The proposed JAAR for residential service is 0.631 cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh), including regulatory fees, which would be an increase of 0.149 cents per kWh from the JAAR presently in effect, and would increase the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours per month by \$1.49. The proposed JAAR per kWh for other non-demand rate class customers, including regulatory fees, is 0.604 cents for small general service; 0.463 cents for medium general service; 1.588 cents for seasonal and intermittent service; 0.333 cents for traffic signal service; and no charge for outdoor lighting service. The proposed JAAR per kWh for demand rate class customers, including regulatory fees, is \$1.41 for medium general service and \$1.59 for large general service. The JAAR for all customer classes would be effective for service rendered on and after December 1, 2022, through November 30, 2023.



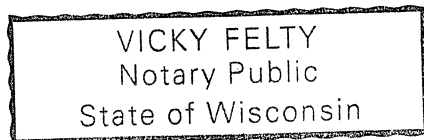


