BY THE CHAIRMAN: On March 15, 2018, Prior Construction Company, Inc. (Prior or Applicant) filed an application with the Commission seeking authority to increase its rates for water utility service in Deerfield Park, Paynes Park Landing, and Little John Acres Subdivisions in Wake County, North Carolina. Prior presently serves approximately 213 residential customers. The present rates have been in effect since January 1, 2017, when they were adjusted due to implementation of House Bill 998 (Session Law 2013-316), in Docket No. M-100, Sub 138, and Docket No. W-567, Sub 7. The last rates established in a general rate case were in Docket No. W-567, Sub 6, on February 12, 2007.

The Applicant's present and proposed rates are as follows:

The proposed rates would increase the average residential monthly water bill from \$21.73 to \$39.87, an 83.5% increase, based on an average monthly usage of 4,300 gallons.

On April 10, 2018, the Commission issued an Order Establishing General Rate Case, Suspending Rates, Scheduling Hearing, and Requiring Customer Notice (the Order). The Order required the Applicant to provide notice to all customers affected by the proposed new rates no later than 30 days after the date of the Order. It has come to the attention of the Commission that customer notice was not provided within 30 days of the Order, May 10, 2018, nor has customer notice been provided thereafter.

Moreover, the Order provided that the hearing, which is scheduled for July 18, 2018, was subject to cancellation if no significant protests were received subsequent to public notice on or before May 25, 2018. Since customers did not receive notice by the May 10, 2018, as required by the Order, there was no meaningful opportunity to submit protests to the proposed rates prior to May 25, 2018. Thus, the Chairman is of the opinion that cancellation of the hearing is not appropriate in this circumstance.

The Order set the deadline to file a petition to intervene in the general rate case for May 25, 2018, based on the assumption that customers had received notice by May 10, 2018. Since customers did not receive notice by May 10, 2018, as required by the Order, there was no meaningful opportunity to file a petition to intervene by May 25, 2018. Thus, the Chairman is of the opinion that the date to file a petition to intervene should be extended until July 6, 2018, being at least 10 days before the hearing.

Based upon the foregoing, the Chairman finds and concludes that notice of this proceeding should be given to all affected customers; therefore, a new order requiring customer notice should be issued. Further, the Chairman finds and concludes that since customers did not receive notice by May 10, 2018 as required by the Order, the hearing scheduled for Wednesday, July 18, 2018, should be held as scheduled and the deadline to file a petition to intervene should be extended to July 6, 2018.

## IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That the Notice to Customers, attached as Appendix A, shall be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered by the Applicant to all customers affected by the proposed new rates; that the Notice to Customers shall be mailed or hand delivered no later than five business days after the date of this Order; and that the Applicant submit to the Commission the attached Certificate of Service, properly signed and notarized, not later seven business days after the date of this Order.
- 2. That the public hearing scheduled for 7:00 p.m., on Wednesday, July 18, 2018, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina shall be held as scheduled.
- 3. That an officer or representative of the Applicant is required to appear in person before the Commission at the time and place of the hearing to testify concerning any of the information contained in the application. If the Applicant desires to cross-examine any witnesses at the hearing, the Applicant shall be represented by legal counsel at this hearing.

4. That persons desiring to intervene in the matter as formal parties of record shall file a motion under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-6, R1-7, and R1-19 no later than July 6, 2018. Any such motion shall be filed with the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300.

However, any rate structure considered will not generate more overall revenues than requested.

The present water rates have been in effect since January 1, 2017. The last rates established in a general rate case were in Docket No. W-567, Sub 6, by Commission Order issued on February 12, 2007. The proposed rates would increase the average residential monthly water bill from \$21.73 to \$39.87, an 83.5% increase, based on an average monthly usage of 4,300 gallons.
