Dear N.C. Utilities Commission:

The City of Asheville has adopted aggressive climate change goals and strategies; to achieve these goals, measurements of progress are based on access to clean renewable energy in Buncombe County, N.C. The City of Asheville strongly supports approval of the proposed 5 MW solar project on a retired Buncombe County landfill in Woodfin, NC.

The City of Asheville values and supports Duke Energy's promise to the Asheville community through their Modernization Plan, in connection with closure of the Asheville coal plant, to replace it with a new gas plant, 15 MW of solar, 5 MW of battery storage, and a partnership with the City and County to reduce peak demand to delay or eliminate the need for a new peaker plant.

Specifically, the support of Duke Energy's solar project helps the City of Asheville achieve:

1. Buncombe County's community-wide 100% renewable energy goal to be achieved by 2042 and their 100% renewable energy goal for municipal operations by 2030,
2. The City of Asheville's climate emergency response supporting the need for clean renewable energy for Asheville residents to develop a climate resilience strategy that will allow the City and community members to adapt and become more resilient to climate change,
3. The City of Asheville, Buncombe County and Duke Energy's partnership to transition the region to a cleaner, smart energy future rooted in community engagement and collaboration that is mutually beneficial to the community and Duke Energy.

As a partner of Buncombe County and Duke Energy Progress' commitments to Western North Carolina's Modernization Project, the City of Asheville asks that Duke Energy's commitment to the installation of renewable energy on Buncombe County's retired landfill be honored.
