NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing to be held on Monday, June 22, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. at the Camden County Courthouse 117 NC Hwy 343, North Camden, North Carolina, The purpose of the hearing is to receive public witness testimo-ny regarding the application of Camden Solar LLC for a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) to construct a 20-MW AC solar photovoltaic (PV) electric generating facility to be located in Camden County, North Carolina, and operated as a merchant generating facility.

In support of its application, the Applicant filed the direct testimony of Whitney Rubin, as well as several exhibits. In summary, construction of the facility is anticipated to begin on or about the second quarter 2021, with the expectsecond quarter 2021, with the expect-ed commercial operation date being as early as the fourth quarter of 2022. The location of the proposed facility is on 2 parcels of land for a total of 218 acres located at the southwest corner of the intersection of NC Highway 343 and Sand Hills Road (Route 1132), Camden in Camden County, North Carolina. The facility will interconnect with the electric transmission system owned by Virginia Electric and Power Company, d/b/a Dominion Energy North Carolina, affording it access to the PJM regional transmission organization, and the Ap-plicant is negotiating a contract for the sale of the output of the facility with an out-of-state corporate buyer. The expected service life of the facility is 20 or more years,

On April 15, 2020, the Public Staff filed a Notice of Completeness stating that the Public Staff has reviewed the application as required by Commission Rule R8-63(d) and that the Public Staff considers the application to be complete.

Specific information about the application for a CPCN may be obtained from the Office of the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, Raleigh, North Carolina, where a copy of the application, exhibits and supporting tes-timony are available for review by the public, and on the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net.

The direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses to be pre-sented by intervenors should also be filed with the Commission on or before Monday, May 18, 2020.

The Commission may cancel the public witness hearing if no substantial written complaints regarding the proposed facility are received by the Commis-sion's Chief Clerk on or before ten days following the last day of the publication of notice,
