It would have been nice if our county commissioners had gotten the community involved during this process but bam there it was and then the water line/waste line came out of no where. This line will run by our house.

We are concerned about the following. The NOISE we are already subjected to the noise of the Gas Plant and the Duke Energy Plant which can wake you up at night and spoil your enjoyment at our rural area. The pollution we put up with the gas plant and its diesel generators where you can't breathe outside and the unknown pollution of the current plant plus we get the down wind, air of Belews Creek according to what I find about cancer rates in North Carolina, Rockingham County has the highest county rate in the state.

The water this plant will use we have heard 5 million gallons 3.8 million gallons and on average of 1.7 million gallons.
