuse Water in accordance with Section 6. If, in

the reasonable opinion of Utility, Golf Club is not operating or maintaining the Spray irrigation Facilities in accordance with the terms of this Effluent Easement or DEQ requirements, then Utility Company shall give Golf Club written notice to make such repairs or improve such operation and maintenance procedures and, if Golf Club fails or refuses to do so within thirty (30) days after receipt of said written notice, then, at Utility Company's option, Utility Company shall have the right to enter the Spray Areas and undertake such responsibilities to the extent necessary to operate the Spray Irrigation Facilities to accomplish the purposes of this Effluent Easement, and charge Golf Club for the reasonable and necessary costs actually incurred thereby; provided, however, that nothing herein shall relieve Golf Club from the continuing obligation of operation and maintenance of Spray Irrigation Facilities. Should Utility assume the responsibility to operate and maintain the Spray Irrigation Facilities, it shall have no obligation to maintain the Spray Areas or Spray irrigation Facilities for any purpose other than the irrigation with Reuse Water; provided, however, that Utility shall use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid damage to the Spray Irrigation Facilities and the Spray Areas.

9. Testing and Inspections.

a. Utility Company shall have the right, at "any time and upon reasonable notice to Golf Club to enter the Spray Areas and inspect and review the operation and maintenance of the Spray Irrigation Facilities, take tests including water samples, soil borings, and conduct other tests and monitoring of the Spray Areas (including the installation and maintenance of monitoring wells) in relation to the operations to be conducted under this Effluent easement; provided, however, that (i) Utility Company's testing and inspection activities on the Spray Areas shall not interfere with the intended use of the Spray Areas, and (ii) Utility Company shall use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid damage to the Spray Irrigation Facilities and the Spray Areas.

10. Service Interruption.

a. In the event of service interruptions caused by a malfunction of the WWTP, Utility Company shall exercise due diligence in completing the necessary repairs and restoring Reuse Water delivery to the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond. In the event of service interruption caused by a malfunction of the Spray Irrigation Facilities, Golf Club shall exercise due diligence in completing the necessary repairs and restoring Reuse Effluent irrigation to the Spray Areas failing which Utility Company may undertake such repairs as provided in Section 7 above.

11. Grant of Easements.

a. Golf Club hereby grants and conveys to Utility Company, its successors and assigns, a perpetual non-exclusive Utility, Effluent and Force Main and Irrigation

Easement as more fully described in this Effluent Easement within all the Areas: identified in the attached Exhibit B ("Easement Areas"). Golf Club shall not further encumber the Easement Areas, or engage in any activity therein, or grant any other interest or privilege therein to any other party, that would interfere with Utility Company's enjoyment of its rights or fulfillment of its obligations created by this Effluent Easement. Golf Club also grants and conveys to Utility Company, its successors and assigns, a perpetual non-exclusive easement for the purpose of installation, repair and maintenance of one or more force mains that will bring wastewater from off-site developments and return reuse water to off-site disposal areas, following the general alignment shown on the attached Exhibit B ("Force main exhibit). Utility Company shall not interfere with the intended use of the golf course and shall use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid damage to the golf course, and shall make repairs following installation or repair of the force mains within 14 days of completion of installation or repair, to include restoration of any damaged turf.

12. Right of Entry.

a. Golf Club hereby grants to Utility Company a right of ingress, egress, regress and access to and from the Easement Areas, and over, across, upon, and through the Spray Areas, as necessary for Utility Company to enjoy the rights and to fulfill its obligations under this Effluent Easement. Utility Company right of ingress, egress, regress and access shall be non-exclusive; provided, however, Golf Club shall not interfere with or permit any other party to interfere with Utility Company's right of ingress. egress, regress, and access, which shall exist so long as this Effluent Easement remains in force and shall inure to the benefit of Utility Company's successors and assigns. In the exercise of Utility Company's right of ingress, egress, regress, and access, Utility Company shall where possible, use existing roads, paths, and other ways of travel to and from the Spray Areas. Utility Company shall have no obligation to maintain such roads, paths, or other ways of travel, but shall exercise ordinary care in its use of the same. Where roads, paths, or other ways of travel do not exist, Golf Club shall make reasonable efforts to specify ways of travel for Utility Company use so as to permit Utility Company to enjoy the privileges and fulfill the obligations created by this Effluent Easement without undue interference. Utility Company shall use its best efforts to conduct its activities on the Spray Areas and in the Easement Areas so as to avoid any unreasonable and adverse interference with the normal use of the golf course and other Spray Areas.

13. No Payments for Reuse Effluent or Operation of the Spray Irrigation Facilities.

a. There will not be any payments now or at any time in the future by Golf Club to Utility Company for the Reuse Effluent that will be sprayed on the Spray Areas. There will not be any payments by Utility Company to Golf Club now or in the

future for the operation, maintenance, and repair of the Spray Irrigation Facilities. For clarity, this provision does not apply to the monthly payment by Golf Club for wastewater service as authorized by the Commission. Golf Club shall be responsible for payment of North Carolina Utility Commission approved monthly service charges for wastewater services attributable to the flow from no more than ten (10) toilets located within the clubhouse on the Golf Course Property. The service charges shall be due and payable in accordance with approved Utility Company billing procedures.

14. Replacement of the Spray Irrigation Facilities.

a. At such time in the future as it is necessary to replace any portion of the Spray Irrigation Facilities, it shall be Golf Club's sole responsibility to replace such portion of the Spray Irrigation Facilities at Golf Club's cost. Golf Club shall have no responsibilities for the repair, operation or maintenance of the Reuse Water Irrigation and Storage Pond or the force main, which will be the sole responsibility of Utility Company.

15. Expansion and Upgrade of Irrigation Pump Station and Spray Irrigation Facilities.

a. At the Utility Company's sole discretion, it shall have the right to expand or upgrade the Irrigation Pump Station and Spray Irrigation System and that Golf Club shall accept said expansion and upgrades and shall operate and maintain the Pump Station and Spray Irrigation System consistent with this Agreement and as directed by Utility's North Carolina Certified Spray Irrigation Operator.

16. Reuse Effluent Quality.

 Utility Company will not be responsible for achieving water quality levels in the Reuse Water beyond the requirements of the spray irrigation permits issued by DEQ.

17. General Provisions.

- a. Binding upon Successors and Assigns. This Effluent Easement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of Golf Club and Utility Company, and the successors and assigns of each.
- b. No Third Party Beneficiary Rights. Nothing expressed or referred to in this Effluent Easement shall be construed to give any person other than the parties to this Effluent Easement any legal or equitable right, remedy or claim under or with respect to this Effluent Easement or any provision of this Effluent Easement, except such rights as shall inure to a successor or permitted assignee pursuant to Section 15.a above.
- c. Independent Contractor. The parties hereto are and shall be independent contractors to one another, and nothing herein shall be deemed to cause this Effluent Easement to create an agency, partnership, or joint venture between the parties hereto.

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- d. Counterparts. This Effluent Easement may be executed in one or more counterpart signature pages (including email counterpart signature pages), each of which will be deemed to be an original copy of this Effluent Easement and all of which, when taken together, will be deemed to constitute one and the same agreement.
- e. Headings. The headings of particular provisions of this Effluent Easement are inserted for convenience only and shall not be construed as part of this Effluent Easement or serve as a limitation or expansion on the scope of any term or provision of this Effluent Easement.
- f. Enforcement of Effluent Easement. Each party acknowledges and agrees that the other party would be irreparably damaged if any of the provisions of this Effluent Easement are not performed in accordance with their specific terms and that any breach of this Effluent Easement by a party could not be adequately compensated in all cases by monetary damages alone. Accordingly, in addition to any other right or remedy to which a party may be entitled at law or in equity, it shall be entitled to enforce any provision of this Effluent Easement by a decree of specific performance and to temporary, preliminary and permanent injunctive relief to prevent any breach or threatened breach of any of the provisions of this Effluent Easement, without posting any bond or other undertaking.
- g. Notices. All notices and other communications required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall be sent either (i) personally by hand delivery, (ii) by United States first-class mail, postage prepaid, (iii) by hand or nationally recognized overnight courier, or (iv) by email addressed to the address or email address indicated on the signature pages to this Effluent Easement (or at such other address or email address as such party or permitted assignee shall have furnished to the other parties hereto in writing. All such notices' and other written communications shall be effective on the date of delivery, mailing, or receipt of email transmission.
- h. Waiver. No waivers of, or exceptions to, any term, condition or provision of this Effluent Easement, in any one or more instances, shall be deemed to be, or construed as, a further or continuing waiver of any such term, condition or provision.
- i. Entire Agreement. This writing and the documents reference to herein embody the entire agreement and understanding between the parties hereto and there are no other agreements or understandings, oral or written, with reference to the subject matter hereof that arc not merged herein and superseded hereby.
- j. Modifications in Writing. This Effluent Easement shall not be modified, amended, or changed in any respect except in writing, duly signed by the parties hereto, and each party hereby waives any right to amend this Effluent Easement in any other way.

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- k. Consent to Jurisdiction. The parties hereto agree that the state and federal courts of North Carolina shall have exclusive jurisdiction over this Effluent Easement and any controversies arising out of, relating to, or referring to this Effluent Easement, the formation of this Agreement, and actions undertaken by the parties hereto as a result of this Effluent Easement, whether such controversies sound in tort law, contract law or otherwise. Each of the parties hereto expressly and irrevocably consents to the personal jurisdiction of such state and federal Courts, agrees to accept service of process by mail, and expressly waives any jurisdictional or venue defenses otherwise available.
- Governing Law. This Effluent Easement shall be governed by the internal substantive laws of the State: of North Carolina, without regard to such state's conflict of law or choice of law rules.
- m. Recordation. Upon execution of this Effluent Easement, Utility shall record this Effluent Easement in the Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina at Utility Company's expense.

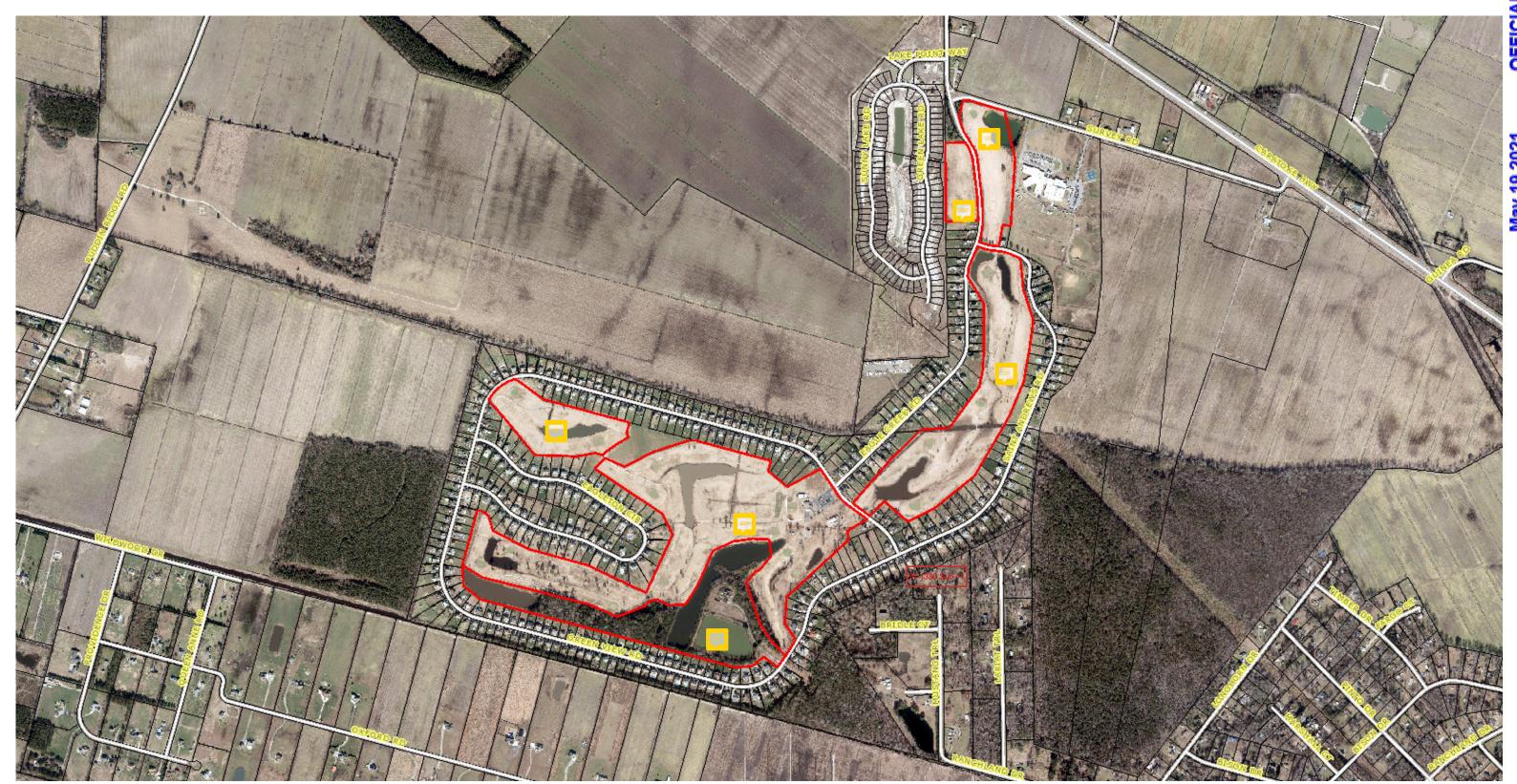
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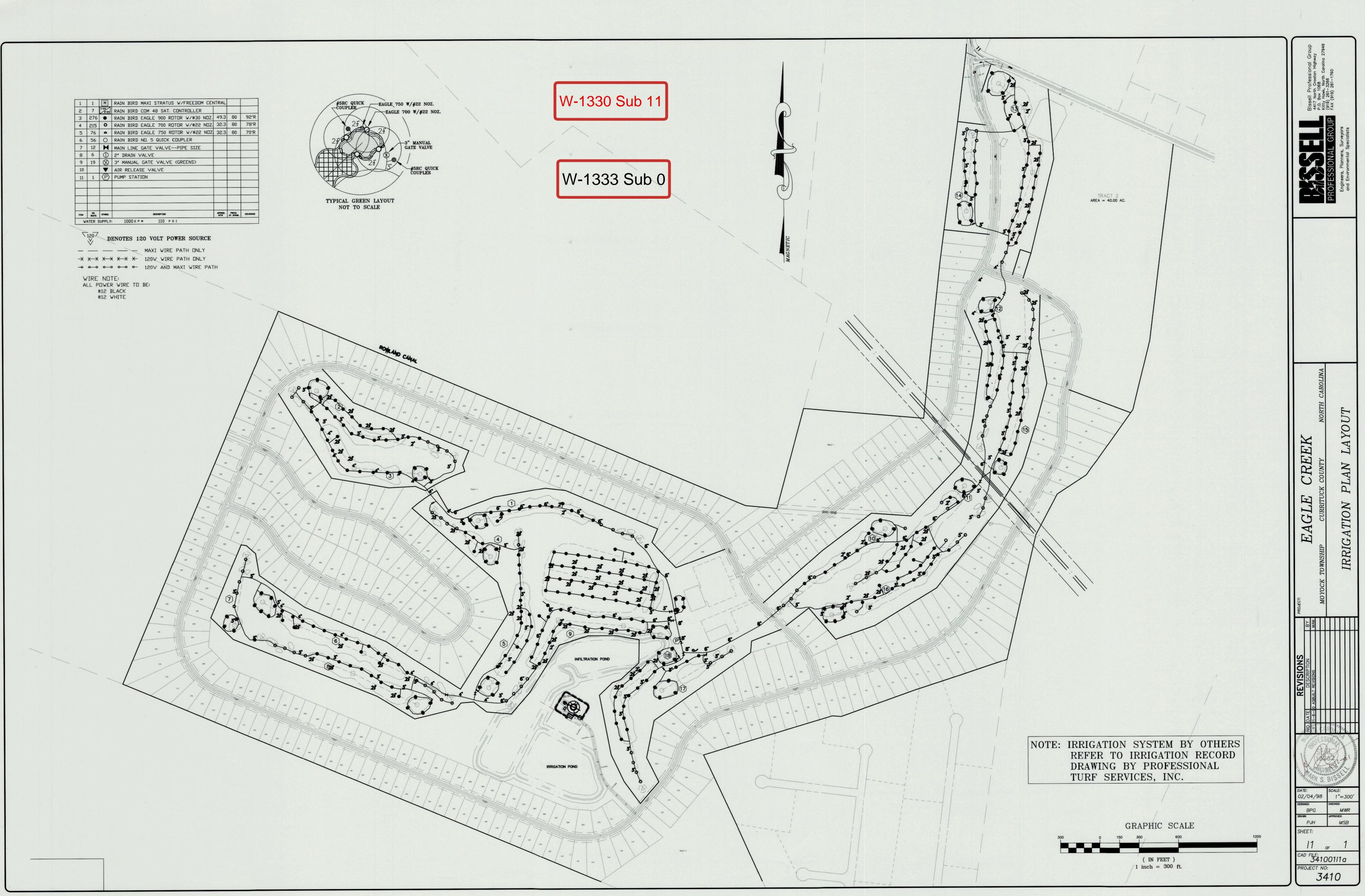
Exhibit A – Irrigation Plan Layout [Bissell Professional Group, February 4, 1998.





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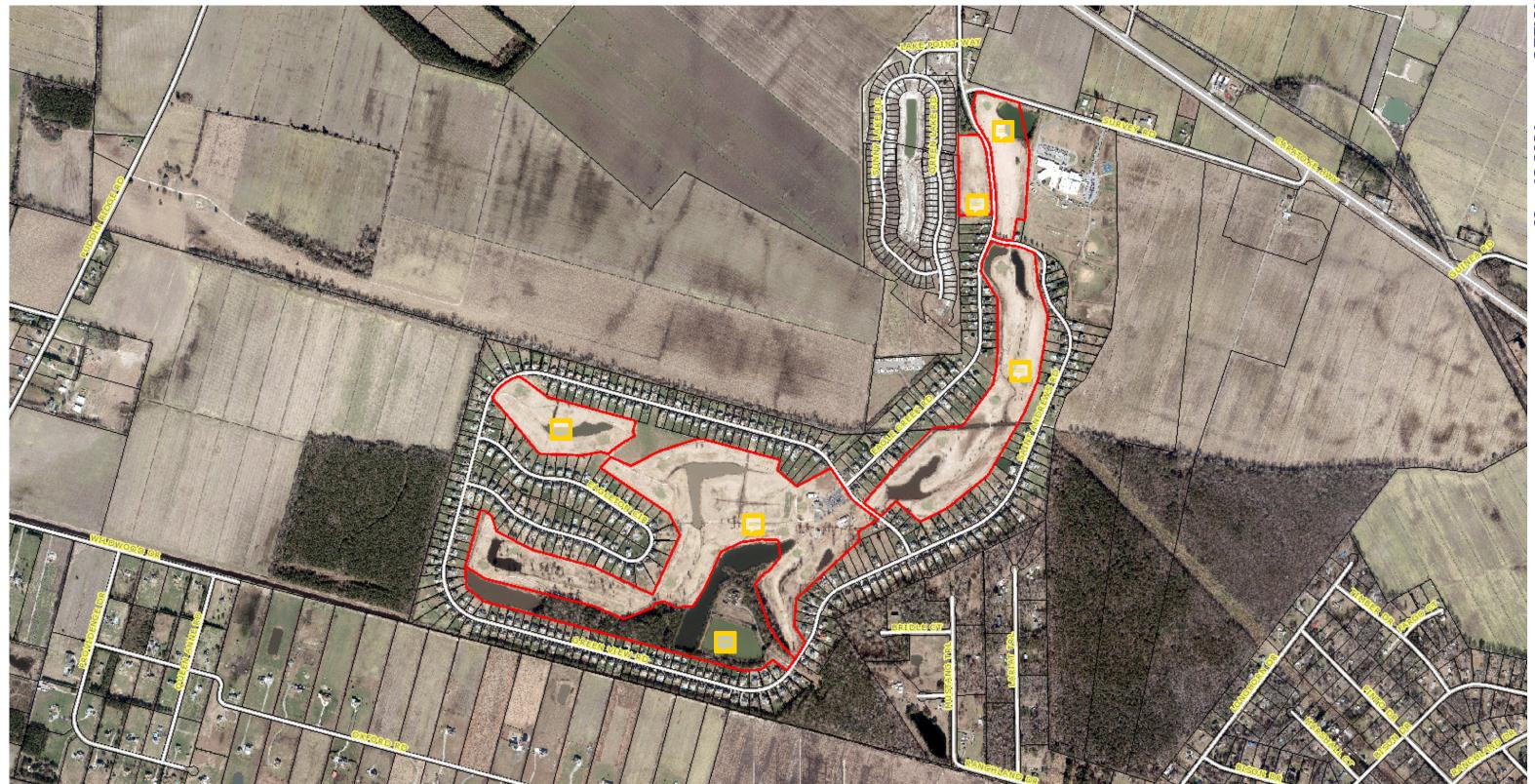

ASSET PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS ASSET PURCHASE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made this the day of April, 2021 ("Effective Date"), by and between SANDER UTILITIES AT MILL RUN, LLC, a North Carolina Limited Liability Company ("Seller"), and CURRITUCK WATER & SEWER, LLC, a North Carolina Limited Liability Company ("Buyer") (individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties").

