10	MR. SAILLOR: I'm Scott Saillor with the
11	Energy Division. Electric Item P2 is a Petition filed
12	by New River Light and Power requesting approval of a
13	Renewable Energy Rider. The Rider will allow New
14	River to offer its customers the option to purchase
15	blocks of energy from renewable energy resources.
16	Each block will cost participating customers an
17	additional \$5.00 per month, and for the initial year
18	of the program each block is anticipated to equate to
19	250 kilowatt hours per month. Participation in the
20	Rider will be voluntary and will not change New
21	River's base rates and charges approved by the
22	Commission which will continue to be paid by all
23	customers. Renewable energy purchased pursuant to the
24	Rider will displace energy that would have otherwise

been purchased pursuant to New River's wholesale power supply contract.

At the end of each calendar year, New River will perform a true-up to determine the block size for the following year. The annual true-up process will ensure that only revenue received from participating customers under the Rider will be used to pay the renewable energy cost differential incurred by New River. The true-up will not result in bill adjustments for customers. As part of the true-up process, New River will file reports of participation detailing program participation, lot size adjustments, and renewable energy purchases.

New River is requesting that the Rider become effective on July 15, 2021, to enable new customers opening accounts prior to the beginning of the academic year of Appalachian State University to be eligible to participate in the Program.

The Public Staff has reviewed New River's request and recommends that the Commission issue our proposed order approving the Renewable Energy Rider with the conditions that New River included in its marketing materials that the expected block size may differ from the actual block size, and also include in

marketing materials the type of generation resource it intends to purchase.

And I believe Gray Styers and Ed Miller are logged in as attendees and they are representing the Company if the Commission has any questions for them.

CHAIR MITCHELL: Thank you, Mr. Saillor.

The Commission does have several questions. I'll direct them to you and if the Applicant is available to answer we'll take answers from the Applicant as well.

Does Public Staff understand how many customers are expected to participate in this -- in the Program each year? Mr. Saillor?

MR. SAILLOR: Yes. They did conduct a survey that indicated a certain percentage of their customers would participate. They did not provide an exact number as to how many they expected.

CHAIR MITCHELL: Okay. Is there a cap on the number of customers that can participate each year?

MR. SAILLOR: No, there is not.

CHAIR MITCHELL: Okay. Is there a cap or is there a discrete amount of renewable energy that New River can procure each year under its contract?

voluntary \$5.00 extra to approximate the difference between what the non-renewable cost of energy would be and a renewable energy that they are purchasing from a specific supplier that they have a contract negotiated and ready to execute if this is approved.

There's also a very large block that New River's largest customer Appalachian State has committed to and can purchase less than that. But basically if someone stops payment then that amount of money would not go towards the purchase of any further additional renewable energy, but there's no disconnection, there's no right of disconnection whatsoever if they stop payment.

One way of looking at this is really, it's going to be on the aggregate basis. The number of customers that we feel like from customer surveys, it was fully well received and well subscribed to, but you really need to look at this kind of on an aggregate basis. You know, it's not as though any individual kilowatt hour is going to any individual meter. The customers in New River on an aggregate basis, you know, if those who want to participate in the purchase of blocks, total up to 12,000 plus additional, can contribute an additional \$5.00 a month

towards that purchase. So a certain percentage of New River's energy comes from a renewable resource rather than from a fossil fuel resource.

I hope that answers your question as I understand it. If not, I'll be happy to see if Mr. Miller can provide additional information.

I'm clear, Mr. Styers. So, if a customer commits and then pulls out before it's honored its commitment or made its payment in full, what happens to -- how does New River handle the balance? You know, the balance on the contract with the renewable energy supplier I guess really is the question.

MR. STYERS: Yeah, basically it is looking at it on an aggregate annual basis. There'll be a true-up at the end of '23 -- I mean, beginning of '23 there'll be a true-up. And so the amount that's actually in the block, we had anticipated it would be 250. It could be 247 kilowatt hours. It could be 253. It would affect the actual size of the block at the time of the true-up.

MR. STYERS: That is correct. And we have done modeling that we have provided the Public Staff to show how we came up with that amount, and we do think that that should be sufficient for that size block, subject to the true-up which adjust that 250 kilowatt hours slightly at the end of the year.

COMMISSIONER DUFFLEY: And is there a cap on the administrative cost? You know, similar-type programs will say only 25 percent of the \$5.00 will go toward administrative cost. Does your program plan have a cap on that admin cost?

MR. STYERS: (Inaudible).

COMMISSIONER DUFFLEY: You're on mute.
