BY THE CHAIRMAN: On February 26, 2009, the Commission issued its Order Resolving Certain Issues, Requesting Information on Unsettled Matters, and Allowing Proposed Rider to Become Effective Subject to Refund in the above-captioned docket. That Order required, among other things, Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (Duke) to provide supplemental information and calculations regarding eight cost and incentive scenarios. All parties were to file comments on Duke's supplemental information by May 1, 2009, and Duke was to file its reply comments by May 18, 2009.

On March 31, 2009, Duke filed its required supplemental information.

On April 29, 2009, the Attorney General filed a motion requesting an extension of time from May 1, 2009, to May 22, 2009, for all parties to file comments regarding Duke's supplemental information and from May 18, 2009, to June 12, 2009, for Duke to file its reply comments. That motion was granted by Order issued May 6, 2009.

On May 21, 2009, the Public Staff, the Southern Environmental Law Center (SELC), Environmental Defense Fund (EDF), Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), and Southern Alliance for Clean Energy (SACE) filed a joint motion requesting an extension of time from May 22, 2009, to May 29, 2009, for all parties to file comments regarding Duke's supplemental information and from June 12, 2009, to June 19, 2009, for Duke to file its reply comments. That motion was granted by Order issued May 22, 2009.

On May 28, 2009, the Public Staff, SELC, EDF, NRDC, and SACE filed a joint motion requesting an additional extension of time from May 29, 2009, to June 8, 2009, for all parties to file comments regarding Duke's supplemental information and from June 19, 2009, to June 29, 2009, for Duke to file its reply comments. Movants state that they have had discussions with Duke relating to settlement of the outstanding issues in this docket and that this additional extension of time will allow those discussions to continue. Movants assert that Duke does not object to this request. That motion was granted by Order issued May 28, 2009.

On June 8, 2009, the Public Staff filed a motion requesting an additional extension of time from June 8, 2009, to June 12, 2009, for all parties to file comments regarding Duke's supplemental information and from June 29, 2009, to July 6, 2009, for Duke to file its reply comments. Movants state that they have had discussions with Duke relating to settlement of the outstanding issues in this docket and that this additional extension of time will allow those discussions to continue.

The Chairman finds good cause to grant the requested extension of time.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:


1. That the deadline by which parties may file comments on Duke's supplemental information shall be, and hereby is, extended to and including June 12, 2009; and

2. That the deadline for Duke to file reply comments shall be, and hereby is, extended to and including July 6, 2009.