WITNESSETH:

(capitalized terms are defined in Article 1)

WHEREAS, Seller presently owns and operates the Wastewater System in Currituck County, North Carolina;

WHERAS, the Wastewater System currently serves the Eagle Creek Subdivision, Moyock Middle School, and the Eagle Creek Golf Club and Grill;

WHEREAS, Seller has obtained approvals from the Division of Water Resources ("DWR"), a Division within the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ"), for the construction and operation of *DEQ*the Wastewater System as pursuant to the WWTP Permit and the Collection System Permit;

WHEREAS, Seller has obtained a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CPCN") from the North Carolina Utilities Commission ("NCUC");

WHEREAS, Buyer is engaged in the business of owning and operating water and wastewater utility assets and furnishing water and wastewater utility operation and management services in the State of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Seller desires to sell to Buyer, and Buyer desires to purchase from Seller, the Wastewater System pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions, warranties, representations, stipulations and agreements herein contained, the Parties hereto mutually agree and covenant as follows:

ARTICLE I Definitions



- 1.1. "Agreement" shall mean this Asset Purchase Agreement, including any and all exhibits and schedules, if any, as amended from time to time.
- 1.2. "Certificate" or "CPCN" shall mean the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for providing wastewater utility service issued by the Commission in Docket No. W-1130, Sub 0.
 - 1.3. "CIAC" shall mean Contribution in Aid of Construction.
 - 1.4. "Closing" is defined in Article IX herein.
 - 1.5. "Closing Date" shall mean the date of the Closing.
- 1.6. "Clubhouse" shall mean the +/-5,800 square foot clubhouse serving the Golf Course.
- 1.7. "Collection System Permit" shall mean, collectively, those permits issued by DEQ for the construction and operation of the Wastewater Collection System, including all modifications thereto, including without limitation Permit No. WQCS00290, Eagle Creek Collection System, System-Wide Wastewater Collection System Permit issued by DEQ, as shown on Schedule 8, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and any subsequent modifications thereto.
 - 1.8. "Commission" shall mean the North Carolina Utilities Commission.
 - 1.9. "DEQ" shall mean the North Carolina Department of Environment Quality.
 - 1.10. DEQ "DWR" shall mean the Division of Water Resources.
- 1.11. Eagle Creek Subdivision" or "Subdivision" shall mean the single-family residential community known as Eagle Creek located in Moyock, Currituck County, North Carolina, consisting of approximately 420 single family residences, together with the streets and sidewalks and amenities.
- 1.12. "Golf Course" shall mean Eagle Creek Golf Club, an 18-hole golf course and appurtenances constructed on approximately 160.18 acres of real property adjacent to the Subdivision.
- 1.13. "Golf Course Agreement" shall mean that certain Contract Addendum and Agreement dated as of June 20, 1997, between Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc., a Virginia corporation, and Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc., a North Carolina corporation, recorded with the Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina in Book 407, Page 338, as assigned by Tate Terrace to Sandler at Mill Run, L.L.C., a Virginia limited liability company, pursuant to Assignment dated November 7, 1997, recorded with the Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina in Book 422, Page 297.

- 1.14. "Governmental Authority" shall mean each and every applicable authority, department, agency, bureau, or other entity or instrumentality having jurisdiction over the Wastewater System, including the federal government of the United States, Currituck County, the Utility Commission, and all other applicable governmental authorities and subdivisions thereof.
 - 1.15. "GPD" shall mean gallons per day.
- 1.16. "Management Agreement" shall mean the Management Contract between Seller and Enviro-Tech, predecessor-in-interest to Operator, dated January 28, 2015, related to the operation and maintenance of the Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- 1.17. "Operator" shall mean Envirolink, Inc., the current manager and operator of the Wastewater System, as successor-in-interest to Enviro-Tech as a party to the Management Agreement.
- 1.18. "Permits" shall mean the collective reference to the WWTP Permit and the Collection System Permit.
 - 1.19. "School" shall mean Moyock Middle School.
- 1.20. "Service Line" shall mean that portion of the individual wastewater line located on any lot that connects the residence (or other improvement) to the valve pits and is owned and maintained by the individual lot owner.
- 1.21. "Utility Company" shall mean a public or private company duly authorized by the Commission to provide wastewater utility services (collection, treatment and disposal) within a specified franchise area or any entity providing such services on behalf of a body politic, municipality or other governmental body or entity.
- 1.22. "Wastewater Assets" shall mean certain of Seller's interests in the real property, tangible personal property and intangible personal property, as described in <u>Schedule 1</u>, and related to the current provision of wastewater utility service for the Subdivision, the School and the Clubhouse. The Wastewater Assets described in <u>Schedule 1</u> will be transferred by Seller to Buyer in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 1.23. "Wastewater Collection System" shall mean the wastewater vacuum lines, vacuum pots, and all appurtenant equipment constructed and located within or outside the Subdivision, that transmit the wastewater from the customers in the Subdivision, the School and the Clubhouse to the Wastewater Treatment Plant, as more fully described in the collection system map provided in Schedule 13.
- 1.24. "Wastewater System" shall mean the entire wastewater system including the Wastewater Treatment Plant, the Wastewater Collection System, the valve pits, effluent easements, collection systems easements, buildings, parts, equipment, and other facilities used in

the collection, treatment, holding and disposal of the wastewater, and any additional components of the wastewater utility system necessary to provide wastewater service as shown on <u>Schedule 1</u>.

- 1.25. "Wastewater Treatment Plant" or "WWTP" shall mean the existing permitted 175,000 GPD wastewater treatment and disposal facilities.
- 1.26. "WWTP Permit" shall mean Permit No. WQ0014306, Eagle Creek WWTP, Reclaimed Water Generation, Non-Conjunctive Reclaimed Water Utilization and High-Rate Infiltration System Permit issued by DWR, as shown on <u>Schedule 8</u>, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and any subsequent modifications thereto.

ARTICLE II Representations and Covenants by Seller

SELLER REPRESENTS, WARRANTS and COVENANTS THAT ON THE DATE HEREOF AND AS OF THE CLOSING DATE:

- 2.1. <u>Organization; Good Standing</u>. Seller is a limited liability company, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of North Carolina, and it is authorized to do business in the State of North Carolina.
- 2.2. <u>Power and Authority Relative to Agreement</u>. Seller has full power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement, to perform its obligations hereunder, and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby. The execution and delivery by Seller of this Agreement, and the performance by Seller of its obligations hereunder, have been duly and validly authorized by its members and managers, and no other action on the part of Seller is necessary in furtherance thereof.
- 2.3. No Actions at Law or Suits in Equity. A Complaint and Motion for Injunctive Relief was filed on March 4, 2021 by the State of North Carolina, ex rel, North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality, Plaintiff, against Seller in the Superior Court Division of Currituck County (21 CVS 78) ("DEQ Complaint"). In addition, DEQ has issued; a Notice of Violation and Notice of Intent to Enforce on October 7, 2020; a Second Notice of Violation and Notice of Intent to Enforce on November 23, 2020; a Third Notice of Violation and Notice of Intent to Enforce on December 16, 2020; a Fourth Notice of Violation and Notice of Intent to Enforce on January 14, 2021; and civil penalties. However, there are no actions or proceedings or, to Seller's knowledge, threatened against Seller, that would prohibit or make illegal the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. Buyer acknowledges that it is aware of the DEQ Complaint and the allegations contained therein, the five Notices of Violation and Notices of Intent to Enforce, and the civil penalties. Aside from the aforementioned acknowledgement of the DEQ fpermit

Compliant and assessed penalties, there are no pending or, to Seller's knowledge, threatened actions at law or suits in equity relating to the Wastewater Assets, and there are no pending or, to Seller's knowledge, threatened proceedings before any governmental agency with respect to the Wastewater Assets. There are no actions or proceedings pending or, to Seller's knowledge,

threatened against Seller that would prohibit or make illegal the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement. Buyer is aware that there have been recent failures of components of the Wastewater System (collectively, the "System Failures"), including: (a) two vacuum pumps failed causing backups of wastewater at residences in the Subdivision, (b) one or more vacuum pump controllers failed which caused the vacuum pumps to continue pumping during circumstances when they should have shut down, resulting in backups of wastewater at residences in the Subdivision, and (c) a storm event inundated the Wastewater System and introduced water into the vacuum pump controllers resulting in backups at residences in the Subdivision. Buyer agrees to support Seller's efforts to in defense of the DEQ Complaint, but does not assume any liability whatsoever.

- 2.4. <u>Effect of Agreement</u>. The execution and delivery by Seller of this Agreement does not, and the performance by Seller of its obligations under this Agreement and the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby, shall, to Seller's knowledge, not:
- a. Conflict with, or result in a violation or breach of, any of the terms, conditions or provisions of Seller's Articles of Organization, Operating Agreement or other governing documents;
- b. Result in a default, penalty, or any adjustment in required payments (or give rise to any right of termination, cancellation or acceleration) under any of the terms, conditions or provisions of any note, bond, deed of trust, indenture, license, agreement, lease or other instrument or obligation to which Seller is bound, except for such defaults, penalties or adjustments (or rights of termination, cancellation or acceleration) as to which requisite waivers or consents have been obtained; or
- c. Conflict with or result in a violation or breach of any term or provision of any law applicable to Seller or any of its affiliates or any of their respective assets and properties.
- 2.5. <u>Contractual Obligations</u>. There are no restrictions, covenants, contracts or obligations of any nature between Seller and any other party relating to the Wastewater Assets. Seller has not entered into any service agreements with persons receiving wastewater service from the Wastewater System that will survive beyond the Closing Date other than (a) the persons owning lots in the Subdivision, (b) the Golf Course pursuant to the Golf Course Agreement, and (c) the School.
- 2.6. <u>Notice of Termination or Default</u>. Seller is not aware of, and Seller has not received any notice of termination or notice of default or claim with respect to any agreement or commitment in effect related to the Wastewater Assets, except as disclosed in Section 2.3 above and except for any such notices of default set forth on <u>Schedule 12</u> attached hereto.
- 2.7. <u>Permits and Approvals</u>. Seller has all the required permits and approvals from DEQ to operate the Wastewater System. Buyer is aware that the WWTP Permit expired on September 30, 2020. Operator is pursuing renewal of the WWTP Permit on behalf of Seller as more particularly described in Section 8.2 herein. Buyer is further aware that the Collection System Permit expires on May 31, 2021. Operator shall pursue renewal of the Collection System Permit on behalf of Seller as more particularly described in Section 8.3 herein.

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- 2.8. <u>Wastewater Monitoring</u>. Seller has conducted all wastewater sampling and analyses required by DEQ, and Seller is current on all such sampling and analyses. The Parties agree that in the event that Buyer is required by DEQ to collect and have analyzed any past-due sampling as a condition of renewal of the WWTP Permit or approval of Buyer's CPCN, the Purchase Price paid at Closing shall be reduced by the laboratory costs paid by Buyer for such analyses as evidenced by paid invoices.
- 2.9. Accuracy or Representations and Warranties. No representation or warranty by Seller in this Agreement, or any statement or certificate furnished or to be furnished to Buyer pursuant hereto or in connection with the transactions contemplated herein, contains or will contain any untrue statement of a material fact or will omit to state a material fact necessary to make the statements contained herein or therein not misleading.

ARTICLE III Representations and Covenants by Buyer

BUYER REPRESENTS, WARRANTS and COVENANTS THAT ON THE DATE HEREOF AND AS OF THE CLOSING DATE:

- 3.1. Organization; Good Standing. Buyer is a North Carolina limited liability company in existence under the laws of the State of North Carolina and has full power and authority to conduct its business as it is now being conducted and to own, operate, and manage its assets and properties.
- 3.2. <u>Power and Authority Relative to Agreement</u>. Buyer has full power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement, to perform its obligations hereunder, and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby. The execution and delivery by Buyer of this Agreement, and the performance by Buyer of its obligations hereunder, have been duly and validly authorized by its members and manager, and no other action on the part of Buyer is necessary in furtherance thereof.
- 3.3. No Actions or Proceedings. There are no actions or proceedings pending or, to Buyer's knowledge, threatened against Buyer or any of its assets and properties that would be reasonably expected to result in the issuance of an order restraining, enjoining or otherwise prohibiting or making illegal the consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement.
- 3.4. <u>Effect of Agreement</u>. The execution and delivery by Buyer of this Agreement does not, and the performance by Buyer of its obligations under this Agreement and the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby do not:
- a. Conflict with or result in a violation or breach of any of the terms, conditions or provisions of Buyer's articles of organization, operating agreement, or other corporate government documents;
- b. Result in a default, penalty, or any adjustment in required payments (or give rise to any right of termination, cancellation or acceleration) under any of the terms, conditions or

provisions of any note, bond, deed of trust, indenture, license, agreement, lease or other instrument or obligation to which Buyer or any of its affiliates is a party or by which any of their respective assets and properties may be bound, except for such defaults, penalties or adjustments (or rights of termination, cancellation or acceleration) as to which requisite waivers or consents have been obtained; or

- c. Conflict with or result in a violation or breach of any term or provision of any law applicable to Buyer or any of its affiliates or any of their respective assets and properties.
- 3.5. No Claim by Third Parties. All negotiations relative to this Agreement and the transactions contemplated hereby have been carried out by Buyer directly with Seller without the intervention of any person on behalf of Buyer in such manner as to give rise to any valid claim by any person against Seller for a finder's fee, brokerage commission or similar payment.
- 3.6. Experience. Buyer is a Utility Company and is experienced in the ownership, operation and maintenance of wastewater treatment and disposal facilities.
- 3.7 <u>Accuracy of Representations and Warranties</u>. No representation or warranty by Buyer in this Agreement, or any statement or certificate furnished or to be furnished to Seller pursuant hereto or in connection with the transactions contemplated herein, contains or will contain any untrue statement of a material fact or will omit to state a material fact necessary to make the statements contained herein or therein not misleading.

ARTICLE IV Purchase Price, Fees, Monthly Rates, and Closing Documents

4.1. <u>Purchase of Wastewater Assets</u>. Seller agrees to sell, and Buyer agrees to purchase the Wastewater Assets, including the parcels of land upon which the WWTP and any ponds are located, easements, and rights-of-way agreements, as set forth in <u>Schedules 1, 3 and 7</u>, on or before the Closing Date, for the consideration hereinafter set forth herein. Buyer is not purchasing Seller's cash, bank accounts, accounts receivable prior to the Closing Date, or certificates of deposit, if any, furnished to the Commission for the Commission required bond.

4.2. <u>Purchase Price</u>.

- a. At Closing. The purchase price for the existing Wastewater Assets ("Purchase Price") shall be Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000), that can be included as Original Cost Rate Base. In addition to the purchase price of \$250,000, the Purchase Price shall be increased by the amount of any costs incurred and paid by Seller for renewal and replacements, capitalized repairs, and/or upgrades to the Wastewater System as approved by the Commission and Buyer, which Buyer approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed, during the period from the effective date until the Closing Date The Purchase Price shall be paid by Buyer to Seller in cash or cash equivalent at Closing.
- b. <u>Additional Purchase Price</u>. After Closing, Buyer shall pay to Seller an amount up to \$88,900 ("Additional Purchase Price"), payable as set forth in this Paragraph 4.2(b). The Additional Purchase Price is equivalent to \$100 for each of the 889 new connections made to the

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Wastewater System from the adjacent Fost and Flora subdivisions that will be developed by other developers (the "New Connections"). Payments of the Additional Purchase Price shall be made by Buyer to Seller quarterly on each January 15, April 15, July 15 and October 15 of the calendar year, based on the number of New Connections made in the previous calendar quarter, commencing with the quarter following the quarter in which the first New Connections are made and continuing each quarter thereafter for three years. Buyer's obligation for the Additional Purchase Price shall survive the Closing.

c. Rate Base Treatment of Purchase Price. This Agreement is contingent upon the Commission establishing, at or prior to the time that the Commission transfers the CPCN to Buyer, the rate base for the Wastewater System for an amount equal to the price to be paid to Seller by Buyer at Closing. Buyer will use its best efforts to obtain an Order from the Commission that establishes the rate base as expeditiously as possible. The Parties acknowledge that the Buyer anticipates that the Commission will approve the Purchase Price for inclusion in the Original Cost Rate Base.

In the event that the Commission fails to establish the rate base or in event that Buyer or Seller is not satisfied with the amount of the rate base that the Commission establishes, Buyer or Seller shall have the right to terminate this Agreement. In the event that this Agreement is terminated, Buyer and Seller will have no further obligations to the other.

- d. <u>Tax Matters</u>. Prior to the first payment being made by Buyer to Seller, Seller shall execute and deliver to Buyer the Internal Revenue Service Form W-9.
- 4.3. <u>Documents to be delivered to Buyer at Closing</u>. At Closing, Seller will deliver to Buyer the following documents:
- a. A Quit Claim deed from Seller to Buyer in recordable form sufficient to vest fee simple title to the Wastewater Assets that constitute real property.
- b. A bill of sale from Seller for the Wastewater Assets that constitute personal property.
- c. Seller's copies of all financial and Wastewater System records, including copies of back up invoices and proof of payment, relating to utility plant schedules and invoices for the Wastewater System necessary for Buyer to establish the rate base, accumulated depreciation, CIAC, tap fees, etc.
- d. Non-exclusive assignments of all Seller's interest in any easements and rights-ofway for access and operation of the Wastewater System including an assignment of the Golf Course Agreement.
- e. An assignment of all rights of Seller under any Developer Agreements (as hereinafter defined in Paragraph 6.1.g.) related to the Wastewater Assets, including rights for

future Wastewater System expansion and any future connection charges, tap fees, or impact fees which are to be paid by developers to Seller under the Developer Agreements.

