NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on March 16, 2015, SADBROOK Solar Farm, LLC (Applicant), filed an application seeking a certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to G.S. 62-110.1(a) for construction of a 4.99-MW solar generating facility to be located on S College Street in Clarkton, Bladen County, North Carolina. The Applicant plans to sell the electricity to Duke Energy Progress, Inc.

If no complaint is received within the time specified above and if the Commission does not order a hearing upon its own initiative, the Commission will enter an order awarding the certificate sought by the Applicant.
