MOTION OF
THE PUBLIC STAFF
FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

NOW COMES THE PUBLIC STAFF – North Carolina Utilities Commission (Public Staff), by and through its Executive Director, Christopher J. Ayers, and respectfully moves the North Carolina Utilities Commission (Commission) to extend the deadline for the filing of proposed orders and briefs in the above-captioned docket. In support of this motion, the Public Staff respectfully shows the Commission the following:

- 1. On January 28, 2020, American Beech Solar LLC (Applicant) filed an application pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-110.1 and Commission Rule R8-63 for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct a 110-MW<sub>AC</sub> solar photovoltaic electric generating facility to be located in Halifax County, North Carolina.<sup>1</sup>
- 2. Most recently in this docket, on August 26, 2022, the Commission issued its Order Requiring Proposed Orders, requiring that the parties to the

proceeding file proposed orders or briefs on or before 30 days from the issuance of the Order. This deadline for proposed orders falls on September 26, 2022.<sup>2</sup>

- 3. Because of the press of other ongoing dockets and deadlines, the Public Staff requires additional time to prepare a proposed order. A one-week extension would provide the Public Staff with sufficient time to thoroughly review the record in this proceeding and draft a proposed order for the Commission's consideration.
- 4. The Public Staff therefore requests that the Commission extend the deadline for all parties to file proposed orders or briefs by one week, to October 3, 2022.
- 6. The Public Staff has contacted counsel for the Applicant and is authorized to represent that the Applicant would consent to an extension.

WHEREFORE, the Public Staff respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order extending the deadline for the filing of proposed orders or briefs to October 3, 2022.