- f. An assignment evidencing the transfer of Seller's assignable rights under the Collection System Permit, the WWTP Permit and the Special Use Permit.
 - g. A Closing Statement.
- h. Necessary certificates as to income tax status and matters related to Section 1445 of the Internal Revenue Code or other evidence satisfactory that Seller has complied with Section 1445, including establishment of escrow until the withholding requirements of 1445 have been met.
- i. Information and affidavits necessary for the person conducting Closing to file IRS Form 1099S and the state equivalent form for North Carolina.
- j. A commercially reasonable Affidavit of Title regarding any mechanics' liens signed by Seller, and such other reasonable and customary indemnities, affidavits, certificates and documents as Buyer's title insurance company may require, all in forms reasonably required to issue the title insurance policy.
- k. Copies of resolutions satisfactory to Buyer's title insurance company of the members and manager of Seller authorizing the sale of the Wastewater Assets and/or other evidence reasonably satisfactory to the title insurance company that the person or persons executing the closing documents on behalf of Seller have full right, power and authority to do so.
- l. Such other instruments as are contemplated by this Agreement to be executed and delivered by Seller or reasonably required by Buyer, any governmental agency, or Buyer's title insurance company.
- 4.4. <u>Documents to be delivered to Buyer.</u> Upon written request of Buyer, Seller will deliver to Buyer any of the following documents in Seller's possession or control:
- a. Without warranty, express or implied, all files, documents, papers, agreements, books of account, customer lists, records, and previous account balance history, lot numbers and service addresses, lists of schedules, original cost invoices and invoices of costs for additions to the Wastewater System after the Certificate was granted, in electronic and/or "hard" copies, and records in Seller's possession pertaining to the Wastewater Assets. This information shall be delivered to Buyer in editable electronic format, if possible.
- b. Wastewater utility system prints, plans, specifications, engineering reports, engineer certifications, wastewater reports, surveys, shop drawings, equipment manuals, and wastewater analyses reports that are necessary for the operation of the Wastewater System and are in the possession of Seller or its agents. This information shall be delivered to Buyer in editable electronic format, if possible.

- c. All non-developer contracts which relate to the Wastewater Assets and are necessary for the continuing maintenance and operation of the Wastewater Assets. Seller shall provide to Buyer a copy of each such contract prior to Closing, and Seller and Buyer shall mutually agree upon which contracts will be assigned to and assumed by Buyer.
- d. All customer accounts receivables as described in <u>Schedules 4 and 10</u> of this Agreement.
- e. Copies of any covenants or restrictions related to wastewater service that are contained within customers' deeds.

This obligation of Seller to provide documents upon the written request of Buyer shall continue in effect after the Closing.

- 4.5. <u>Absence of Liabilities</u>. Seller shall transfer and convey the Wastewater Assets in marketable fee simple or title free and clear of all liens, encumbrances, liabilities, debts, assessments, claims, judgments, and current federal, state or county taxes, except those tax obligations expressly set forth in this Agreement to be prorated. Buyer is not assuming, will not be responsible for, and will not pay any of Seller's liabilities, known or unknown, including debts, assessments, judgments, or federal, state or county taxes, except those tax obligations expressly set forth in this Agreement to be prorated.
- 4.6. Possession and Operations Prior to and After Closing. Possession of the Wastewater Assets shall be delivered to Buyer on the date of Closing. Buyer, at Closing, will immediately assume ownership and operation of the Wastewater Assets and be responsible for payment of all costs of the operation and maintenance, which arise after the Closing. Effective on the Closing Date, Buyer shall be responsible for having the electricity and other utility services placed in its name. Seller shall cooperate fully with Buyer, at no cost to Seller, to avoid any undue difficulties or interruptions of service after the Closing Date. From and after the Effective Date of this Agreement, Seller will not dispose of or encumber the Wastewater Assets. After the Effective Date of this Agreement and prior to the date of Closing, Seller will not, without giving written notice to Buyer, enter into new agreements with developers for expansion of the Wastewater System.

ARTICLE V Inspection of Wastewater System

Between the Effective Date hereof and the Closing Date, Seller will, at reasonable times and upon reasonable prior notice, permit Buyer, its attorneys and agents, to examine Seller's books, accounts, and other records relating to the Wastewater Assets.

ARTICLE VI Documents to be Delivered to Buyer Prior to Closing

6.1. <u>Documents to be Furnished within Twenty 20 Days</u>. Seller shall deliver to Buyer within twenty (20) days of the Effective Date the documents listed below for Buyer's

review that Seller has not already provided to Buyer. Buyer shall have sixty (60) days after execution of this Agreement to review and either approve or disapprove each document and the contents therein. If Buyer disapproves any of the documents, Buyer shall provide written notice within the 60-day period to Seller of its disapproval, and Buyer shall not be obligated to close this transaction. If Buyer fails to provide written notice of disapproval of any document within the 60-day period, Buyer shall be deemed to have approved the document.

- a. Schedule 1 listing the Wastewater Assets.
- b. <u>Schedule 2</u> listing the number and identification of current and active connections to the Wastewater System, the DEQ I.D. number.
- c. <u>Schedule 3</u> listing of all parcels upon which the WWTP and pump stations are located, and all other real property related to the Wastewater System to be transferred, along with copies of all deeds and easements with recorded deed books and pages.
- f. Schedule 4 listing the names, physical addresses, mailing addresses, and lot numbers of all customers.
- g. <u>Schedule 5</u> listing all Developer Agreements entered into between Seller and owners or developers of property regarding wastewater service to be provided to properties in the Subdivision. <u>Schedule 5</u> shall also list each agreement date and the parties to the agreement, with copies attached of each Developer Agreement.
- h. <u>Schedule 6</u> listing of invoices for the cost for the installation of the Wastewater System and any repairs and upgrades made to the Wastewater System with copies of invoices and amounts paid attached.
- i. <u>Schedule 7</u> listing all easements and rights-of-way owned or used by Seller for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Wastewater System, with copies of the documents attached.
- j. <u>Schedule 8</u> listing all DEQ and Currituck County approvals and permits, with copies of the DEQ and Currituck County approvals and permits attached. <u>Schedule 8</u> shall also list any portion of any Wastewater System that does not have a DEQ written approval or permit.
- k. <u>Schedule 9</u> listing all other agreements entered into by or between Seller and other parties, which would or might be considered to be an encumbrance upon the Wastewater Assets, with copies of such agreements attached.
- l. <u>Schedule 10</u> listing all prepaid customer tap fees and prepaid CIAC for which the Wastewater System or a portion thereof has not been installed.
- m. <u>Schedule 11</u> listing all North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) and other highway and public road encroachment agreements in the Subdivision that affect or relate to the Wastewater System, with copies attached.

- n. Schedule 12 listing all notices of default, terminations and claims.
- o. Schedule 13 that provides the Collection System map.
- p. <u>Schedule 14</u> that lists planned renewal and replacements, upgrades and capital repairs, along with projected capital requirements for each project.

ARTICLE VII Operation of the Wastewater System Prior to Closing

- 7.1. Operation of Wastewater System Prior to Closing. From the Effective Date until the Closing Date or earlier termination of this Agreement, Seller shall continue to operate the Wastewater System in the manner in which it is presently operated.
- 7.2 Repairs; Capital Improvements. Other than those repairs and capital improvements set forth on Schedule 14, Seller has no obligation to perform any repairs or capital improvements. In the event that prior to Closing, renewal and replacements, capital repairs and upgrades to the Wastewater System other than those shown on Schedule 14 are necessary either (a) to respond to a Notice of Violation of a Permit, or (b) to fix a problem which has rendered the Wastewater System (or an element of the Wastewater System) non-operational, then Seller shall obtain Buyer's permission to complete the renewal and replacement, capitalized repair or upgrade along with projected cost. Upon payment by the Seller, the Purchase Price shall be adjusted in accordance with paragraph 4.2 (a).
- 7.3 Contract Operations Agreement. Seller and Buyer agree that the Management Agreement between Seller and Operator shall remain in place during the pendency of this Agreement and that neither Seller nor Operator shall terminate the Management Agreement except for a material breach of the Management Agreement by the other Party. Buyer shall cause Operator to continue to serve as "Operator in Responsible Charge" as required by governmental authorities and shall cause Operator to continue to perform the operations and preventive maintenance services for the Wastewater System until the Closing. In the event that the Management Agreement is terminated, Seller shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Buyer.

ARTICLE VIII Buyer's Obligations Prior to Closing

8.1. <u>Use Permit.</u> After Closing, Buyer intends to undertake capital improvements to the Wastewater System to increase the capacity of the Wastewater System and convert the vacuum wastewater collection system by (a) expansion of the Wastewater Plant, (b) upgrading the Golf Course spray irrigation to accept effluent from the Wastewater System, (c) rehabilitation of the infiltration and storage pond(s), and (d) construction of a gravity collection system with pump stations and force mains. ("Improvements"). Buyer's ability to improve and expand the Wastewater System requires the issuance by Currituck County, North Carolina, of the Special Use

Permit. On or about August 28, 2020, Buyer submitted an application to Currituck County for issuance of the Use Permit. The Parties acknowledge that Currituck County has approved and issued to Currituck Water and Sewer a Special Use Permit in Buyer's name.

- WWTP Permit Renewal. The WWTP Permit expired on September 30, 2020. 8.2 Buyer agrees that it shall cause Operator to continue to manage renewal of the WWTP Permit on behalf of Seller pursuant to the Management Agreement. The Parties acknowledge that the Operator submitted an application to DEQ for renewal of the WWTP Permit ("WWTP Permit Renewal") and that WWTP Permit Renewal is being reviewed by DEQ. Buyer agrees that it shall cause Operator to diligently and in good faith process renewal of the WWTP Permit on behalf of Seller to its conclusion. Buyer agrees that it shall cause Operator to provide Seller with copies of all correspondence to and from DEQ in connection with the WWTP Permit Renewal and Buyer agrees to keep Seller apprised of Operator's efforts in pursuing approval of the WWTP Permit Renewal. In the event that despite diligent and good faith efforts by Operator, DEQ denies the WWTP Permit Renewal, Buyer shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Seller. In the event that despite diligent and good faith efforts by Operator, the WWTP Permit Renewal has not been obtained prior to Closing, Buyer shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Seller. In the event of termination of this Agreement, Buyer and Seller will have no further obligations to the other.
- May 31, 2021. Buyer agrees that it shall cause Operator to manage renewal of the Collection System Permit on behalf of Seller pursuant to the Management Agreement. Buyer agrees that it shall cause Operator to diligently and in good faith process renewal of the Collection System Permit on behalf of Seller to its conclusion ("Collection System Permit Renewal"). Buyer agrees that it shall cause Operator to provide Seller with copies of all correspondence to and from DEQ in connection with Collection System Permit Renewal and Buyer agrees to keep Seller apprised of Operator's efforts in pursuing approval of the Collection System Permit Renewal. In the event that despite diligent and good faith efforts by Operator, DEQ denies the Collection System Permit Renewal, Buyer shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Seller. In the event that despite diligent and good faith efforts by Operator, Collection System Permit Renewal has not been obtained prior to Closing, Buyer shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Seller. In the event of termination of this Agreement, Buyer and Seller will have no further obligations to the other.
- 8.4 <u>Certificate</u>; <u>Rates</u>. On or before April 20, 2021, Buyer, at Buyer's cost, shall prepare and file an application with the Commission for transfer of the Certificate to Buyer and/or issuance of a new Certificate to Buyer. In its application to the Commission for the Certificate, Buyer will request that the Commission maintain the monthly flat rate of \$52.65 per residential equivalent unit (REU) connected to the Wastewater System. Buyer agrees that it shall diligently and in good faith process its application for transfer of the Certificate and the requested rates and charges to its conclusion. It shall be a condition precedent for Closing that the Commission approves Buyer's requested rates and charges. Buyer agrees that it shall provide Seller with copies of all correspondence to and from the Commission in connection with the transfer and issuance of the Certificate to Buyer and Buyer agrees to keep Seller apprised of its efforts in pursuing issuance of the Certificate and its proposed rates and charges. In the event that despite

diligent and good faith efforts by Buyer, the Commission has not approved Buyer's CPCN and/or its proposed rates and charges by December 31, 2022, Seller shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Buyer. In the event of termination of this Agreement, Buyer and Seller will have no further obligations to the other.

- 8.4. <u>Buyer to Furnish Bond with the Commission</u>. Upon the Commission's approval of the Certificate to Buyer for the Wastewater System, Buyer shall furnish the bond required by the Commission in the amount satisfactory to the Commission.
- 8.5. Amendment to Golf Course Agreement. During the pendency of this Agreement, Buyer and Operator shall have the right to contact the Golf Course and to coordinate and manage the negotiations with the Golf Course for an amendment to the Golf Course Agreement to allow for the necessary easements to connect adjoining properties to the Wastewater System and to increase the capacity of the Golf Course's irrigation system. Seller acknowledges that it has been provided the amended Golf Course Agreement eliminating the restriction that prohibited connection of adjoining properties.
- 8.6. <u>Cooperation</u>. Seller agrees to cooperate with Buyer, at no cost to Seller, in connection with Buyer's pursuit of the Use Permit, the Permit Renewal, the issuance of the Certificate and the amendment to the Golf Course Agreement. In that regard, Seller agrees that it shall furnish to Buyer the necessary financial documentation and information to establish the original cost of the Wastewater System for Buyer's proceeding before the Commission.

ARTICLE IX Closing

- 9.1. Date for the Closing. The Closing of the transaction contemplated hereunder shall occur within thirty (30) days after the date of issuance of the CPCN by the Commission to Buyer. The Closing shall occur in the office of an attorney licensed in the State of North Carolina. In the event that Closing has not occurred on or before April 15, 2023, Seller shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Buyer. In the event of termination of this Agreement, Buyer and Seller will have no further obligations to the other.
- 9.2. No Claim by Third Parties. Seller and Buyer each represent to the other that no party is entitled to a commission upon the Closing and transfer of the Wastewater Assets, and each agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the other against any and all claims of real estate brokers, finders or similar agents claiming to have been engaged by the indemnifying party, for commissions or claims for similar fees incurred in any action, suit, proceeding or claim arising out of or in connection with the transaction contemplated by this Agreement. The indemnities in this Section 9.2 shall survive Closing or the termination of this Agreement.
 - 9.3 Closing Costs. Closing costs shall be paid as follows:
- a. Seller shall pay the following costs: all costs of releasing any existing deeds of trust; mechanic's liens and similar type encumbrances affecting the Wastewater Assets; the cost for preparation of any deeds and bills of sale; one-half of the state documentary stamps

and surtaxes in connection with recordation of the deed; Seller's attorney's fees and costs; provided, however, Buyer shall contribute \$3,000.00 toward Seller's attorneys' fees; and any other costs customarily paid by sellers of real property in northeastern North Carolina.

- 2. Buyer shall pay the following costs: the title examination fees and premiums; all expenses incident to any loan obtained by Buyer; preparation of any loan documents and the recording fees charged for recordation of such loan documents; one-half of the state documentary stamps and surtaxes in connection with recordation of the deed; Buyer's attorney's fees and costs; \$3,000 toward Seller's attorneys' fees; the cost of any title insurance policy and endorsements required by Buyer or Buyer's lender; any other closing costs otherwise provided for herein; and any other costs customarily paid by purchasers of real property in northeastern North Carolina.
- Prorations. Seller and Buyer shall prorate taxes for the Wastewater System on a 9.4. calendar year basis as of the Closing Date, with such prorations to include, but not be limited to, property taxes, real estate taxes, taxes imposed by special assessment or assessments by a Governmental Authority that are assessed or charged in the calendar year in which Closing occurs. Seller shall be responsible for all such taxes for any calendar year prior to the calendar year of Closing. All monthly wastewater treatment fees shall be prorated between Seller and Buyer as of the Closing Date to the extent collected by Seller. Any fees received from a customer after Closing shall be applied as follows: (a) first to the fees owing for the month in which Closing occurred, (b) next to pay fees then due and payable for any month(s) following the month in which Closing occurred, and (c) last, to fees owing for any month(s) prior to the month in which Closing occurred, until the customer is current. For a period of 180 days following Closing, Buyer shall bill customers for fees accrued prior to Closing and shall use reasonable efforts to collect from customers any fees owing with respect to the period prior to Closing. To the extent any such fees are collected, subject to (a), (b) and (c) above, such amounts, net of reasonable costs of collection, shall be paid to Seller no later than 30 days following the date such amounts were received by Buyer. Buyer shall not be obligated to expend any funds or to commence legal proceedings to collect any delinquent fccs. All other income, operating expenses and utility charges shall be prorated between Seller and Buyer as of the Closing Date. Buyer's obligation under this Section 9.4 shall survive Closing.

ARTICLE X Title Insurance

10.1. <u>Title Insurance and Surveys for Real Property and Easements</u>. Buyer, at Buyer's cost, has the right to obtain (a) a title insurance commitment covering the tracts for the Wastewater Treatment Plant to insure marketable fee simple or easement title, free and clear of any and all liens and encumbrances, and (b) a plot plan of each such tract to be conveyed in fee showing improvements, surveyed and sealed by a registered surveyor. Buyer shall pay all costs in connection therewith, including the title insurance premiums in connection with the issuance of an owner's policy of title insurance at Closing.

ARTICLE XI General Provisions

- 11.1. <u>Customer Service Deposits</u>. Seller represents and warrants to Buyer that Seller has not collected any customer service deposits. In the event that Seller has collected any customer service deposits, Seller shall refund the deposits to the customers from whom the deposits were collected immediately following the Closing.
- 11.2. Environmental Matters. During the period that Seller has owned the real property that constitutes part of the Wastewater System, Seller has not introduced to the real property any hazardous waste substances. Further, Seller has no knowledge of any such hazardous waste substance being introduced to the real property prior to the time Seller acquired the real property. For purposes on this paragraph, the definition of the term "hazardous substance" shall be that set out in Section 101(4) of the Federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, except that for purposes of this Agreement, the term also shall include (i) petroleum (crude oil) and natural gas (whether existing as a gas or a liquid), and (ii) any substance defined as hazardous or toxic by any state or local regulatory agency having jurisdiction over the operations of Seller. The term hazardous substance herein shall not include the drinking wastewater additives such as chlorine, caustic soda, soda ash and phosphates.
- 11.3. <u>Prepaid Tap Fccs, Advances for Construction</u>. Except as otherwise disclosed on <u>Schedule 9</u>, Seller has not received any prepaid tap fees or advances for construction or CIAC for which construction has not been completed.
- 11.4. <u>Binding Upon Successors and Assigns</u>. This agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of Buyer and Seller, and the successors and permitted assigns of each. Intention to assign any rights herein by either party, EXCEPT for the rights to the construction and operation of the additional treatment and discharge capacity, must be approved in writing by the other party prior to any such assignment.
- 11.5. No Third-Party Beneficiary Rights. Nothing expressed or referred to in this Agreement will be construed to give any person other than the Parties any legal or equitable right, remedy or claim under or with respect to this Agreement or any provision of this Agreement, except as to a successor or permitted assignee of Seller and Buyer, as provided in Section 11.4. a. of this Agreement.
- 11.6. No Assumption of Liabilities. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Agreement to the contrary, except as expressly provided in this Agreement, Buyer shall not assume or otherwise be liable for any liabilities, obligations or commitments of Seller, with the exception of (a) the assumption by Buyer from Seller of the obligations associated with the Permit after the Closing, (b) the obligation to provide wastewater service to the Subdivision, the Clubhouse and the School after the CPCN is transferred to Buyer, and (c) the obligations under the Golf Course Agreement.

