



NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing on an annual fuel charge adjustment rider proceeding for Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC). The fuel charge adjustment rider hearing will be held remotely on Webex and will begin at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 1, 2021. The Commission has scheduled a public hearing for the purpose of considering DEC's application for approval of Renewable Energy & Energy Efficiency Portfolio (REPS) cost recovery and 2020 REPS compliance report. The REPS hearing will be held remotely on Webex and will begin immediately following the fuel charge adjustment hearing.

The Commission has scheduled a public hearing for the purpose of considering the annual competitive procurement of renewable energy program (CPRE) cost recovery proceeding for DEC. The CPRE hearing will be held remotely on Webex and will begin immediately following the hearings in Docket Nos. E-7, Subs 1250 and 1246.

**Docket No. E-7, Sub 1250**

DEC filed an application and testimony relative to its fuel rider adjustment on February 23, 2021. According to DEC's initial application, the proposed changes in fuel rates would result in decreases of the current fuel rates of all customer classes, with the amount of the decrease varying for different customer classes. The net effect of DEC's request as filed in its application would decrease the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month by \$1.94, excluding the regulatory fee.

On March 18, 2021, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearing, Requiring Filing of Testimony, Establishing Discovery Guidelines and Requiring Public Notice (Fuel Scheduling Order). The Fuel Scheduling Order, among other things, required DEC to publish a Public Notice of the public hearing and of the proposed changes in monthly fuel rates.

Through supplemental testimony and exhibits filed on April 29, 2021, after the Public Notice of the original proposed fuel charges had been published by DEC pursuant to the Commission's Fuel Scheduling Order, DEC revised its proposed monthly fuel rates. The revisions, if approved by the Commission, would result in fuel charges higher than the charges stated in the original Public Notice published by DEC. In the case of the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month, DEC revised its proposed decrease to \$1.38, excluding the regulatory fee. The proposed changes in all customers' fuel rates would be effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2021.

**Docket No. E-7, Sub 1247**

DEC filed an application and testimony relative to its competitive procurement of renewable energy program (CPRE) cost recovery rider on February 23, 2021. According to DEC's initial application, the proposed riders would result in increased charges per kilowatt hour to all customer classes, with the amount of the increase varying for different customer classes. The net effect of DEC's request as filed in its application would increase the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,000 kWh of electricity by \$0.34 per month.

On March 18, 2021, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearing, Requiring Filing of Testimony, Establishing Discovery Guidelines and Requiring Public Notice (CPRE Scheduling Order). The CPRE Scheduling Order, among other things, required DEC to publish a Public Notice of the public hearing and of the proposed changes in monthly CPRE rider rates.

Through supplemental testimony and exhibits filed on May 3, 2021, after the Public Notice of the original proposed CPRE charges had been published by DEC pursuant to the Commission's CPRE Scheduling Order, DEC revised its proposed monthly CPRE rates. The revisions, if approved by the Commission, would result in CPRE rider charges lower than the charges stated in the original Public Notice published by DEC. In the case of the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month, DEC's revised application proposes an increase of \$0.17 per month when compared to the currently approved rates. The proposed changes in all customers' monthly CPRE rider rates would be effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2021.

**Docket No. E-7, Sub 1246**

DEC filed an application and testimony relative to its REPS cost recovery rider on February 23, 2021. According to DEC's initial application, the proposed riders would result in increased charges per month to the residential and general service customer classes, and a decrease in the monthly charge to the industrial customer class, with the amounts of the monthly changes varying by customer classes. The original proposed increases in monthly charges for the residential and general service customer classes were \$0.32 and \$1.20, respectively, and the original proposed decrease in the monthly charge for the industrial customer class was \$23.60, all including regulatory fee.

On March 18, 2021, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearing, Requiring Filing of Testimony, Establishing Discovery Guidelines and Requiring Public Notice (REPS Scheduling Order). The REPS Scheduling Order, among other things, required DEC to publish a Public Notice of the public hearing, and of the proposed changes in monthly REPS rider charges.

Through supplemental testimony and exhibits filed on May 4, 2021, after the Public Notice of the original proposed REPS rider charges had been published by DEC pursuant to the Commission's REPS Scheduling Order, DEC revised its proposed monthly REPS charges. The revisions, if approved by the Commission, would result in monthly REPS rider charges that are lower for the residential customer class and higher for the general service and industrial customer classes than the charges stated in the original Public Notice published by DEC. The revised proposed monthly charges by customer class, including regulatory fee, are increases of \$0.16 for residential, \$1.33 for general service, and \$11.46 for industrial. Proposed changes in all customers' monthly REPS rider charges would be effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2021.
