2	CHAIR MITCHELL: Good morning. Let's come
3	to order and go on the record, please. I'm
4	Charlotte Mitchell, Chair of the Utilities
5	Commission. With me this morning are Commissioners
6	Brown-Bland, Clodfelter, Hughes, McKissick, and
7	Kemerait.
8	In compliance with the State Government
9	Ethics Act, I remind members of the Commission of
10	our duty to avoid conflicts of interest, and inquire
11	at this time as to whether any member of the
12	Commission has a known conflict with respect to
13	matters coming before us this morning?
14	(No response)
15	The record will reflect no conflicts have
16	been identified, so we will proceed with Public
17	Staff, Item 1.
18	MR. METZ: Good morning. I'm Dustin Metz
19	with the Energy Division. Item P1 is an amended and
20	renewed Application for a Certificate of Public
21	Convenience and Necessity for a solar photovoltaic
22	facility.
23	The Public Staff recommends that the
24	Commission approve the Application and issue the
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1	Certificate.
2	COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval
3	of the recommendation.
4	COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second.
5	CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and
6	seconded that the item be approved as recommended by
7	the Public Staff. Are there questions or discussion
8	on that motion?
9	(No response)
10	Hearing none, all in favor indicate with
11	an aye.
12	(All Commissioners say aye)
13	CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed?
14	(No response)
15	The motion carries.
16	MR. METZ: Thank you.
17	CHAIR MITCHELL: Thank you, Mr. Metz.
18	Let's proceed to Public Staff, Item 2.
19	MR. JUNIS: Charles Junis, Director of the
20	Public Staff - Water, Sewer and Telephone Division.
21	Item 2, Docket Numbers W-1341, Sub 0 and W-661, Sub
22	10, Fearrington Utilities, LLC, and Fitch Creations,
23	Inc., d/b/a Fearrington Utilities filed with the
24	Commission an Application for transfer of public
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utility franchise and for approval of rates; seeking authority to transfer the wastewater utility system and public utility franchise serving the Fearrington Village Subdivision in Chatham County, North Carolina, from Fitch Creations to Fearrington Utilities, a subsidiary of Fitch Creations. The Public Staff has reviewed the Application and recommends that the Commission issue

8 9 the proposed order requiring customer notice and 10 that the matter be determined without public hearing if no significant protests are received subsequent 11 12 to customer notice. 13 COMMISSIONER HUGHES: Motion to approve 14 it. 15 COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second. 16 CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and 17 seconded that the item be approved as recommended by the Public Staff. Questions or discussion? 18 19 Commissioner McKissick. 20 COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Yes. One or two 21 quick questions. 22 In terms of the notice that will be 23 provided, what will that consist of? 24 MR. JUNIS: So the notice should be

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1	attached to that proposed order. It lays out the
2	information about the transfer, the rates that it
3	will be transferred at, and then if there's no
4	significant protest within 45 days of customer
5	hearing, that the Commission could decide the
6	matter.
7	COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Very good. And
8	one quick follow up. I notice that they are
9	proposing about \$4.1 million in terms of
10	improvements, or perhaps it's even construction of a
11	new wastewater treatment facility, and I guess the
12	thing which I'm noticing is that they're projecting
13	that maybe it will be a \$31.09 cost per month per
14	customer to retire that debt; is that correct?
15	MR. JUNIS: So that's essentially the
16	revenue requirement tied to that capital investment
17	under a certain set of assumptions, basically a
18	50/50 cap structure and a reasonable return. It's
19	just a projection to give an idea of what the
20	customers are likely going to see in terms of a rate
21	increase subsequent to that investment, but that
22	would be subject to filing a rate case, Public Staff
23	investigation, and a decision by the Commission, so
24	that's still some time off. But it is my
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understanding they do intend to complete, it's 1 actually the construction of a new train to replace 2 some of the existing infrastructure, and then they 3 would file a rate case. 4 5 COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: And that would be on top of the cost that they pay today? 6 7 MR. JUNIS: Correct. I mean, you're going to have some cost changes, and as plant continues to 8 9 depreciate, so it might not be a perfect sort of 10 pancaking but probably fairly close. 11 COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: And will any of 12 that information be shared with existing customers 13 when they get notification of the hearing or --14 because it really just does look like an interested 15 party transaction exchanging ownership from one 16 entity to the next which is separate, but basically 17 it sounds like it's controlled by the same people. 18 MR. JUNIS: Yes. So that information is included in the customer notice which is Appendix A. 19 COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: 20 Very good. Thank 21 No further questions. you. 22 CHAIR MITCHELL: Any additional questions? 23 (No response) 24 All in favor indicate with an aye.