- 11.7. Force Majeure. Except as provided for in this Agreement and except for the payment of monetary obligations, neither Party to this Agreement shall be liable to the other for failure, default or delay in performing any of its obligation hereunder, if such failure, default or delay is caused by strikes or other labor problems, by forces of nature, unavoidable accident, fire, acts of the public enemy, acts or failure to act, decisions or orders or regulations of any governmental or military body or agency, office or commission, delays in receipt of materials, or any other cause, whether of similar or dissimilar nature, not within the control of the Party affected and which, by the exercise of due diligence such Party is unable to prevent or overcome, except as otherwise provided for herein. Should any of the foregoing events occur, the Parties hereto agree to proceed with diligence to do what is reasonable and necessary so that each Party may perform its obligations under this Agreement.
- 11.8 <u>Enforcement of Agreement</u>. The failure of either Party hereto to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement or the waiver thereof in any instance by either Party shall not be construed as a general waiver or relinquishment on its part of any such provisions, but the same shall, nevertheless, be and remain in full force and effect.
- 11.9. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required to be made hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be given upon the earlier to occur of (a) actual receipt, (b) the third business day after mailing, (c) one business day after deposit with a national overnight courier, addressed to the appropriate party as follows:

- 11.10. <u>Incorporation of Schedules</u>. The Schedules to this Agreement are made a part hereof and are hereby incorporated in full by reference.
- 11.11. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of North Carolina.
- 11.12. <u>Representations</u>, <u>Warranties and Obligations Survive Closing</u>. The representations, warranties, and obligations contained herein shall survive, and continue in effect after the Closing.
- 11.13. Entire Agreement. This Agreement sets forth the complete understanding between Seller and Buyer and any amendments hereto, to be effective, must be made in writing.
- 11.14. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.
- 11.15. <u>Modifications in Writing</u>. This Agreement shall not be modified, amended, or changed in any respect except in writing, duly signed by each Party, and each Party hereby waives any right to amend the Agreement in any other way.
- 11.16. Consent to Jurisdiction. The Parties agree that the Superior Court Division of the North Carolina General Court of Justice shall have exclusive jurisdiction over this Agreement and any controversies arising out of, relating to, or referring to this Agreement, the formation of this Agreement, and actions undertaken by the Parties hereto as a result of this Agreement. Each of the Parties hereto expressly and irrevocably consents to the personal jurisdiction of such state courts, agrees to accept service of process by mail, and expressly waives any jurisdictional or venue defenses otherwise available.
- 11.17 Exclusive Arbitration of Claims for Attorney's Fees. The parties hereto agree that if the court in any action does not award attorney's fees and costs to the prevailing party, or if the court awards such fees and costs but does not enter a judgment determining the amount thereof, any award or adjudication of any claim for attorney's fees under this Agreement arising from any court proceeding involving any claims, disputes, or matters arising out of, or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof between the parties to this Agreement (hereinafter collectively a "Underlying Claim"), shall be decided exclusively by binding arbitration conducted before a single arbitrator pursuant to this provision. The party in whose favor judgment was entered by the court adjudicating the Underlying Claim shall be the prevailing party for the purposes of arbitration of a party's claim for attorney's fees and any question or dispute concerning a party's entitlement to recover attorney's fees shall be decided exclusively by the arbitrator as part of the arbitration. Within thirty (30) days after entry of a final order on the Underlying Claim and from which no

appeal is available or been timely taken, either party to this Agreement which believes it is entitled to an award of attorney's fees under the terms of this Agreement shall submit a written demand for arbitration of such claim for attorney's fees to the American Arbitration Association and to the other party. If the parties cannot agree on an arbitrator within fifteen (15) days after the demand for arbitration is submitted, then the arbitrator shall be determined by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with the Rules as defined herein below. Arbitration shall be conducted at the office of the arbitrator or at such other location as the parties shall mutually agree, and unless the arbitrator determines good cause exists to delay the arbitration proceedings, such proceedings shall take place not more than ninety (90) days from the date the arbitrator is selected. The arbitrator shall endeavor to issue its decision on the merits of the claim for attorney's fees within thirty (30) days following a hearing and receipt of all the evidence. Except as otherwise provided herein, the arbitration shall conform, insofar as practicable, to the Commercial Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association (the "Rules") then in effect. Costs of the arbitration, including compensation for the arbitrator, shall initially be borne equally by the parties, however, such costs including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses incurred in connection with the arbitration shall be included in any attorney's fee award rendered by the arbitrator. The parties agree that any attorney's fees award in the arbitration may be reduced to judgment in any appropriate court. If either party fails to proceed with arbitration or defaults in their obligations to arbitrate any claim for attorney's fees arising under this Agreement, it shall not prevent the other party from proceeding with such arbitration and the party who fails to proceed with arbitration shall be bound by the arbitration. This arbitration provision shall survive any closing, breach or termination of this Agreement and shall not be superseded or otherwise rendered unenforceable by application of the doctrine of merger.

11.18 Further Assurances. The parties hereto agree that they will, at any time and from time to time after the date hereof (including, but not limited to, at any time after the Closing), upon request of the other, do, execute, acknowledge and deliver, or will cause to be done, executed, acknowledged and delivered, at no additional cost or liability to such party, all such further acts and assurances as may be reasonably required to consummate the transaction as contemplated by this Agreement.

CONTRACT ADDENDUM AND AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACT ADDENDUM AND AGREEMENT ("Addendum"), made as of the 20 TH day of June, 1997, by and between TATE TERRACE REALTY INVESTORS, INC., A Virginia Corporation ("Tate"), and MILL RUN GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB, INC., a North Carolina Corporation, ("Mill Run").

WHEREAS, Tate and Jernigan Enterprises, a North Carolina General Partnership, entered into a contract and agreement dated October 21, 1996, more particularly described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, which set forth the general obligation of the parties for the conveyance and development of property located in Moyock, Currituck County, North Carolina, as a residential subdivision and eighteen hole golf course; and

WHEREAS, Jernigan Enterprises has assigned all of its right, title, interest and obligations under the Contract and Agreement dated October 21, 1996, (the Contract and Agreement dated October 21,1996, as amended hereby, is hereinafter referred to as the "Contract"), to Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc. with the consent of Tate; and

WHEREAS, inadvertently by typographical error, Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc. was erroneously identified as Tate Terrace Realty, Inc., and it is the desire of the parties to correct said error through this Addendum; and

WHEREAS, it is now the desire and intent of the parties to record this Addendum to provide greater specificity to those obligations of the parties set forth in the Contract while preserving the full force and effect of the provisions set forth in the Contract.

WHEREAS, pursuant to that certain deed of even date to be recorded contemporaneously herewith in the Office of the Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina, Tate has conveyed the real property and improvements described therein and more particularly described in Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference to Mill Run (the "Golf Course Property"); and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of Mill Run to develop that property conveyed as described in Exhibit B as a regulation eighteen hole, par 72 semi-private golf course facility, which facility will

include a club house, pro shop, driving range, practice putting green, parking and related support facilities, (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Golf Course"),

WHEREAS, Tate is the owner of real property and the improvements thereon more particularly described in Exhibit C, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Subdivision Property"); and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to establish certain easements and agreements relating to the properties of both parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETH THIS AGREEMENT:

That for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and 00/100 Dollars (\$10.00) cash in hand paid and the mutual premises contained herein together with that consideration set forth in the Contract and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto and hereby agree to the correction of the inadvertent typographical error and do hereby affirm and acknowledge the obligations of Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc. and Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc. in the Contract and furthermore agree to the addition and recordation of this Addendum as follows:

Access Easements.

- Tate hereby agrees and conveys unto Mill Run and its successors, assigns, occupants, invitees, licensees, lessees and guests, (the "Mill Run Parties") a perpetual non-exclusive easement and right of use for all pedestrian and vehicular access, ingress, egress and passage on, over and across any public and/or private roadways, streets and other passageways (the "Roads") which from time to time are constructed or to be constructed on the Subdivision Property owned by Tate (hereinafter referred to as "Subdivision Property") for the purpose of allowing the Mill Run Parties access, ingress, egress and passage to the Golf Course Property; provided, however, it is expressly acknowledged and agreed that the foregoing easement shall not include the right for the Mill Run Parties to cause any motor vehicles to park or remain on the Subdivision Property and shall not include any right of access, ingress, egress and passage over any driveway, sidewalks or other passageways which are installed and intended for the exclusive use of any residential lot or lots which are created from all or any portion of the Subdivision Property. The parties hereto agree that Tate may change the location and configuration of the Roads within the Subdivision Property as it deems necessary in its sole discretion.
- B. Mill Run hereby grants and conveys unto Tate and its successors, assigns, occupants, invitees, licensees, lessees and guests (the "Tate Parties") a perpetual non-exclusive easement and right of use for pedestrian and vehicular access, ingress, egress

and passage on, over and across any and all public and/or private roadways or streets which from time to time are constructed on the Golf Course Property for the purpose of access, ingress, egress and passage to the Subdivision Property; provided, however, it is expressly acknowledged and agreed that the foregoing easement shall not include the right for the Tate Parties to park any motor vehicles on the Golf Course Property or to use any golf cart paths or passageways created for the use and benefit of the Golf Course and its patrons.

Drainage Easements.

A. By the execution of this Addendum, Tate agrees to establish certain drainage easements to be located along the lot lines of its single family residential Lots to be created in connection with the development of the Subdivision Property. The drainage easements shall be created for the benefit of Tate and its successors and assigns (including, but not limited to, the owners of the Lots) and also for the benefit of Mill Run and its successors and assigns.

B. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run hereby grants such drainage easements across the Golf Course Property as are necessary for Tate's development of its Subdivision Property. The parties acknowledge that the plans and specifications for the development of the Golf Course Property and Subdivision Property ("the Plans") have not been completed and agree to revise this Addendum and mutually agree in good faith as to the specific location of such drainage easements across the Golf Course Property to be created for the benefit of Tate and the Subdivision Property; provided, however, that no such easements granted hereunder be established in locations which unduly interfere with the operation of the Golf Course Property.

Utility Easements.

By the execution of this Addendum, Tate agrees to establish certain utility easements in favor of Mill Run and its successors and assigns for the purpose laying, constructing, maintaining, repairing, operating and replacing underground electric, gas, water, telephone, cable television, storm water, sanitary, sewer and other utility facilities (the "Facilities") which are necessary and/or required to service the Golf Course Property. The utility easements shall not be in excess of twenty feet (20') in width and shall be located along the lot lines of the Lots within the Subdivision Property, and created for the benefit of the owners of the Lots, and also for the benefit of Mill Run and its successors and assigns. No Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall be constructed above the surface of the Subdivision Property other than manhole covers, electric transformers and similar equipment. The Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall not unduly interfere with the construction of any improvements constructed or to be constructed on the Subdivision Property.

- By the execution this Addendum, Mill Run hereby grants such utility easements over the Golf Course Property in favor of Tate and its successors and assigns as are necessary for Tate's development of the Subdivision Property for the purpose of laying, constructing, maintaining, repairing, operating and replacing underground Facilities which are necessary and/or required to service the Subdivision Property. When the Plans have been completed and approved by Currituck County and any other authorities having jurisdiction, Mill Run and Tate shall revise this Addendum and mutually agree in good faith as to the location of those utility easements across the Golf Course Property; provided, however, no such utility easements shall be established in locations which unduly interfere with the operation of the Golf No Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall be constructed above the surface of the Golf Course Property other than manhole covers, electric transformers and similar equipment. The Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall not unduly interfere with the construction of any improvements constructed or to be constructed on the Golf Course Property.
- C. By the execution of this Addendum, Tate agrees to provide Mill Run and its successors and assigns with access for connection to any and all water and sewer lines, mains, pipes, laterals and systems constructed within the bounds of the Property upon their completion. Although Mill Run shall not be responsible for any connection fees, it shall be responsible for any and all fees and assessments associated with the water and sewer lines, mains, pipes, laterals and systems constructed within the bounds of the Subdivision Property. Mill Run shall be responsible for a payment of customary monthly usage charges for water and sewer services which are attributable to the outflow for no more than ten (10) toilets located within the Clubhouse on the Golf Course Property. The Usage Charge shall be due and payable upon billing by Tate to Mill Run.

4. <u>Dedication of Easements</u>.

Each of the parties to this Addendum shall have the right to dedicate its rights and obligations with respect to any of the drainage and utility easements created herein to a Governmental Authority and/or utility company, as the case may be, and upon such dedication, the party granting such dedication shall be relieved from its obligations with respect to such easement.

5. Waste Water Treatment Facility/Irrigation System.

A. Tate agrees to construct, manage and maintain on the Subdivision Property a waste water treatment facility, including, but not limited to, a waste water treatment plant, five-day holding pond and waste water irrigation pond (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Facility"). Tate shall be responsible for the costs of construction, management and maintenance of this Facility.

- B. Tate Terrace hereby grants and conveys to Mill Run and its successors and assigns a non-exclusive easement of access, ingress, egress and passage over the Roads constructed within the Subdivision Property by the most direct route for access to the waste water irrigation pond located or to be located between holes 9 and 18 of the Golf Course for removal of water and material used in construction and daily operation of the Golf Course.
- C. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run agrees, on behalf of itself and its successors and assigns, to construct, install, operate, maintain and replace an irrigation system (the "Irrigation System") which shall service the Golf Course Property and discharge the "Effluent", as hereafter defined. The parties have agreed that Mill Run shall be responsible for the costs of the construction, installation, operation and maintenance of an Irrigation System suitable for golf course irrigation and that the additional costs, over and above that which is necessary for irrigation of the Golf Course Property to handle the discharge of Effluent through design change or sprinkler head upgrade, etc., shall be borne by Tate. To provide assurance that Mill Run shall construct, install, operate, maintain and replace, if necessary, the irrigation system, Mill Run agrees to authorize its escrow agent to strictly control the disbursement of monetary draws for the disbursement of construction proceeds, for those irrigation funds (the "Irrigation Funds") necessary for completion of the Irrigation System. It is agreed that said funds shall be retained in an escrow account and that John A. Mauney, Attorney at Law (the "Escrow Agent") shall provide certification to Tate of the completion of that irrigation system construction. A copy of the plans relating to construction of the Irrigation System (the "Irrigation Plans") shall be submitted to Tate. Mill Run shall provide Tate with an assignment in form and content acceptable to Tate of all rights under the Irrigation Plans and the construction contract (the "Irrigation Contract") relating to the construction of the Irrigation System so that in the event of default by Mill Run, Tate can succeed to the rights of Mill Run under the Irrigation Plans and the Irrigation Contract for the completion of the construction of the Irrigation System.
- D. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run agrees to accept all waste water effluent generated through the Facility, but only from the Subdivision Property and those school facilities which are to be constructed on a portion of the property (the "Effluent") and to dispose of this effluent through its irrigation system onto the Golf Course Property in consideration for its receipt of a fee (the "Fee") of \$200.00 per month. After the seventh (7th) year from the date hereof and for each year thereafter the monthly Fee shall be the product obtained by multiplying \$200.00 by a fraction, the numerator of which is the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (1982 84 = 100) U.S. City Average, All Items, published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (CPI-U) (or such comparable index as may be utilized in substitution for or as the successor to the stated Consumer Price Index) for the first calendar month of

each such year and the denominator of which is the CPI-U for the first full calendar month of the sixth (6th) year from the date hereof. This continuing obligation is limited to a maximum outflow of 350,000 gallons per day as established by the provisions of that certain document entitled "Site Evaluation for Water Re-use of Reclaimed Water, Mill Run Golf Course, Currituck County, North Carolina, dated May 20, 1997, prepared by Edward Andrews & Associates, P.C., provided, however, the parties hereto agree that the outflow of 350,000 gallons may be exceeded provided that the Golf Course can accommodate such excess Effluent and dispose of it through the Irrigation System. In the event of the failure of Mill Run to carry out its obligations outlined in this paragraph, Tate and its successors and assigns shall have the right to pursue the remedies of specific performance before a court of proper jurisdiction and to collect costs and expenses including reasonable attorney fees incurred in connection with said remedy which shall be due and payable by Mill Run. In the event of default by Mill Run under this or other paragraphs pertaining to the continued operation of the Golf Course and/or the Irrigation System, Tate and its successors and assigns shall have the right to provide written notice to the Escrow Agent of the default by Mill Run together with an itemization of all costs and expenses incurred by Tate in curing such default. Upon receipt of the written notice and cost itemization, Escrow Agent shall be entitled, without further obligation or inquiry, to disburse to Tate all or any portion of the Irrigation Funds remaining necessary to reimburse Tate for the expenses of curing the default by Mill Additionally, in the event of default by Mill Run under this paragraph or the failure of Mill Run or its successors and assigns to continue operation of the Golf Course, Tate and its successors and assigns shall have the right of access, ingress, egress and passage over the Golf Course Property as may be necessary to access irrigation lines and pumping stations for maintenance, repair and operation of the Irrigation System for the disposal of the Effluent.

In the event Mill Run fails to carry out the obligations outlined in paragraph D above with respect to the Irrigation Systems, in addition to any other rights provided for herein and any other rights and remedies available at law or in equity, Tate shall have the right to file a notice of lien (the "Notice of Lien") in the Clerk's Office, which Notice of Lien shall be a lien against the Golf Course Property for all expenses (the "Expenses") incurred by Tate, together with interest thereon from the date the Expenses were incurred until paid equal to the "Prime Rate", as hereinafter defined, plus two percent (2.0 %) per annum. in this subparagraph, the term "Prime Rate" shall be defined as the variable rate of interest publicly announced by NationsBank, N.A., from time to time to be the prime rate it uses as a standard in determining actual rates of interest charged to borrowers, whether or not such rate is published. The Notice of Lien shall be junior and subordinate to the lien of any previously recorded deed of trust affecting the Golf Course Property.

- 6. Extraction Easement. Mill Run hereby grants and conveys to Tate and its successors and assigns, a non-exclusive easement to extract materials from those retention ponds located on the Golf Course Property which abut the Subdivision Property for so long as there is no resulting change in the shape of course greens, tees, or sand traps.
- 7. Monitoring Wells. Mill Run hereby grants and conveys to Tate and its successors and assigns a perpetual exclusive easement to locate, install, construct, operate, maintain and repair monitoring wells (the "Wells") and all costs and expenses

associated with the location, installation, construction, operation, maintenance and repair of the Wells shall be the responsibility of Tate.

- Clay Replacement. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run agrees, at its own cost and expense, to remove a minimum of fifteen acres of clay ("Clay") located upon the Golf Course Property and replace the Clay with sand of a consistency similar to the sand underlying the removed Clay. The removal of the Clay shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of that certain document entitled "Site Evaluation for Water Re-use of Reclaimed Water, Mill Run Golf Course, Currituck County, North Carolina, dated May 20, 1997, prepared by Edward Andrews & Associates, P.C., and shall be completed on or before completion of the Golf Course. Any cost and expense for removal of additional acreage due to requirements by permits to be obtained from the Division of Water Quality for Waste Water Treatment and Disposal, shall be borne by Tate. Mill Run shall advise Tate of the progress of such work and shall allow Tate to have independent geotechnical engineers or soil scientists or other third parties of Tate's selection (the "Third Parties") to inspect the work and confirm its acceptability. Mill Run shall correct any and all defects reported by Third Parties to conform to the requirements set forth above in the report of Edward Andrews & Associates, P.C. In the event that Mill Run fails to perform its obligations under this paragraph and Tate performs such obligations and incurs costs and expenses in connection therewith, in addition to any other rights provided for herein and any other rights and remedies available at Law and Equity, Tate shall have the right to file a Notice of Lien in the Clerk's Office, which Notice of Lien shall be a lien against the Golf Course Property for the costs and expenses incurred by Tate, together with interest thereon.
- 9. Sign/Maintenance Easement. By the execution of this Addendum Tate agrees at its sole cost and expense to construct and install a monument sign ("the Sign") on the Subdivision Property, which sign shall identify the name of the subdivision and golf course facility. Upon completion of the Sign, Mill Run shall be responsible at its own cost and expense for the maintenance and minor repair of the grounds surrounding said Sign. Tate shall cause the responsibility for the maintenance and minor repair of the Sign, including utilities for lighting of said Sign to be borne

by any home owners association established within the Subdivision Property. Tate hereby grants Mill Run an easement of access, ingress and egress over the Roads of the Subdivision Property constructed or to be constructed on the Subdivision Property for purposes of maintenance and repair of the grounds surrounding said Sign. Upon failure of Mill Run to maintain the grounds surrounding the Sign, as provided for in this paragraph, Tate shall have the right to do so and to recoup all costs and expenses associated from Mill Run.

