BY THE CHAIRMAN: On October 24, 2008, in Docket No. G-5, Sub 495, the Commission issued an Order Approving Partial Rate Increase and Requiring Conservation Program Filing and Reporting (Order). Ordering Paragraph Seven of the Order requires Public Service Company of North Carolina, Inc. (PSNC), to file annual reports on or before February 15 of each year accounting for its spending on conservation programs during the previous year. The annual reports are filed in Docket No. G-5, Sub 495A.

On February 2, 2012, PSNC filed a motion with the Commission requesting that the Commission amend the Order to allow PSNC to file its annual reports on or before March 31 of each year. In support of its motion, PSNC states that it has discovered each year that it needs additional time to compile and review the data for the 12 months ended December 31 to ensure that the report reflects accurate accounting for its conservation programs. PSNC also states that the Public Staff, Carolina Utility Customers Association, Inc. and the Attorney General's Office do not object to its motion.


Based upon the foregoing and the record in these dockets, the Chairman is of the opinion that good cause exists to grant PSNC's motion.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Ordering Paragraph Seven in the Commission's Order is amended to change the date on which PSNC shall file its annual report accounting for spending on conservation programs during the previous year from on or before February 15 to on or before March 31 each year.
