THE NORTH CAROLINA UTILITIES COMMISSION has scheduled a public hearing in the annual Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard (REPS) cost recovery proceeding for Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP). The public hearing has been scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m., on Wednesday, September 14, 2022, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, State Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. The proceeding is being held pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 62-1309 and Commission Rule 89-67 to consider DEP's application for approval of REPS cost recovery and compliance with the REPS requirements during the 2024 calendar year. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule 81-21(g).

On June 14, 2022, Duke Energy Progress, LLC filed its application for approval of REPS cost recovery and 2023 REPS compliance report. By its application, DEP proposes to implement the following monthly REPS rates, not including regulatory fee, effective for service rendered on and after December 1, 2022: a \$1.58 charge for residential customers; an \$8.41 charge for general service and lighting customers; and a \$9.34 charge for industrial customers. DEP's proposed monthly REPS rates, if approved, will result in the following increases to DEP's current monthly REPS rates, not including regulatory fee: \$2.14 for residential customers; \$2.02 for general service and lighting customers; and \$7.96 for industrial customers.




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
