
**RE: Duke Energy Progress, LLC Archaeological Survey Results

Dear Ms. Jarvis:

Pursuant to the Commission's February 22, 2018 *Order Granting Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Convenience and Necessity*, Duke Energy Progress, LLC engaged the services of an experienced archaeologist to conduct a comprehensive survey (the "Survey") to identify and evaluate archaeological sites potentially affected by construction of the Newport-Harlowe transmission line (the "Newport-Harlowe Project") in Carteret County. Only one archaeological site was identified (a single brick), and that site was found ineligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The Survey recommended that the proposed transmission line project proceed without concern for impacts to significant cultural resources and concluded, "No further archaeological work is recommended at this location." The enclosed documents reflect that the U.S. Forest Service ("USFS") and the State Historic Preservation Office have both reviewed the Survey and concurred with its findings. We are still working with the USFS to obtain the special use permit for the USFS crossing.





Thank you for your letter transmitting the report for the project listed above. We have reviewed the information provided and offer the following comments.

One archaeological site (31CR449) was identified as a result of the survey. Site 31CR449 yielded a single brick fragment and is not considered eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Based on the information provided, this office concurs with this recommendation, and finds that the proposed project will have no effect on any historic properties eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.