- 10. Termination of Obligations of Tate. When Tate conveys all Lots comprising the Subdivision Property to developers, builders and/or third-party purchasers, Tate shall be released from all obligations hereunder, and such obligations shall be the responsibility of the successors and assigns of Tate.

- 17. Appurtenant to Properties. The easements, rights, privileges, obligations and covenants set forth herein shall be appurtenant to, and shall run with the title to the Subdivision Property and the Golf Course Property, and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their successors and assigns.
- 18. Successors and Assigns. Except as otherwise provided for herein, this Addendum shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors, heirs, legal representatives and assigns.

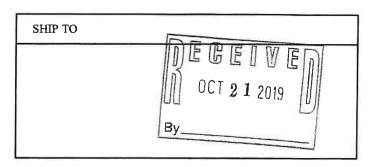

CONTRACT ADDENDUM AND AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACT ADDENDUM AND AGREEMENT ("Addendum"), made as of 20 TH day of June, 1997, by and between TATE TERRACE REALTY INVESTORS, INC., A Virginia Corporation ("Tate"), and MILL RUN GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB, INC., a North Carolina Corporation, ("Mill Run").

WHEREAS, Tate and Jernigan Enterprises, a North Carolina General Partnership, entered into a contract and agreement dated October 21, 1996, more particularly described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, which set forth the general obligation of the parties for the conveyance and development of property located in Moyock, Currituck County, North Carolina, as a residential subdivision and eighteen hole golf course; and

WHEREAS, Jernigan Enterprises has assigned all of its right, title, interest and obligations under the Contract and Agreement dated October 21, 1996, (the Contract and Agreement dated October 21,1996, as amended hereby, is hereinafter referred to as the "Contract"), to Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc. with the consent of Tate; and

WHEREAS, inadvertently by typographical error, Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc. was erroneously identified as Tate Terrace Realty, Inc., and it is the desire of the parties to correct said error through this Addendum; and

WHEREAS, it is now the desire and intent of the parties to record this Addendum to provide greater specificity to those obligations of the parties set forth in the Contract while preserving the full force and effect of the provisions set forth in the Contract.

WHEREAS, pursuant to that certain deed of even date to be recorded contemporaneously herewith in the Office of the Register of Deeds of Currituck County, North Carolina, Tate has conveyed the real property and improvements described therein and more particularly described in Exhibit B, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference to Mill Run (the "Golf Course Property"); and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of Mill Run to develop that property conveyed as described in Exhibit B as a regulation eighteen hole, par 72 semi-private golf course facility, which facility will

include a club house, pro shop, driving range, practice putting green, parking and related support facilities, (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Golf Course"),

WHEREAS, Tate is the owner of real property and the improvements thereon more particularly described in Exhibit C, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Subdivision Property"); and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to establish certain easements and agreements relating to the properties of both parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETE THIS AGREEMENT:

That for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and 00/100 Dollars (\$10.00) cash in hand paid and the mutual premises contained herein together with that consideration set forth in the Contract and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto and hereby agree to the correction of the inadvertent typographical error and do hereby affirm and acknowledge the obligations of Tate Terrace Realty Investors, Inc. and Mill Run Golf and Country Club, Inc. in the Contract and furthermore agree to the addition and recordation of this Addendum as follows:

Access Easements.

- A. Tate hereby agrees and conveys unto Mill Run and its successors, assigns, occupants, invitees, licensees, lessees and guests, (the "Mill Run Parties") a perpetual non-exclusive easement and right of use for all pedestrian and vehicular access, ingress, egress and passage on, over and across any public and/or private roadways, streets and other passageways (the "Roads") which from time to time are constructed or to be constructed on the Subdivision Property owned by Tate (hereinafter referred to as "Subdivision Property") for the purpose of allowing the Mill Run Parties access, ingress, egress and passage to the Golf Course Property; provided, however, it is expressly acknowledged and agreed that the foregoing easement shall not include the right for the Mill Run Parties to cause any motor vehicles to park or remain on the Subdivision Property and shall not include any right of access, ingress, egress and passage over any driveway, sidewalks or other passageways which are installed and intended for the exclusive use of any residential lot or lots which are created from all or any portion of the Subdivision Property. The parties hereto agree that Tate may change the location and configuration of the Roads within the Subdivision Property as it deems necessary in its sole discretion.
- B. Mill Run hereby grants and conveys unto Tate and its successors, assigns, occupants, invitees, licensees, lessees and guests (the "Tate Parties") a perpetual non-exclusive easement and right of use for pedestrian and vehicular access, ingress, egress

and passage on, over and across any and all public and/or private roadways or streets which from time to time are constructed on the Golf Course Property for the purpose of access, ingress, egress and passage to the Subdivision Property; provided, however, it is expressly acknowledged and agreed that the foregoing easement shall not include the right for the Tate Parties to park any motor vehicles on the Golf Course Property or to use any golf cart paths or passageways created for the use and benefit of the Golf Course and its patrons.

2. Drainage Easements.

- A. By the execution of this Addendum, Tate agrees to establish certain drainage easements to be located along the lot lines of its single family residential Lots to be created in connection with the development of the Subdivision Property. The drainage easements shall be created for the benefit of Tate and its successors and assigns (including, but not limited to, the owners of the Lots) and also for the benefit of Mill Run and its successors and assigns.
- B. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run hereby grants such drainage easements across the Golf Course Property as are necessary for Tate's development of its Subdivision Property. The parties acknowledge that the plans and specifications for the development of the Golf Course Property and Subdivision Property ("the Plans") have not been completed and agree to revise this Addendum and mutually agree in good faith as to the specific location of such drainage easements across the Golf Course Property to be created for the benefit of Tate and the Subdivision Property; provided, however, that no such easements granted hereunder be established in locations which unduly interfere with the operation of the Golf Course Property.

Utility Easements.

By the execution of this Addendum, Tate agrees to establish certain utility easements in favor of Mill Run and its successors and assigns for the purpose laying, constructing, maintaining, repairing, operating and replacing underground electric, gas, water, telephone, cable television, storm water, sanitary, sewer and other utility facilities (the "Facilities") which are necessary and/or required to service the Golf Course Property. The utility easements shall not be in excess of twenty feet (20') in width and shall be located along the lot lines of the Lots within the Subdivision Property, and created for the benefit of the owners of the Lots, and also for the benefit of Mill Run and its successors and assigns. No Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall be constructed above the surface of the Subdivision Property other than manhole covers, electric transformers and similar equipment. The Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall not unduly interfere with the construction of any improvements constructed or to be constructed on the Subdivision Property.

- B. By the execution this Addendum, Mill Run hereby grants such utility easements over the Golf Course Property in favor of Tate and its successors and assigns as are necessary for Tate's development of the Subdivision Property for the purpose of laying, constructing, maintaining, repairing, operating and replacing underground Facilities which are necessary and/or required to service the Subdivision Property. When the Plans have been completed and approved by Currituck County and any other authorities having jurisdiction, Mill Run and Tate shall revise this Addendum and mutually agree in good faith as to the location of those utility easements across the Golf Course Property; provided, however, no such utility easements shall be established in locations which unduly interfere with the operation of the Golf Course. No Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall be constructed above the surface of the Golf Course Property other than manhole covers, electric transformers and similar equipment. The Facilities constructed pursuant to the utility easements granted herein shall not unduly interfere with the constructed or to be constructed on the Golf Course Property.
- C. By the execution of this Addendum, Tate agrees to provide Mill Run and its successors and assigns with access for connection to any and all water and sewer lines, mains, pipes, laterals and systems constructed within the bounds of the Property upon their completion. Although Mill Run shall not be responsible for any connection fees, it shall be responsible for any and all fees and assessments associated with the water and sewer lines, mains, pipes, laterals and systems constructed within the bounds of the Subdivision Property. Mill Run shall be responsible for a payment of customary monthly usage charges for water and sewer services which are attributable to the outflow for no more than ten (10) toilets located within the Clubhouse on the Golf Course Property. The Usage Charge shall be due and payable upon billing by Tate to Mill Run.

Dedication of Easements.

Each of the parties to this Addendum shall have the right to dedicate its rights and obligations with respect to any of the drainage and utility easements created herein to a Governmental Authority and/or utility company, as the case may be, and upon such dedication, the party granting such dedication shall be relieved from its obligations with respect to such easement.

5. Waste Water Treatment Facility/Irrigation System.

A. Tate agrees to construct, manage and maintain on the Subdivision Property a waste water treatment facility, including, but not limited to, a waste water treatment plant, five-day holding pond and waste water irrigation pond (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Facility"). Tate shall be responsible for the costs of construction, management and maintenance of this Facility.

- B. Tate Terrace hereby grants and conveys to Mill Run and its successors and assigns a non-exclusive easement of access, ingress, egress and passage over the Roads constructed within the Subdivision Property by the most direct route for access to the waste water irrigation pond located or to be located between holes 9 and 18 of the Golf Course for removal of water and material used in construction and daily operation of the Golf Course.
- By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run agrees, on behalf of itself and its successors and assigns, to construct, install, operate, maintain and replace an irrigation system (the "Irrigation System") which shall service the Golf Course Property and discharge the "Effluent", as hereafter defined. The parties have agreed that Mill Run shall be responsible for the costs of the construction, installation, operation and maintenance of an Irrigation System suitable for golf course irrigation and that the additional costs, over and above that which is necessary for irrigation of the Golf Course Property to handle the discharge of Effluent through design change or sprinkler head upgrade, etc., shall be borne by Tate. To provide assurance that Mill Run shall construct, install, operate, maintain and replace, if necessary, the irrigation system, Mill Run agrees to authorize its escrow agent to strictly control the disbursement of monetary draws for the disbursement of construction proceeds, for those irrigation funds (the "Irrigation Funds") necessary for completion of the Irrigation System. It is agreed that said funds shall be retained in an escrow account and that John A. Mauney, Attorney at Law (the "Escrow Agent") shall provide certification to Tate of completion of that irrigation system construction. A copy of the plans relating to construction of the Irrigation System (the "Irrigation Plans") shall be submitted to Tate. Mill Run shall provide Tate with an assignment in form and content acceptable to Tate of all rights under the Irrigation Plans and the construction contract (the "Irrigation Contract") relating to the construction of the Irrigation System so that in the event of default by Mill Run, Tate can succeed to the rights of Mill Run under the Irrigation Plans and the Irrigation Contract for the completion of the construction of the Irrigation System.
- D. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run agrees to accept all waste water effluent generated through the Facility, but only from the Subdivision Property and those school facilities which are to be constructed on a portion of the property (the "Effluent") and to dispose of this effluent through its irrigation system onto the Golf Course Property in consideration for its receipt of a fee (the "Fee") of \$200.00 per month. After the seventh (7th) year from the date hereof and for each year thereafter the monthly Fee shall be the product obtained by multiplying \$200.00 by a fraction, the numerator of which is the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (1982 84 = 100) U.S. City Average, All Items, published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (CPI-U) (or such comparable index as may be utilized in substitution for or as the successor to the stated Consumer Price Index) for the first calendar month of

each such year and the denominator of which is the CPI-U for the first full calendar month of the sixth (6th) year from the date hereof. This continuing obligation is limited to a maximum outflow of 350,000 gallons per day as established by the provisions of that certain document entitled "Site Evaluation for Water Re-use of Reclaimed Water, Mill Run Golf Course, Currituck County, North Carolina, dated May 20, 1997, prepared by Edward Andrews & Associates, P.C., provided, however, the parties hereto agree that the outflow of 350,000 gallons may be exceeded provided that the Golf Course can accommodate such excess Effluent and dispose of it through the Irrigation System. In the event of the failure of Mill Run to carry out its obligations outlined in this paragraph, Tate and its successors and assigns shall have the right to pursue the remedies of specific performance before a court jurisdiction and to collect costs and expenses including reasonable attorney fees incurred in connection with said remedy which shall be due and payable by Mill Run. In the event of default by Mill Run under this or other paragraphs pertaining to the continued operation of the Golf Course and/or the Irrigation System, Tate and its successors and assigns shall have the right to provide written notice to the Escrow Agent of the default by Mill Run together with an itemization of all costs and expenses incurred by Tate in curing Upon receipt of the written notice and cost such default. itemization, Escrow Agent shall be entitled, without further obligation or inquiry, to disburse to Tate all or any portion of the Irrigation Funds remaining necessary to reimburse Tate for the costs and expenses of curing the default by Mill Run. Additionally, in the event of default by Mill Run under this paragraph or the failure of Mill Run or its successors and assigns to continue operation of the Golf Course, Tate and its successors and assigns shall have the right of access, ingress, egress and passage over the Golf Course Property as may be necessary to access irrigation lines and pumping stations for maintenance, repair and operation of the Irrigation System for the disposal of the Effluent.

In the event Mill Run fails to carry out the obligations outlined in paragraph D above with respect to the Irrigation Systems, in addition to any other rights provided for herein and any other rights and remedies available at law or in equity, Tate shall have the right to file a notice of lien (the "Notice of Lien") in the Clerk's Office, which Notice of Lien shall be a lien against the Golf Course Property for all expenses (the "Expenses") incurred by Tate, together with interest thereon from the date the Expenses were incurred until paid equal to the "Prime Rate", as hereinafter defined, plus two percent (2.0 %) per annum. As used in this subparagraph, the term "Prime Rate" shall be defined as the variable rate of interest publicly announced by NationsBank, N.A., from time to time to be the prime rate it uses as a standard in determining actual rates of interest charged to borrowers, whether or not such rate is published. The Notice of Lien shall be junior and subordinate to the lien of any previously recorded deed of trust affecting the Golf Course Property.

- 6. Extraction Easement. Mill Run hereby grants and conveys to Tate and its successors and assigns, a non-exclusive easement to extract materials from those retention ponds located on the Golf Course Property which abut the Subdivision Property for so long as there is no resulting change in the shape of course greens, tees, or sand traps.
- 7. Monitoring Wells. Mill Run hereby grants and conveys to Tate and its successors and assigns a perpetual exclusive easement to locate, install, construct, operate, maintain and repair monitoring wells (the "Wells") and all costs and expenses

associated with the location, installation, construction, operation, maintenance and repair of the Wells shall be the responsibility of Tate.

- Clay Replacement. By the execution of this Addendum, Mill Run agrees, at its own cost and expense, to remove a minimum of fifteen acres of clay ("Clay") located upon the Golf Course Property and replace the Clay with sand of a consistency similar to the sand underlying the removed Clay. The removal of the Clay shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of that certain document entitled "Site Evaluation for Water Re-use of Reclaimed Water, Mill Run Golf Course, Currituck County, North Carolina, dated May 20, 1997, prepared by Edward Andrews & Associates, P.C., and shall be completed on or before completion of the Golf Course. Any cost and expense for removal of additional acreage due to requirements by permits to be obtained from the Division of Water Quality for Waste Water Treatment and Disposal, shall be borne by Tate. Mill Run shall advise Tate of the progress of such work and shall allow Tate to have independent geotechnical engineers or soil scientists or other third parties of Tate's selection (the "Third Parties") to inspect the work and confirm its acceptability. Mill Run shall correct any and all defects reported by Third Parties to conform to the requirements set forth above in the report of Edward Andrews & Associates, P.C. In the event that Mill Run fails to perform its obligations under this paragraph and Tate performs such obligations and incurs costs and expenses in connection therewith, in addition to any other rights provided for herein and any other rights and remedies available at Law and Equity, Tate shall have the right to file a Notice of Lien in the Clerk's Office, which Notice of Lien shall be a lien against the Golf Course Property for the costs and expenses incurred by Tate, together with interest thereon.
- 9. Sign/Maintenance Easement. By the execution of this Addendum Tate agrees at its sole cost and expense to construct and install a monument sign ("the Sign") on the Subdivision Property, which sign shall identify the name of the subdivision and golf course facility. Upon completion of the Sign, Mill Run shall be responsible at its own cost and expense for the maintenance and minor repair of the grounds surrounding said Sign. Tate shall cause the responsibility for the maintenance and minor repair of the Sign, including utilities for lighting of said Sign to be borne

by any home owners association established within the Subdivision Property. Tate hereby grants Mill Run an easement of access, ingress and egress over the Roads of the Subdivision Property constructed or to be constructed on the Subdivision Property for purposes of maintenance and repair of the grounds surrounding said Sign. Upon failure of Mill Run to maintain the grounds surrounding the Sign, as provided for in this paragraph, Tate shall have the right to do so and to recoup all costs and expenses associated from Mill Run.

