

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing in the annual Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard (REPS) cost recovery application and 2019 REPS compliance report filed on February 25, 2020, by Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC), in the above-captioned docket. The public hearing has been scheduled to begin immediately following the hearings in Docket Nos. E-7, Subs 1228 and 1230, which are scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m., on Tuesday, June 9, 2020, in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. This proceeding is being held pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-133.8 and Commission Rule R8-67 to consider DEC's application for approval of REPS cost recovery and compliance with the REPS requirements during the 2019 calendar year. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

On February 25, 2020, DEC filed direct testimony and exhibits in support of its application for REPS cost recovery and 2019 REPS compliance report. By its application, DEC proposes to implement the following monthly REPS rates, not including regulatory fee, effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2020: a \$0.78 charge for residential customers; a \$3.84 charge for general service and lighting customers; and a \$18.51 charge for industrial customers. DEC's proposed new monthly REPS rates, if approved, will result in the following decreases to DEC's current monthly REPS rates, not including regulatory fee: (\$0.09) for residential customers; (\$0.80) for general service and lighting customers; and (\$2.73) for industrial customers.

Specific information about DEC's application for approval of REPS cost recovery and 2019 REPS compliance report may be obtained from the Office of the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, Raleigh, North Carolina, where a copy of DEC's REPS cost recovery application and 2019 REPS compliance report are available for review by the public, and on the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net.

The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any information that the writers wish to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of the matter.