2	CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed?
3	(No response)
4	The motion carries.
5	Thank you, Mr. Junis.
6	MR. JUNIS: Thank you.
7	CHAIR MITCHELL: Proceeding now to Public
8	Staff, Item 3.
9	MR. JUNIS: Yep, I'm on board for that,
10	too. Item 3, Carolina Water Service, Inc. of North
11	Carolina filed with the Commission an Application
12	for determination of fair value of utility assets
13	pursuant to North Carolina General Statute
14	§ $62-133.1(a)$, and establishing rate base for
15	acquisition of the Carteret County water system in
16	Docket Number W-354, Sub 398.
17	Carolina Water also filed an Application
18	for a Certificate of Public Convenience and
19	Necessity and for approval of rates to provide water
20	utility service to the Carteret County water system
21	in Carteret County, North Carolina, in W-354 Sub
22	399.
23	The Fair Value Application is a first of
24	its kind and is a not a simple single issue and
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associated CPCN Application will be to some degree dependent on the outcome of the Fair Value proceeding. Therefore, the Public Staff requests continued thoughtful consideration and determination of hearing dates and deadlines by the Commission given the unprecedented press of business including the Company's own multi-year rate case, a few extra days here and there would be beneficial to all parties involved without materially delaying the outcome of the proceedings. The Public Staff has reviewed the Applications and recommends that the Commission issue the proposed order scheduling a joint public hearing and separate evidentiary hearings, establishing discovery guidelines, and requiring customer notice. COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval of the recommendation. COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second. CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and seconded that the item be approved as recommended by the Public Staff. Questions or discussion on the motion?

CHAIR MITCHELL: Mr. Franklin, I see you 8 9 approaching. We'll proceed now to Public Staff, 10 Item 4. 11 MR. FRANKLIN: Good morning, 12 Commissioners. Mike Franklin, Engineer, Public 13 Staff - Water, Sewer and Telephone Division. On June 8th, 2022, West Springdale, LLC, d/b/a 14 15 Springdale Water and Sewer, LLC, filed an 16 Application with the Commission seeking authority to 17 increase its rates for providing water and 18 wastewater utility services to the Springdale 19 Estates Subdivision in Springdale Country Club in Haywood County. 20 21 On June 29th, 2022, the Commission issued 22 an Order establishing a general rate case and 23 suspending rates. 24 A proposed order has been provided,

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scheduling hearings, establishing discovery 1 2 guidelines and requiring customer notice, and it is 3 recommended that the Commission issue the proposed 4 order. COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Move approval 5 of the recommendation. 6 7 COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second. CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and 8 9 seconded that the item be approved as recommended by 10 the Public Staff. Questions or discussion? 11 (No response) 12 Hearing none, all in favor indicate with 13 an aye. 14 (All Commissioners say aye) 15 CHAIR MITCHELL: Is there anyone opposed? 16 (No response) 17 The motion carries. Thank you, Mr. Franklin. 18 19 The Commission has before us for approval 20 our minutes from the September 6th, 2022, Staff 21 Conference. 22 COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Move approval. 23 COMMISSIONER BROWN-BLAND: Second. 24 CHAIR MITCHELL: Questions, discussion on