- 10. Termination of Obligations of Tate. When Tate conveys all Lots comprising the Subdivision Property to developers, builders and/or third-party purchasers, Tate shall be released from all obligations hereunder, and such obligations shall be the responsibility of the successors and assigns of Tate.
- 11. Full and Free Use of Easements. The parties hereto shall have the full and free use of the easements and rights provided for herein, for the purposes set forth herein and shall have all rights and privileges reasonably necessary to utilize the same.
- 12. Restoration of Properties. In connection with the exercise of the rights and easements granted herein, each of the parties hereto agrees to restore any portion of the surface of the property of the other party which is disturbed by the exercise of such rights and easements to the condition in which such property existed prior to such activity. In the event any party fails to restore the surface of the property of the other to the condition under which it existed prior to the exercise of such rights and easements the owner of the disturbed property shall be entitled to do so and any and all costs and expenses associated therewith shall be due and payable by the defaulting party.
- No Barriers. In connection with the exercise of the rights and easements granted herein, each of the parties hereto agrees that no barriers, fences or other obstructions of any kind or nature shall be erected upon the properties which would in any manner preclude and/or hinder access to and or use of properties or the easements provided for herein, except for temporary barriers or obstructions reasonably required in connection construction, repair and/or replacement of any improvements from time to time located upon the properties. It is expressly acknowledged and agreed that any temporary barriers or obstructions used in connection with any construction and repair shall in no manner totally prohibit or preclude access to the properties or the use of the access easements created by this Addendum.
- 14. Relocation of Easements. The parties hereto agree that upon the request of any party hereto and as may reasonably be necessary in connection with the development of either the Subdivision Property or Golf Course Property, any of the easements created by this Addendum shall be relocated, provided that such relocation does not interfere with the operation and use of the property upon which the easement is located. Any and all expenses

associated with the relocation of any easement, including but not limited to, attorney's fees and costs and recording fees, shall be paid by the party requesting the relocation. 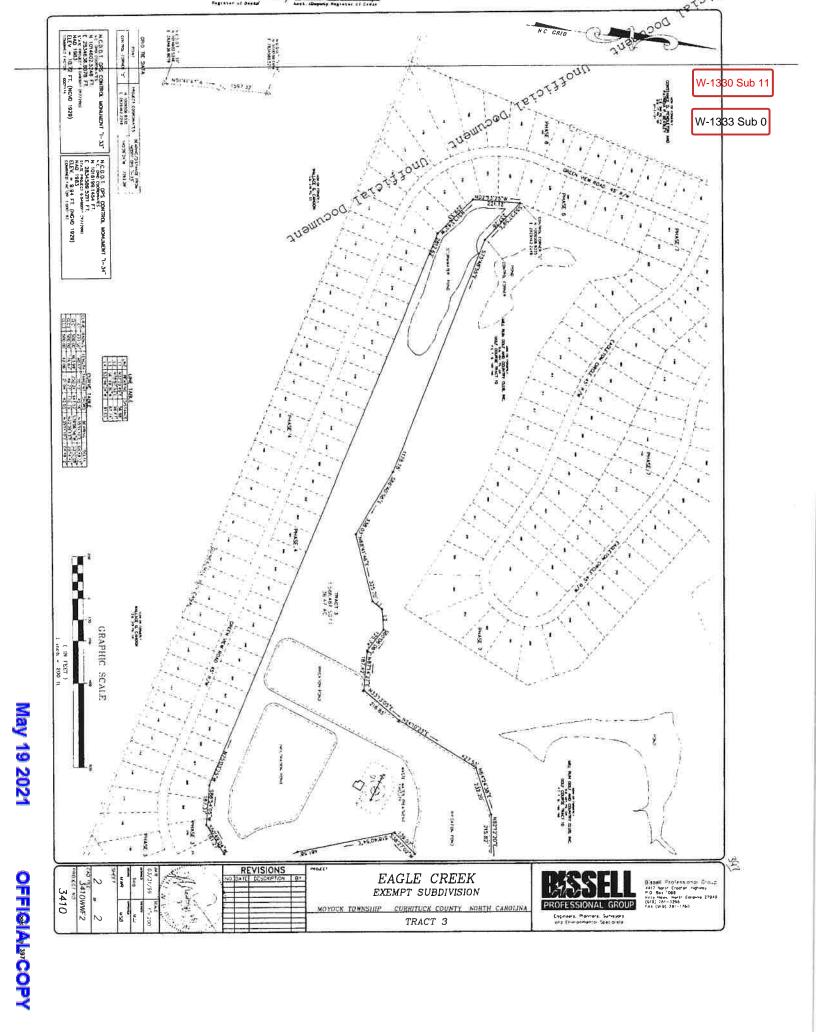

In accordance with your application received May 2nd, 2013, we are forwarding herewith Permit No.WQCS00290, dated May 2, 2013, to Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC for the operation and maintenance of the subject wastewater collection system.

This permit shall be effective from June 1st, 2013 until May 31st, 2021 and shall be subject to the conditions and limitations specified herein. It is your responsibility to thoroughly review this permit. Please pay particular attention to the monitoring and reporting requirements in this permit and any compliance schedules shown in **bold**.

For purposes of permitting, the collection system is considered to be any existing or newly installed system extension up to the wastewater treatment facility property or point of connection with a separately owned sewer system. The collection system is considered all gravity lines, pump stations, force mains, low pressure sewer systems, STEP systems, vacuum systems, etc. and associated piping, valves and appurtenances that help to collect, manage and transport wastewater to a wastewater treatment plant under the Permittee's ownership or maintained and operated by the Permittee through a perpetual legal agreement. Satellite systems are systems tributary to the Permittee's collection system but those collection systems are not owned or maintained by the Permittee. The system description provided on Page 1 of this permit is meant to provide a general idea about the size of the system and may not be all inclusive of the collection system at the time of permit issuance or afterward.

A release of wastewater from the wastewater collection system is referred to herein as a Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO). The evaluation of enforcement options after an SSO will be determined considering the criteria listed in condition I(3)(a) and I(3)(b) of the permit and all other relevant

information available or requested of the Permittee. Compliance with all conditions of the permit as well as all statutes and regulations pertaining to the collection system must be maintained or appropriate enforcement actions may be taken as noted in Condition VI(2).

A reportable SSO is an SSO greater than 1,000 gallons to the ground or an SSO of any amount that reaches surface water (including through ditches, storm drains, etc.) Below is the procedure to use for reporting SSOs to the Division:

- 1. Report by telephone to a Division of Water Quality (DWQ) staff member (not email, facsimile, or voicemail) at your regional DWQ office during regular business hours (Monday to Friday, 8AM to 5PM) as soon as possible, but in no case more than 24 hours after the SSO is known or discovered. To report outside of regular business hours, call (800) 858-0368.
- 2. Follow up the verbal report by sending a completed written report on the most current Division approved form within five days.

To provide a uniform method for all systems covered under this permit and to provide useful and consistent information pertaining to SSOs, please utilize form CS-SSO consisting of two parts. Part I serves to provide to the Division the required information that has always been necessary. Part II serves as an area to provide a justification for the spill, as optional under Condition I(3) of your permit. Form CS-SSO can be downloaded from the SSO Reporting area at <a href="http://portal.ncdenr.org/web/wq/swp/ps/cs/ssoreport">http://portal.ncdenr.org/web/wq/swp/ps/cs/ssoreport</a>.

An NOV, civil penalty, and/or a moratorium on the addition of waste to the system may be issued if adequate justification for an SSO is NOT submitted to the regional office. In order to submit a claim for justification of an SSO, you must use Form CS-SSO with additional documentation as necessary. DWQ staff will review the justification claim and determine if enforcement action is appropriate. Please be advised that the information needed to justify a spill is very comprehensive. Begin using this form immediately to report SSOs from the collection system. Continue to use our old form for reporting bypasses at the wastewater treatment plant until further notice. The time frame for submittal of both Part I and Part II, if pertinent, is five days.

Failure to abide by the conditions in this permit may subject the Permittee to enforcement action. If any parts, requirements, or limitations contained in this permit are unacceptable, you have the right to request an adjudicatory hearing upon written request within thirty days following the receipt of this permit. This request must be in the form of a written petition, conforming to Chapter 150B of the North Carolina General Statutes, and filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings, 6714 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699-6714. Unless such demands are made, this permit shall be final and binding.

PERMISSION IS HEREBY GRANTED TO THE

# Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC Currituck County

#### FOR THE

operation and maintenance of a wastewater collection system consisting of, at the time of permit issuance, approximately 4.8 miles of vacuum sewer, approximately 0.01 miles of pressure sewer, 217 simplex pump stations that discharge to a pressure sewer and serve a single building, 1 duplex pump station, and all associated piping, valves, and appurtenances required to make a complete and operational wastewater collection system to serve Sandler Utilities at Mill Run, LLC and any deemed permitted satellite communities, pursuant to the application received May 2nd, 2013, conformity with the documents referenced therein and other supporting data subsequently filed and approved by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and considered a part of this permit.

This permit shall be effective from June 1st, 2013 until May 31st, 2021, and shall be subject to the following specified conditions and limitations:

#### I. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

- The sewage and wastewater collected by this system shall be treated in the Sandler Utilities Wastewater Treatment Facility (WQ0014306) prior to being disposed into the reuse system. This collection system permit will be referenced upon renewal or modification of your treatment permit(s).
- 2. The wastewater collection system shall be effectively managed, maintained and operated at all times so that there is no SSO to land or surface waters, nor any contamination of groundwater. In the event that the wastewater collection system fails to perform satisfactorily, including the creation of nuisance conditions, the Permittee shall take immediate corrective actions, including actions that may be required by the Division of Water Quality (Division), such as the construction of additional or replacement sewer lines and/or equipment.

- 3. The Director may take enforcement action against the Permittee for SSOs that must be reported to the Division as stipulated in Condition IV(2). This includes SSOs that were caused by severe natural conditions or exceptional events **unless** the Permittee demonstrates through properly signed, contemporaneous operating logs, or other relevant evidence that:
  - a. The SSO was caused by severe natural conditions; there were no feasible alternatives to the SSO, such as the use of auxiliary treatment facilities, retention of untreated wastewater, reduction of inflow and infiltration, use of adequate back-up equipment, or an increase in the capacity of the system. This provision is not satisfied if, in the exercise of reasonable engineering judgment, the Permittee should have installed auxiliary or additional collection system components, wastewater retention or treatment facilities, adequate back-up equipment or should have reduced inflow and infiltration; or
  - b. The SSO was exceptional, unintentional, temporary and caused by factors beyond the reasonable control of the Permittee; the SSO could not have been prevented by the exercise of reasonable control, such as proper management, operation and maintenance; adequate treatment facilities or collection system facilities or components (e.g., adequately enlarging treatment or collection facilities to accommodate growth or adequately controlling and preventing infiltration and inflow); preventive maintenance; or installation of adequate backup equipment;

The Permittee can submit a claim to the Division Regional Office that the SSO meets the criteria of this condition. The Permittee has the option of submitting this claim along with the spill report required by Condition IV(2) (i.e., within five days) in order to be considered for immunity from enforcement action. Form CS-SSO Part II, or most current Division approved form, shall be used for any claims. The Permittee has the burden of proof that the above criteria have been met.

- 4. The Permittee shall establish by ordinance its legal authority to require new sewers be properly constructed; to ensure proper inspection and testing of sewer mains and service laterals; to address flows from satellite systems and to take enforcement action as required by Condition I(5).
- 5. The Permittee shall develop and implement an educational fats, oils and grease program that shall include at least bi-annual distribution of educational material targeted at both residential and non-residential users. The Permittee shall also develop and implement an enforceable fats, oils and grease program for non-residential users under which the Permittee can take enforcement against users who have not properly installed, operated and maintained grease traps or grease interceptors as directed or otherwise violated the terms of the local ordinance pertaining to fats, oils and grease.
- 6. The Permittee shall adopt and implement a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) to designate funding for reinvestment into the wastewater collection system infrastructure. The CIP should address the short-term needs and long-term "master plan" concepts. The CIP should typically cover a three to five year period and include a goal statement, description of the project area, description of the existing facilities, known deficiencies (over a reasonable period) and forecasted future needs. Cost analysis is integral to the CIP.

- 7. Existing overflow piping from manholes and pump stations, excluding piping to approved equalization structures, known or discovered after permit issuance shall be immediately removed or permanently capped. Plugged emergency pumping connections are allowable for portable pumping or rerouting without intentionally bypassing the wastewater treatment facility.
- 8. The Permittee shall maintain a contingency plan for pump failure at each pump station. If one of the pumps in a pump station containing multiple pumps fails, the process of repairing or replacing the pump shall be initiated immediately and the new parts or pump shall be installed as soon as possible. If the pump in a simplex pump station fails, it shall be replaced immediately.
- 9. Each pump station shall be clearly and conspicuously posted with a pump station identifier and an emergency contact telephone number at which an individual who can initiate or perform emergency service for the wastewater collection system 24 hours per day, seven days per week can be contacted. This emergency contact telephone number shall be coupled with instructions that the emergency contact should be called if the visual alarm illuminates, if the audible alarm sounds, or if an emergency is apparent.
- 10. Pump station sites, equipment and components shall have restricted access, per 15A NCAC 02T .305(h)(4).
- 11. Pump stations that do not employ an automatic polling feature (i.e. routine contact with pump stations from a central location to check operational status of the communication system) shall have both audible and visual high water alarms. The alarms shall be weather-proof and placed in a clear and conspicuous location. Permits issued for the construction of pump stations that included high water alarms in the description must maintain the alarms even if simple telemetry (i.e. notification of an alarm condition initiated by the pump station control feature) is installed.
- 12. For all newly constructed, modified and rehabilitated pump stations, all equipment and components located within the pump station shall be corrosion-resistant and components in close proximity of the pump station shall be sealed within a corrosion-resistant coating or encasement.
- 13. All construction and rehabilitation of the wastewater collection system (i.e., permitted or deemed permitted) shall be scheduled to minimize the interruption of service by the existing utilities. Construction and rehabilitation shall not result in the violation of Condition (I)(2) of this permit.

#### II. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Upon classification of the collection system by the Water Pollution Control System Operators Certification Commission (WPCSOCC), the Permittee shall designate and employ a certified operator to be in responsible charge (ORC) and one or more certified operator(s) to be back-up ORC(s) of the facilities in accordance with 15A NCAC 8G .0201. The ORC shall visit the system within 24 hours of knowledge of a bypass, spill, or overflow of wastewater from the system, unless visited by the Back-Up ORC, and shall comply with all other conditions of 15A NCAC 8G .0204.
- 2. The Permittee shall develop and adhere to a schedule for reviewing all inspection, maintenance, operational and complaint logs. If the review process results in the

identification of any recurring problem in the wastewater collection system that cannot be resolved in a short time period, the Permittee shall establish a plan for addressing the problem(s).

- 3. The Permittee shall develop and adhere to a schedule for testing emergency and standby equipment.
- 4. The Permittee shall develop and implement a routine pump station inspection and maintenance program, which shall include, but not be limited to, the following maintenance activities:
  - a. Cleaning and removing debris from the pump station structure, outside perimeter, and wet well;
  - b. Inspecting and exercising all valves;
  - c. Inspecting and lubricating pumps and other mechanical equipment according to the manufacturer's recommendations; and
  - d. Verifying the proper operation of the alarms, telemetry system and auxiliary equipment.
- 5. For each pump station without pump reliability (i.e. simplex pump stations serving more than a single building or pump stations not capable of pumping at a rate of 2.5 times the average daily flow rate with the largest pump out of service), at least one fully operational spare pump capable of pumping peak flow shall be maintained on hand.
- 6. The Permittee shall maintain on hand at least two percent of the number of pumps installed, but no less than two pumps, that discharge to a pressure sewer and serve a single building, unless the Permittee has the ability to purchase and install a replacement pump within 24 hours of first knowledge of the simplex pump failure or within the storage capacity provided in any sewer line extension permit.
- 7. Rights-of-way and/or easements shall be properly maintained to allow accessibility to the wastewater collection system unless the Permittee can demonstrate the ability to gain temporary access in an emergency situation where existing land-use conditions do not allow the establishment and maintenance of permanent access. In this case, the Permittee shall continue to observe the lines visually, utilize remote inspection methods (e.g. CCTV) and use the opportunity of drier conditions to perform further inspections and necessary maintenance.
- 8. The Permittee shall assess cleaning needs, and develop and implement a program for appropriately cleaning, whether by hydraulic or mechanical methods, all sewer lines. At least 10 percent of the wastewater collection system, selected at the discretion of the ORC, shall be cleaned each year. Preventative cleaning is not required for sewer lines less than five years old unless inspection otherwise reveals the need for cleaning or cleaning is required by a sewer line extension permit.
- 9. Adequate measures shall be taken to contain and properly dispose of materials associated with SSOs. The Permittee shall maintain a Response Action Plan that addresses the following minimum items:
  - a. Contact phone numbers for 24-hour response, including weekends and holidays;
  - b. Response time;
  - c. Equipment list and spare parts inventory;

- d. Access to cleaning equipment;
- e. Access to construction crews, contractors and/or engineers;
- f. Source(s) of emergency funds;
- g. Site sanitation and clean up materials; and
- h. Post-SSO assessment.
- 10. The Permittee, or their authorized representative, shall conduct an on-site evaluation for all SSOs as soon as possible, but no more than two hours after first knowledge of the SSO.
- 11. In the event of an SSO or blockage within the wastewater collection system, the Permittee shall restore the system operation, remove visible solids and paper, sanitize any ground area and restore the surroundings.

#### III. RECORDS

- Records shall be maintained to document compliance with Conditions I(4), II(2) II(4), II(7) - II(8), IV(3) and V(1) -V(4). Records shall be kept on file for a minimum of three years.
- 2. The Permittee shall maintain adequate records pertaining to SSOs, and complaints for a minimum of three years. These records shall include, but are not limited to, the following information:
  - a. Date of SSO or complaint;
  - b. Volume of wastewater released as a result of the SSO and/or nature of complaint;
  - c. Location of the SSO and/or complaint;
  - d. Estimated duration of the SSO;
  - e. Individual from the Division who was informed about the SSO and/or complaint, when applicable:
  - f. Final destination of the SSO;
  - g. Corrective actions;
  - h. Known environmental/human health impacts resulting from the SSO; and
  - i. How the SSO was discovered.
- 3. The Permittee shall maintain an up-to-date, accurate, comprehensive map of its wastewater collection system that also notes the locations where other wastewater collection systems become tributary. If a comprehensive map of the collection system has not been established, a rough sketch shall be drawn. The Permittee shall map approximately 10 percent of its existing collection system each year for the next ten years beginning at the original permit issuance date, or until complete, whichever is sooner. The comprehensive map shall include, but is not limited to: pipe size, pipe material, pipe location, flow direction, approximate pipe age, number of active service taps, and each pump station identification, location and capacity.
- 4. The Permittee shall maintain records of all of the modifications and extensions to the collection system permitted herein. The Permittee shall maintain a copy of the construction record drawings and specifications for modifications/extensions to the wastewater collection system for the life of the modification/extension. Information concerning the extension shall be incorporated into the map of the wastewater collection system within one year of the completion of construction. The system description

contained within this permit shall be updated to include this modification/extension information upon permit renewal.

#### IV. MONITORING AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Any monitoring (including, but not necessarily limited to, wastewater flow, groundwater, surface water, soil or plant tissue analyses) deemed necessary by the Division to ensure surface water and groundwater protection will be established, and an acceptable sampling and reporting schedule shall be followed.
- 2. The Permittee shall verbally report to a Division of Water Quality staff member at the Washington Regional Office, at telephone number (252) 946-6481 as soon as possible, but in no case more than 24 hours following the occurrence or first knowledge of the occurrence of either of the following:
  - a. Any SSO and/or spill over 1,000 gallons; or
  - b. Any SSO and/or spill, regardless of volume, that reaches surface water.

Voice mail messages or faxed information shall <u>not</u> be considered as the initial <u>verbal</u> report. SSOs (and other types of spills) occurring outside normal business hours may also be reported to the Division of Emergency Management at telephone number (800) 858-0368 or (919) 733-3300. Persons reporting any of the above occurrences shall file a spill report by completing Part I of Form CS-SSO (or the most current Division approved form), within five days following first knowledge of the occurrence. This report shall outline the actions taken or proposed to ensure that the problem does not recur. Per Condition I(3), Part II of Form CS-SSO (or the most current Division approved form) can also be completed to show that the SSO was beyond control.

3. The Permittee shall meet the annual reporting and notification requirements provided in North Carolina General Statute §143-215.1C.

#### V. INSPECTIONS

- 1. The Permittee or the Permittee's designee shall inspect the wastewater collection system regularly to reduce the risk of malfunctions and deterioration, operator errors, and other issues that may cause or lead to the release of wastes to the environment, threaten human health or create nuisance conditions. The Permittee shall keep an inspection log or summary including, at a minimum, the date and time of inspection, observations made, and any maintenance, repairs, or corrective actions taken by the Permittee.
- 2. Pump stations without Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems or telemetry shall be inspected everyday (i.e. 365 days per year). Pump stations equipped with SCADA systems or telemetry shall be inspected at least once per week.
- 3. A general observation of the entire collection system shall be performed throughout the course of every year.
- 4. Inspections of all high priority lines (i.e. aerial line, sub-waterway crossing, line contacting surface waters, siphon, line positioned parallel to stream banks that are subject to eroding in such a manner that may threaten the sewer line, or line designated as high-priority in a permit) shall be performed at least once per every six-month period

of time. A list of high-priority lines is presented as Attachment A and is hereby incorporated into this permit condition. New high priority lines installed or identified after permit issuance are incorporated by reference and subject to this permit condition until permit renewal where they shall be referenced in writing in **Attachment A**.

