I now call for hearing Docket Number E-100,
Sub 194, in the Matter of Biennial Determination of
Avoided Cost Rates for Electric Utility Purchases from
Qualifying Facilities - 2023. These are the 2023
biennial proceedings held by the Commission pursuant
to the provisions of Section 2010 of the Public
Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 and applicable
Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Regulations
pertaining to this Commission's responsibilities for
