In its June 18, 2009 Order Scheduling Hearing to Consider "Agreement and Joint Stipulation of Settlement," the Commission ordered Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC ("Duke") and Environmental Defense Fund, Natural Resources Defense Council, Southern Alliance for Clean Energy and the Southern Environmental Law Center (collectively, the "Environmental Intervenors") to file testimony regarding the issue of the appropriate jurisdictional allocation method not later than Friday, June 26, 2009. Duke included a discussion of the issue in the Testimony of Stephen M. Farmer filed on June 19, 2009. The Environmental Intervenors agreed to the method proposed by Duke as part of the negotiated settlement, but their position on the issue is neutral. Therefore, the Environmental Intervenors do not intend to file testimony regarding the cost allocation issue.