#### VI. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. This permit is not transferable. In the event that the Permittee desires to transfer ownership of the wastewater collection system or there is a name change of the Permittee, a formal permit modification request shall be submitted to the Division. The request shall be accompanied by documentation from the parties involved, and other supporting materials as may be appropriate. Such request will be considered on its merits and may or may not be approved.
- 2. Failure to abide by the conditions and limitations contained in this permit may subject the Permittee to an enforcement action by the Division in accordance with North Carolina General Statute §143-215.6A through §143-215.6C, and a sewer moratorium may be established.
- 3. The issuance of this permit does not exempt the Permittee from complying with any and all statutes, rules, regulations, or ordinances that may be imposed by other government agencies (i.e., local, state, and federal) having jurisdiction, including but not limited to applicable river buffer rules in 15A NCAC 2B .0200, soil erosion and sedimentation control requirements in 15A NCAC Chapter 4 and under the Division's General Permit NCG010000, and any requirements pertaining to wetlands under 15A NCAC 2B .0200 and I5A NCAC 02T .0100 and all applicable North Carolina Occupational Safety and Health Act health and safety standards.
- 4. The issuance of this permit does not prohibit the Division from reopening and modifying the permit, revoking and reissuing the permit or terminating the permit as allowed by the laws, rules, and regulations contained in I5A NCAC 02T .0100 and North Carolina General Statute §I43-2I5.I et. al., or as needed to address changes in federal regulations with respect to the wastewater collection system.
- 5. The Permittee shall pay the annual fee within thirty (30) days after being billed by the Division. Failure to pay the fee accordingly may cause the Division to initiate action to revoke this permit as specified by 15A NCAC 02T .0110(4).
- 6. The Permittee shall request renewal of this permit at least six months prior to the expiration of this permit. Upon receipt of the request, the Commission will review the adequacy of the wastewater collection system described therein, and if warranted, will extend the permit for a period of time and under such conditions and limitations, as the Commission may deem appropriate.
- 7. 8. Any duly authorized officer, employee, or representative of the Division may, upon presentation of credentials, enter and inspect any property, premises or place on or related to the collection system at any reasonable time for the purpose of determining compliance with this permit, may inspect or copy any records that must be maintained under the terms and conditions of this permit, and may obtain samples of wastewater, groundwater, surface water, soil, or plant tissue.

This permit shall be effective from the date of issuance until September 30, 2020, and shall be subject to the conditions and limitations as specified therein. Please pay particular attention to the monitoring requirements listed in Attachments A, B, and C for they may differ from the previous permit issuance. Failure to establish an adequate system for collecting and maintaining the required operational information shall result in future compliance problems.

continued operation of a reclaimed water generation system consisting of: a 89,782 gallon flow equalization basin with two 243 gallon per minute (GPM) pumps and served by a 310 cubic feet per minute (CFM) blower; a manual bar screen; a flow splitter box; two 225,000 gallon aeration basins (with one basin consisting of a 50,000 gallon section and a 175,000 gallon section); a 148,250 gallon clarifier; a 28,220 gallon clarifier; a 37,000 gallon aerated sludge holding tank served by two 1,000 CFM blowers; a 15 cell travelling bridge filter with a total area of 135 square feet (ft²); an ultraviolet (UV) disinfection unit; a 30,080 gallon effluent dosing tank with two 608 GPM pumps and high-water alarms; approximately 450 linear feet (LF) of 10-inch force main; a stand by generator with automatic transfer switch; a turbidimeter; a flow meter; and all associated piping, valves, controls and appurtenances; the

continued operation of a high-rate infiltration system consisting of: a 5.5million gallon (MG) high-rate infiltration basin (in lieu of a 5-day upset pond); and all associated piping, valves, controls and appurtenances; the

continued operation of a non-conjunctive reclaimed water utilization system consisting of: a 7.431 MG wet weather storage/irrigation pond; approximately 112.25 acres of irrigation area (with a limited maximum capacity of 262,625 GPD due to the available irrigation area); and all associated piping, valves, controls and appurtenances; and the

construction only of the wastewater treatment plant expansion to its original permitted capacity of 350,000 GPD and consisting of the: addition of an aeration blower with 2,000 CFM capacity; addition of a 213 ft² of tertiary filter (traveling bridge); additional UV disinfection; expansion of the wet weather storage/irrigation pond to 10.5 MG; expansion of the non-conjunctive reclaimed water utilization system to 321,000 GPD as permitted on May 14, 2004; and all associated piping, valves, controls and appurtenances

to serve Eagle Creek, with no discharge of wastes to surface waters, pursuant to the application received February 20, 2015, and in conformity with the project plans, specifications, and other supporting data subsequently filed and approved by the Department of Environmental Quality and considered a part of this permit.

This permit shall be effective from the date of issuance until September 30, 2020, and shall be subject to the following specified conditions and limitations:

#### I. SCHEDULES

- 1. Upon completion of construction and prior to operation of the expanded reclaimed water generation and non-conjunctive reclaimed water utilization facilities, a permit modification request from the Permittee, as-built plans and specifications, and a certification (attached) shall be submitted from a licensed North Carolina Professional Engineer certifying that the permitted facility has been installed in accordance with this permit, Division approved plans and specifications, and other supporting documentation, including the location of all monitoring wells as applicable. If this project is to be completed in phases and partially certified, the Permittee shall retain the responsibility to track further construction approved under the same permit, and shall provide a final certificate of completion once the entire project has been completed. Mail the Certification to the Division of Water Resources, Water Quality Permitting Section, 1617 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699-1617. [15A NCAC 02T .0116]
- 2. The Washington Regional Office, telephone number (252) 946-6481, shall be notified at least 48 hours in advance (excluding weekends and holidays) of operation of the modified facilities such that an inplace inspection can be made. Notification to the regional supervisor shall be made from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday, excluding State Holidays. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(2)]
- 3. Prior to adding any wastewater flow from other sources to the subject facility, including the South Ridge Development, the Permittee shall submit an updated or new agreement between Mill Run Golf Course and the Permittee with clear language specifying that treated effluent from new sources is allowed to be irrigated on the golf course. The agreement shall stipulate that the reclaimed water generation facility must have the ability to irrigate reclaimed water at all times to meet the facility's disposal requirements. Furthermore, the agreement shall include provisions for continued irrigation to the golf course if a dispute between the Permittee and Mill Run Golf Course shall arise. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)]
- 4. No later than six months prior to the expiration of this permit, the Permittee shall request renewal of this permit on official Division forms. Upon receipt of the request, the Division will review the adequacy of the facilities described therein, and if warranted, will renew the permit for such period of time and under such conditions and limitations as it may deem appropriate. Please note Rule 15A NCAC 02T .0105(d) requires an updated site map to be submitted with the permit renewal application. [15A NCAC 02T .0105(d), 02T .0106, 02T .0109, 02T .0115(c), 02U .0106, 02U .0109]
- 5. No later than March 1, 2016, the second bank of lights in the ultraviolet (UV) disinfection unit shall be replaced or repaired, and made operational. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(2)]

#### II. PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

1. The subject non-discharge facilities shall be effectively maintained and operated at all times so there is no discharge to surface waters, nor any contravention of groundwater or surface water standards. In the event the facilities fail to perform satisfactorily, including the creation of nuisance conditions due to improper operation and maintenance, failure of the utilization areas to adequately assimilate the reclaimed water or effluent, or failure of the infiltration areas to adequately assimilate the effluent the Permittee shall take immediate corrective actions including Division required actions, such as the construction of additional or replacement reclaimed water generation, utilization or infiltration facilities. [G.S. 143-215.1, 143-213.3(a)]

- 2. This permit shall not relieve the Permittee of their responsibility for damages to groundwater or surface water resulting from the operation of this facility. [15A NCAC 02B .0200, 02L .0100]
- All wells constructed for purposes of groundwater monitoring shall be constructed in accordance with 15A NCAC 02C .0108 (Standards of Construction for Wells Other than Water Supply), and any other jurisdictional laws and regulations pertaining to well construction. [15A NCAC 02C .0108]
- Effluent quality shall not exceed those specified in Attachment A. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1), 02U .0300]
- 5. Application rates shall not exceed those specified in Attachment B. [15A NCAC 02T .0705(m), 02U .0401(g), 02U .0402(m)]
- 6. The following shall be requirements for the reclaimed water distribution, storage, and utilization facilities:
  - a. All reclaimed water valves, storage facilities and outlets shall be tagged or labeled to warn the public or employees that reclaimed water is not intended for drinking. Where appropriate, such warning shall inform the public or employees to avoid contact with reclaimed water.
  - b. All reclaimed water piping, valves, outlets and other appurtenances shall be color-coded, taped or otherwise marked to identify the source of the water as being reclaimed water.
    - i. All reclaimed water piping and appurtenances shall be either colored purple (i.e., Pantone 522) and embossed or integrally stamped or marked "CAUTION: RECLAIMED WATER DO NOT DRINK" or be installed with a purple (i.e., Pantone 522) identification tape or polyethylene vinyl wrap. The warning shall be stamped on opposite sides of the pipe and repeated every three feet or less.
    - ii. Identification tape shall be at least three inches wide and have white or black lettering on purple (i.e., Pantone 522) field stating "CAUTION: RECLAIMED WATER DO NOT DRINK." Identification tape shall be installed on reclaimed water pipelines in a visible manner, fastened at least every 10 feet to each pipe length and run continuously the entire length of the pipe.
    - iii. Existing underground distribution systems retrofitted for the purpose of distributing reclaimed water shall be taped or otherwise identified as noted above. This identification need not extend the entire length of the distribution system, but shall be incorporated within 10 feet of crossing any potable water supply line or sanitary sewer line.
  - c. All reclaimed water valves and outlets shall be of a type, or secured in a manner, that permits operation by authorized personnel only.
  - d. Hose bibs shall be located in locked, below grade vaults that shall be labeled as being of non-potable quality. As an alternative to the use of locked vaults with standard hose bib services, other locking mechanisms such as hose bibs which can only be operated by a tool may be placed above ground and labeled as non-potable water.

[15A NCAC 02U .0403]

- No direct cross-connections shall be allowed between reclaimed water and potable water systems, unless such connection has been approved by the Department pursuant to 15A NCAC 18C .0406. [15A NCAC 02U .0403(f)]
- 8. Reclaimed water distribution lines shall be located at least 10 feet horizontally from and 18 inches below any water line where practicable. Where these separation distances cannot be met, the piping and integrity testing procedures shall meet water main standards in accordance with 15A NCAC 18C. [15A NCAC 02U .0403(h)]

 Reclaimed water distribution lines shall not be less than 100 feet from a well unless the piping and integrity testing procedures meet water main standards in accordance with 15A NCAC 18C, but in no case shall they be less than 25 feet from a private well or 50 feet from a public well. [15A NCAC 02U .0403(i)]

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- 10. Reclaimed water distribution lines shall be located at least two feet horizontally from and 18 inches above any sewer line where practicable. Where these separation distances cannot be met, the piping and integrity testing procedures shall meet water main standards in accordance with 15A NCAC 18C. [15A NCAC 02U .0403(j)]
- 11. The compliance and review boundaries for the non-conjunctive reclaimed water utilization sites are established at the property boundary. Any exceedance of standards at the compliance or review boundary shall require action in accordance with 15A NCAC 02L .0106. [15A NCAC 02H .0219(k)(1)(C)(i)(III)]
- 12. The high-rate infiltration basin was individually permitted on or after December 30, 1983; therefore, the compliance boundary is established at either 250 feet from the effluent disposal area, or 50 feet within the property boundary, whichever is closest to the effluent disposal area. An exceedance of groundwater standards at or beyond the compliance boundary is subject to remediation action according to 15A NCAC 02L .0106(d)(2) as well as enforcement actions in accordance with North Carolina General Statute 143-215.6A through 143-215.6C. [15A NCAC 02L .0106(d)(2), 02L .0107(b)]
- 13. In accordance with 15A NCAC 02L .0108, the high-rate infiltration basin's review boundary is established midway between the compliance boundary and the effluent disposal area. Any exceedance of groundwater standards at the review boundary shall require action in accordance with 15A NCAC 02L .0106. [15A NCAC 02L .0106, 02L .0108]
- 14. The Permittee shall apply for a permit modification to establish a new compliance boundary prior to any sale or transfer of property affecting a compliance boundary. [15A NCAC 02L .0107(c)]
- 15. No wells, excluding Division approved monitoring wells, shall be constructed within the compliance boundary except as provided for in 15A NCAC 02L .0107(g). [15A NCAC 02L .0107(d)]
- 16. Except as provided for in 15A NCAC 02L .0107(g), the Permittee shall ensure any landowner who is not the Permittee and owns land within the compliance boundary shall execute and file with the Currituck County Register of Deeds an easement running with the land containing the following items:
  - a. A notice of the permit and number or other description as allowed in 15A NCAC 02L .0107(f)(1);
  - b. Prohibits construction and operation of water supply wells within the compliance boundary; and
  - c. Reserves the right of the Permittee or the State to enter the property within the compliance boundary for purposes related to the permit.

#### III. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. The reclaimed water generation, utilization, and high-rate infiltration facilities shall be properly maintained and operated at all times. The facilities shall be effectively maintained and operated as a reclaimed water or non-discharge system to prevent the discharge of any reclaimed water or partially treated effluent resulting from the operation of this facility. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]

2. The Permittee shall maintain an Operation and Maintenance Plan, which at a minimum shall include the following:

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- a. Description of the system in sufficient detail to show what operations are necessary for the system to function and by whom the functions will be conducted;
- b. A map of all distribution lines and record drawings of all utilization systems under the Permittee's control;
- c. Description of anticipated maintenance activities;
- d. Include provisions for safety measures including restriction of access to sites and equipment; and
- e. Spill control provisions including response to upsets and bypasses including control, containment, remediation, and contact information for plant personnel, emergency responders and regulatory agencies.

[15A NCAC 02T .0707, 02U .0801]

- 3. Upon the Water Pollution Control System Operators Certification Commission's (WPCSOCC) classification of the subject non-discharge facilities, in accordance with 15A NCAC 08G .0200 the Permittee shall designate and employ a certified operator in responsible charge (ORC) and one or more certified operator(s) as back-up ORC(s). The ORC or their back-up shall visit the facilities in accordance with 15A NCAC 08G .0200, and shall comply with all other conditions specified in the previously cited rules. [15A NCAC 02T .0117, 02U .0117]
- 4. An operator certified by the Water Pollution Control System Operators Certification Commission (WPCSOCC) of a grade equivalent or greater than the facility classification shall be on call 24 hours per day. [15A NCAC 02U .0401(e), 02U .0402(i)]
- 5. A suitable year round vegetative cover shall be maintained on irrigation sites at all times, such that crop health is optimized, allows for even distribution of reclaimed water, and allows inspection of the irrigation system. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 6. Adequate measures shall be taken to prevent reclaimed water ponding in or runoff from the irrigation sites. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 7. Irrigation shall not be performed during inclement weather or when the ground is in a condition that will cause ponding or runoff. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 8. All reclaimed water irrigation equipment shall be tested and calibrated at least once per permit cycle. Calibration records shall be maintained at the facility for a period of no less than five years, and shall be made available to the Division upon request. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 9. The turbidimeter shall be tested and calibrated at a minimum of once per year. Calibration records shall be maintained at the facility for a period of no less than five years, and shall be made available to the Division upon request. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 10. Only effluent from the Eagle Creek WWTP shall be infiltrated or utilized on the sites listed in Attachment B. [G.S. 143-215.1]
- 11. An automatically activated standby power source capable of powering all essential treatment units shall be on site and operational at all times. If a generator is employed as an alternate power supply, it shall be tested weekly by interrupting the primary power source. [15A NCAC 02U .0402(h)]
- 12. No automobiles or machinery shall be allowed on the infiltration sites except during equipment installation or while maintenance is being performed. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 13. Public access to the reclaimed water generation and high-rate infiltration facilities shall be prohibited. [15A NCAC 02T .0705(p), 02U .0402(f)]

14. Public access to the reclaimed water utilization sites shall be controlled during active site use. Such controls at the infiltration pond and the reclaimed water pond may include the posting of signs every 100 feet showing the activities being conducted. A sign shall also be posted in plain sight in the club house describing these activities. Also, signage shall be provided around the perimeter of the golf course to notify the residents that reclaimed water is used to irrigate the golf course. An alternate to the signage is that the residents be notified by letter on an annual basis notifying them of the activities performed on the golf course. [15A NCAC 02U .0501]

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- 15. Diversion or bypassing of untreated or partially treated wastewater from the treatment facilities is prohibited. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1), 02T .0705(i)]
- 16. Freeboard in the wet weather storage and high-rate infiltration ponds shall not be less than two feet at any time. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1), 02T .0705(c)]
- 17. Gauges to monitor water levels in the wet weather storage and high-rate infiltration ponds shall be provided. These gauges shall have readily visible permanent markings at inch or tenth of a foot increments, indicating the following elevations: maximum liquid level at the top of the temporary liquid storage volume; minimum liquid level at the bottom of the temporary liquid storage volume; and the lowest point on top of the dam. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 18. A protective vegetative cover shall be established and maintained on all earthen embankments (i.e., outside toe of embankment to maximum allowable temporary storage elevation on the inside of the embankment), berms, pipe runs, erosion control areas, and surface water diversions. Trees, shrubs, and other woody vegetation shall not be allowed to grow on the earthen dikes or embankments. Earthen embankment areas shall be kept mowed or otherwise controlled and accessible. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 19. All effluent shall be routed to the high-rate infiltration pond should the limit for fecal coliform (e.g., daily maximum concentration of 25 colonies per 100 mL) or turbidity (e.g., instantaneous maximum of 10 NTU) be exceeded, until the problems associated with the wastewater treatment plant have been corrected. The wastewater in the high-rate infiltration pond shall be treated in the high-rate infiltration pond prior to discharge to the storage pond. [15A NCAC 02U .0402(e)]
- 20. The Permittee shall develop and implement an education program to inform users (including employees) about the proper use of reclaimed water. Educational material shall be provided to all residents and/or other facilities provided with reclaimed water, and these materials shall be maintained consistent with the reclaimed water uses. All educational materials shall be made available to the Division upon request. [15A NCAC 02U .0501(a)(4)]
- 21. The Permittee shall provide notification to the public and/or employees about the use of reclaimed water, and that reclaimed water is not intended for drinking. Such notification shall be provided to employees in a language they can understand. [15A NCAC 02U .0501]
- 22. The residuals generated from the wastewater treatment facilities shall be disposed or utilized in accordance with 15A NCAC 02T .1100. The Permittee shall maintain a residual management plan pursuant to 15A NCAC 02T .0708 and 02U .0802. [15A NCAC 02T .0708, 02T .1100, 02U .0802]
- 23. The high-rate infiltration basins shall be periodically cleaned to remove deposited materials that may impede the infiltration process. Cleaning records shall be maintained at the facility for a period of no less than five years, and shall be made available to the Division upon request. The Washington Regional Office, telephone number (252) 946-6481, shall be notified prior to each cleaning. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]

24. Reclaimed water applied to the utilization areas and effluent infiltrated in the high-rate basin shall be restricted to sources as follows:

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- a. Until a submittal of a new agreement between the Permittee and Mill Run Golf Course as specified in Condition I.2.; no type of wastewater other than that originating from the current Eagle Creek Development shall be applied to the reclaimed water utilization areas or infiltrated in the high-rate basin.
- b. Following receipt of a new agreement between the Permittee and Mill Run Golf Course, that is accepted by the Division as demonstrating the source and extent to which wastewater may be applied to the golf course, wastewater originating from the Eagle Creek Development and the South Ridge development, as specified and limited in the agreement.

