1	STAFF CONFERENCE JUNE 20, 2022
2	CHAIR MITCHELL: Good morning. Let's come
3	to order, please, go on the record. I'm Charlotte
4	Mitchell, Chair of the Utilities Commission, and with
5	me this morning are Commissioners Brown-Bland,
6	Clodfelter, Duffley, Hughes, McKissick, and Kemerait.
7	In compliance with the State Government
8	Ethics Act, I remind Members of the Commission of our
9	duty to avoid conflicts of interest and inquire as to
10	whether any member of the Commission has a known
11	conflict of interest with respect to matters coming
12	before us this morning.
13	(No response)
14	CHAIR MITCHELL: The record will reflect
15	that no conflicts have been identified, so we'll
16	proceed with Public Staff, Item 1.
17	MR. SAILLOR: I'm Scott Saillor with the
18	Public Staff Energy Division. Item 1 is a motion by
19	New River Light and Power to revise its Prepaid
20	Service Rider. The Public Staff recommends that the
21	Commission approve New River's motion with the
22	following revisions. New River informed the Public
23	Staff that it is planning, as part of its upcoming
24	rate case application, to make the Prepaid Service

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1 Rider a permanent tariff offering and to reduce the 2 minimum prepayment required to set up a prepaid 3 account from \$50 to \$25. The Public Staff does not object to this 4 5 plan and recommends that the Prepaid Service Rider be 6 approved as a permanent tariff offering, and that the 7 minimum prepayment required to set up a prepaid 8 account be lowered from \$50 to \$25. So the Public Staff does not object to making these changes now 9 10 rather than waiting for the rate case. 11 COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval of 12 the recommendation. 13 COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Second. 14 CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and 15 seconded that the item be approved as recommended by 16 the Public Staff. Are there any questions or 17 discussion on the motion? 18 (No response) 19 CHAIR MITCHELL: Hearing none, all in favor, 20 indicate with an aye. 21 (All Commissioners say aye) 22 CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed? 23 (No response) 24 CHAIR MITCHELL: Motion carries. Thank you,

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1	Mr. Saillor. We will proceed now with Public Staff,
2	Item 2. It's the Aqua item.
3	MS. FEASEL: Good morning. Lynn Feasel from
4	Public Staff Accounting Division. Docket No. W-218,
5	Sub 56 sorry, Sub 526A, on April 27th, 2022, Aqua
6	North Carolina filed an application requesting
7	authority to adjust its Water System Improvement
8	Charges and the Sewer System Improvement Charges
9	effective July 1st, 2022. The Public Staff has
10	reviewed Aqua's updated WSIC and SSIC revenue amongst
11	a newly-applied EMF. And based on this review, the
12	Public Staff recommends four adjustments which do not
13	change Aqua's proposed WSIC and SSIC percentages. The
14	Company agrees with the Public Staff's recommended
15	adjustments.
16	The Public Staff recommends that the
17	Commission issue the proposed order approving the
18	Public Staff's recommended Water and the Sewer System
19	Improvement Charges effective for service rendered on
20	or after July 1st, 2022, subject to true-up.
21	COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval of
22	the recommendation.
23	COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second.
24	CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and
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1	seconded that the item be approved as recommended by
2	the Public Staff. Questions or discussion on the
3	motion?
4	(No response)
5	CHAIR MITCHELL: Hearing none, all in favor,
6	indicate with an aye.
7	(All Commissioners say aye)
8	CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed?
9	(No response)
10	CHAIR MITCHELL: Motion carries. Thank you,
11	Ms. Feasel. We'll proceed now to Public Staff,
12	Item 3.
13	MS. PROFFITT: Good morning. My name is
14	Karen Proffitt of the Public Staff Water, Sewer, and
15	Telephone Division. I'll be presenting Items 3
16	through 6, if that's all right. Communications
17	Items 3 through 6 present an Interconnection Agreement
18	Amendment filed by AT&T North Carolina and
19	Interconnection Agreements filed by Saluda Mountain
20	Telephone Company and Frontier filed between April 7th
21	and April 18th, 2022.
22	The Public Staff has reviewed the filings
23	and recommends that orders be issued approving the
24	amendment and agreements effective on the date they

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1 were filed. The Public Staff has provided proposed 2 orders to the Commission Staff. 3 COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval of 4 Public Staff's recommendations for Communication Items 5 P3 through P6 inclusive. COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second. 6 7 CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and 8 seconded that Items 3 through 6 be approved as recommended by the Public Staff. Questions or 9 10 discussion on the motion? 11 (No response) 12 CHAIR MITCHELL: Hearing none, all in favor, 13 indicate with an aye. 14 (All Commissioners say aye) 15 CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed? 16 (No response) CHAIR MITCHELL: That motion carries. 17 Thank 18 you, Ms. Proffitt. Commission has before us our minutes of the June 6, 2022 Staff Conference for 19 20 approval.