All applicable permits must be obtained prior to construction of any new sewer line extension, collection system, and/or pump stations that are designed to provide for wastewater flow from new contributing sources.

[G.S. 143-215.1]

- 25. Vegetative growth must be kept out of the infiltration pond at all times. All vegetation must be removed manually so that minimal disturbance will occur to the disposal area. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 26. The application of chemicals to the infiltration pond is expressly prohibited. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 27. The Permittee shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the 6,000 GPM stormwater pump to allow the movement of groundwater off site from the golf course. Until such time that the County has established a drainage district, the Permittee shall be responsible for maintaining the canals for positive drainage. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]

### IV. MONITORING AND REPORTING REQUIRMENTS

- Any Division required monitoring (including groundwater, plant tissue, soil and surface water analyses)
  necessary to ensure groundwater and surface water protection shall be established, and an acceptable
  sampling reporting schedule shall be followed. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(c)]
- 2. A Division certified laboratory shall conduct all laboratory analyses for the required effluent, groundwater or surface water parameters. [15A NCAC 02H .0800]
- 3. Flow through the reclaimed water generating facility shall be continuously monitored, and daily flow values shall be reported on Form NDMR.

The Permittee shall install and maintain an appropriate flow measurement device to ensure the accuracy and reliability of flow measurement consistent with accepted engineering and scientific practices. Selected flow measurement devices shall be capable of measuring flows with a maximum deviation of less than ten percent from true flow; accurately calibrated at a minimum of once per year; and maintained to ensure the accuracy of measurements is consistent with the selected device's accepted capability. The Permittee shall maintain records of flow measurement device calibration on file for a period of at least five years. At a minimum, documentation shall include:

- a. Date of flow measurement device calibration,
- b. Name of person performing calibration, and
- c. Percent from true flow.

[15A NCAC 02T .0105(k)]

4. The Permittee shall monitor the reclaimed water or effluent from the generating facility at the frequencies and locations for the parameters specified in Attachment A. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(c)]

5. The Permittee shall maintain adequate records tracking the amount of reclaimed water utilized. Records shall be maintained for a minimum of five years. At a minimum, these records shall include W-1333 Sub 0 the following information for each utilization site listed in Attachment B:

- a. Date of reclaimed water utilization;
- b. Volume of reclaimed water irrigated;
- c. Site irrigated;
- d. Length of time site is irrigated;
- Continuous weekly, monthly, and year-to-date hydraulic (inches/acre) loadings;
- Weather conditions; and
- g. Maintenance of cover crops.

[15A NCAC 02T .0108(c)]

- 6. The Permittee shall maintain adequate records tracking the amount of effluent infiltrated. At a minimum, these records shall include the following information for each infiltration site listed in Attachment B:
  - a. Date of infiltration;
  - b. Volume of effluent infiltrated;
  - c. Site infiltrated;
  - d. Loading rates to each infiltration site listed in Attachment B; and
  - e. Weather conditions.

[15A NCAC 02T .0108(c)]

- 7. Freeboard (i.e., waste level to the lowest embankment elevation) in the wet weather storage and highrate infiltration ponds shall be measured to the nearest inch or tenth of a foot, and recorded weekly. Weekly freeboard records shall be maintained at the facility for a period of no less than five years. and shall be made available to the Division upon request. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(c)]
- 8. Three copies of all monitoring data (as specified in Conditions IV.3. and IV.4.) on Form NDMR for each PPI, three copies of all operation and disposal records (as specified in Conditions IV.5. and IV.7.) on Form NDAR-1, and three copies of all operation and disposal records (AS specified in Conditions IV.6. and IV.7. on Form NDAR-2 for every site in Attachment B shall be submitted on or before the last day of the following month. If no activities occurred during the monitoring month, monitoring reports are still required documenting the absence of the activity. All information shall be submitted to the following address:

[15A NCAC 02T .0105(1)]

9. A record shall be maintained of all residuals removed from this facility. This record shall be maintained at the facility for a period of no less than five years, and shall be made available to the Division upon request. At a minimum, this record shall include:

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- a. Name of the residuals hauler:
- b. Non-Discharge permit number authorizing the residuals disposal, or a letter from a municipality agreeing to accept the residuals;
- c. Date the residuals were hauled; and
- d. Volume of residuals removed.

[15A NCAC 02T .0108(c)]

- 10. A maintenance log shall be maintained at this facility. This log shall be maintained at the facility for a period of no less than five years, and shall be made available to the Division upon request. At a minimum, this log shall include:
  - a. Visual observations of treatment plant and plant site;
  - b. Date of calibration of flow measurement device(s);
  - c. Date of calibration of turbidimeter;
  - d. Date and results of power interruption testing on alternate power supply;
  - e. Record of preventative maintenance (e.g., changing/adjusting of equipment, pump and valve maintenance, cross connection control, testing, inspections and cleanings, etc.; and
  - f. Record of all unpermitted releases of reclaimed water or effluent to surface water or land surface including date of occurrence, estimated volume of release, cause, and corrective action taken.

[15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]

- 11. Monitoring wells shall be sampled at the frequencies and for the parameters specified in Attachment C. All mapping, well construction forms, well abandonment forms and monitoring data shall refer to the permit number and the well nomenclature as provided in Attachment C and Figure 1. [15A NCAC 02T .0105(m)]
- 12. Two copies of the monitoring well sampling and analysis results shall be submitted on a Compliance Monitoring Form (GW-59), along with attached copies of laboratory analyses, on or before the last working day of the month following the sampling month. The Compliance Monitoring Form (GW-59) shall include this permit number, the appropriate well identification number, and one GW-59a certification form shall be submitted with each set of sampling results. All information shall be submitted to the following address: Division of Water Resources, Information Processing Unit, 1617 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina, 27699-1617. [15A NCAC 02T .0105(m)]

### 13. Noncompliance Notification:

The Permittee shall report by telephone to the Washington Regional Office, telephone number (252) 946-6481, as soon as possible, but in no case more than 24 hours, or on the next working day following the occurrence or first knowledge of the occurrence of any of the following:

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- a. Treatment of wastes abnormal in quantity or characteristic, including the known passage of a hazardous substance.
- b. Any process unit failure (e.g., mechanical, electrical, etc.), due to known or unknown reasons, rendering the facility incapable of adequate wastewater treatment.
- c. Any failure resulting in a discharge of reclaimed water directly to surface waters or any unpermitted release of reclaimed water to land surface greater than or equal to 5,000 gallons. Unpermitted releases less than 5,000 gallons to land surface shall be documented by the Permittee in accordance with Condition IV.8.f. but do not require Regional Office notification.
- d. Any time self-monitoring indicates the facilities permitted herein have gone out of compliance with the limitations contained in this permit.
- e. Ponding in or runoff from the reclaimed water utilization sites.
- f. Effluent breakout from the infiltration basin.

Any emergency requiring immediate reporting (e.g., discharges to surface waters, imminent failure of a storage structure, etc.) outside normal business hours shall be reported to the Division's Emergency Response personnel at telephone number (800) 662-7956, (800) 858-0368, or (919) 733-3300. Persons reporting such occurrences by telephone shall also file a written report in letter form within five days following first knowledge of the occurrence. This report shall outline the actions taken or proposed to be taken to ensure the problem does not recur. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]

### V. INSPECTIONS

- 1. The Permittee shall provide adequate inspection and maintenance to ensure proper operation of the reclaimed water generation, utilization, and high-rate infiltration facilities. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)]
- 2. The Permittee or their designee shall inspect the reclaimed water generation, utilization, and high-rate infiltration facilities to prevent malfunction, facility deterioration and operator errors resulting in discharges, which may cause the release of wastes to the environment, a threat to human health or a public nuisance. The Permittee shall maintain an inspection log that includes, at a minimum, the date and time of inspection, observations made, and any maintenance, repairs, or corrective actions taken. The Permittee shall maintain this inspection log for a period of five years from the date of the inspection, and this log shall be made available to the Division upon request. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)]
- 3. Any duly authorized Division representative may, upon presentation of credentials, enter and inspect any property, premises or place on or related to the reclaimed water generation, utilization, and high-rate infiltration facilities permitted herein at any reasonable time for the purpose of determining compliance with this permit; may inspect or copy any records required to be maintained under the terms and conditions of this permit, and may collect groundwater, surface water or leachate samples. [G.S. 143-215.1]

### VI. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. Failure to comply with the conditions and limitations contained herein may subject the Permittee to an enforcement action by the Division in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes 143-215.6A to 143-215.6C. [G.S. 143-215.6A to 143-215.6C]

2. This permit shall become voidable if the permitted facilities are not constructed in accordance with the conditions of this permit, the Division approved plans and specifications, and other supporting documentation. [15A NCAC 02T .0110]

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- 3. This permit is effective only with respect to the nature and volume of wastes described in the permit application, Division approved plans and specifications, and other supporting documentation. No variances to applicable rules governing the construction or operation of the permitted facilities are granted, unless specifically requested and approved in this permit pursuant to 15A NCAC 02T .0105(n). [G.S. 142-215.1]
- 4. The issuance of this permit does not exempt the Permittee from complying with any and all statutes, rules, regulations, or ordinances, which may be imposed by other jurisdictional government agencies (e.g., local, state, and federal). Of particular concern to the Division are applicable river buffer rules in 15A NCAC 02B .0200; erosion and sedimentation control requirements in 15A NCAC Chapter 4 and under the Division's General Permit NCG010000; any requirements pertaining to wetlands under 15A NCAC 02B .0200 and 02H .0500; National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements under 15A NCAC 02H .0100, and documentation of compliance with Article 21 Part 6 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes. [15A NCAC 02T .0105(c)(6)]
- 5. In the event the permitted facilities change ownership or the Permittee changes their name, a written permit modification request shall be submitted to the Division. This request shall be made on official Division forms, and shall include appropriate property ownership documentation and other supporting documentation as necessary. The Permittee of record shall remain fully responsible for maintaining and operating the facilities permitted herein until a permit is issued to the new owner. [15A NCAC 02T .0104]
- 6. The Permittee shall retain a set of Division approved plans and specifications for the life of the facilities permitted herein. [15A NCAC 02T .0108(b)(1)]
- 7. The Permittee shall maintain this permit until all permitted facilities herein are properly closed or permitted under another permit issued by the appropriate permitting authority. [15A NCAC 02T .0105(j)]
- This permit is subject to revocation or unilateral modification upon 60 days notice from the Division Director, in whole or part for the requirements listed in 15A NCAC 02T .0110. [15A NCAC 02T .0110]
- Unless the Division Director grants a variance, expansion of the permitted facilities contained herein shall not be granted if the Permittee exemplifies any of the criteria in 15A NCAC 02T .0120(b). [15A NCAC 02T .0120]
- 10. The Permittee shall pay the annual fee within 30 days after being billed by the Division. Failure to pay the annual fee accordingly shall be cause for the Division to revoke this permit. [15A NCAC 02T .0105(e)(3)]

If TOC concentrations greater than 10 mg/L are detected in any downgradient monitoring well, additional sampling and analysis must be conducted to identify the individual constituents comprising this TOC concentration. If the TOC concentration as measured in the background monitor well exceeds 10 mg/L, this concentration will be taken to represent the naturally occurring TOC concentration. Any exceedances of this naturally occurring TOC concentration in the downgradient wells shall be subject to the additional sampling and analysis as described above.

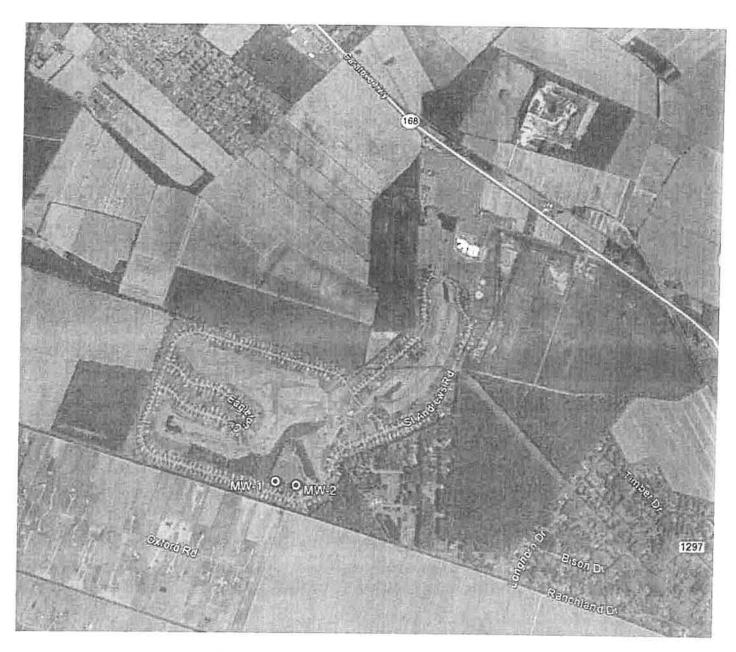


Figure 1 – Groundwater Monitoring Well Location

Monitoring wells shall be reported consistent with the nomenclature and location information provided in Figure 1 and this attachment. Š

### A. Application:

- 1. Section III.1. of the Non-Discharge System Renewal form (FORM: NDSR 01-20) requires a site map in accordance with 15A NCAC 02T .0105(d) that provides the following information:
  - a. Legend, north arrow, and scale
  - b. Distance measurements verifying all setbacks are being met
  - c. Stormwater drainage controls
  - d. Location and ownership of property boundaries within 500 feet of the disposal area (including road/rail right-of-ways)
  - e. All facility-related structures and fences within the treatment, storage, and disposal areas
  - f. All habitable residences and places of assembly within 500 feet of all treatment, storage, and disposal sites
  - g. Topographic contour intervals not exceeding 10 feet or 25 percent of total site relief
  - h. Soil mapping units on all disposal sites
  - i. Location of all wells, streams (ephemeral, intermittent, and perennial), springs, lakes, ponds, ditches, and other surface drainage features within 500 feet of all waste treatment, storage, and disposal site(s)
  - j. Location and identification of each monitoring well (identify any background/upgradient wells)
  - k. Latitude and longitude coordinates of all monitoring wells (decimal degrees to 6 digits)
  - 1. Location and identification of major components of the waste disposal system
  - m. Identification of all storage or treatment earthen structures that are part of the permit
  - n. The wetted perimeter of all irrigation/infiltration fields with field names (named according to the approved permit)
  - o. The delineation of compliance and review boundaries
  - p. 100-year floodplain (if applicable)

The site map submitted does not show the components of the reclaimed water irrigation fields. Please provide an updated site map.

- 2. Section VI.1. of FORM: NDSR 01-20 indicates that there are no easements. However, the coordinates for the reclaimed water fields in the permit are shown to be located on parcel number 8030-19-9824 owned by Paasch Developments, LLC. In accordance with 15A NCAC 02L .0107(f), if the permittee is not the owner of the land within the compliance boundary, the landowner of the land within the compliance boundary shall execute and file in the Register of Deeds in the county in which the land is located, an easement running with the land which:
  - a. contains:
    - i. either a notice of the permit, including the permit number, a description of the type of permit, and the name, address and telephone number of the permitting agency; or
    - ii. a reference to a notice of the permit with book and page number of its recordation if such notice is required to be filed by statute;

b. prohibits the construction and operation of water supply wells within the compliance boundary; and

c. reserves the right to the permittee and the State to enter on such property within the compliance boundary for groundwater monitoring and remediation purposes.

As such, an easement shall be provided meeting these requirements, executed by Paasch Developments, LLC, and recorded in the Currituck County Register of Deeds. Please also note that this easement would need to cover all parcels which has reclaimed water irrigation. It appears that there are additional golf course holes located on parcels 8031-41-8248 and 8031-53-1728 also owned by Paasch Developments, LLC which potentially have reclaimed water irrigation fields.

3. The wet weather storage/irrigation pond is located on land not owned by the Permittee, as the northeast corner of the pond is located on parcel number 8030-19-9824 owned by Paasch Developments, LLC. Storage structures have a setback of 50 feet to the property line. In order for this pond to meet setbacks, a setback waiver shall be written, notarized, signed by all parties involved and recorded with the county Register of Deeds in accordance with 15A NCAC 02T .0506(d) allowing a reduced setback of 0 feet from wastewater storage units to property lines. As the pond is located on land not owned by the Permittee, the Permittee shall also provide a reciprocating waiver allowing the storage unit within 0 feet of their property line as well. Prefilled waivers have been provided with this letter.

### B. Groundwater Monitoring Program:

1. Upon review of the effluent flows from the WWTP against the amount of water irrigated out of the wet weather storage/irrigation pond, there are concerns that this unlined pond is acting as an infiltration pond. As such, monitoring wells shall be provided around this pond to evaluate any potential effects on surrounding groundwater.

The Division requests that the Permittee propose a monitoring well system to evaluate the groundwater surrounding this pond. These proposed well locations shall be included on the site map submitted in Item A.1. of this request, and this program shall be approved by the NC DWR Washington Regional Office so that the wells can be included in this permit issuance. A map with proposed well locations is attached to this letter.

### C. Existing Permit:

1. Condition III.27. states that the Permittee shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the 6,000 GPM stormwater pump to allow movement of groundwater off site from the golf course, and maintain the canals for positive drainage until such time that the County has established a drainage district. Please provide an update on the county drainage district. If not established, what actions have been done to maintain positive drainage.

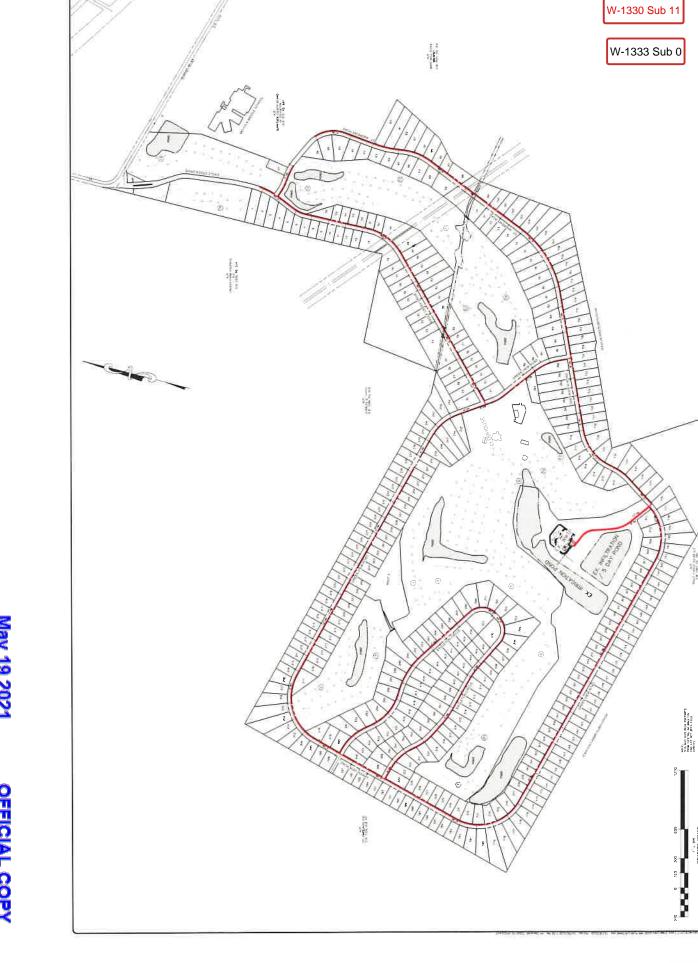
