

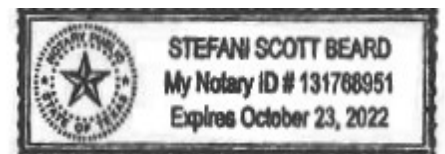

The net effect of DEC's request as filed would increase the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month by \$8.09, excluding the regulatory fee.

On March 14, 2022, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearing, Requiring Filing of Testimony, Establishing Discovery Guidelines, and Requiring Public Notice (Scheduling Order). Among other things, the Scheduling Order required the Company to publish notice in a newspaper or newspapers having general circulation in its service area once a week for two consecutive weeks beginning at least 45 days prior to the hearing.

On May 8, 2022, DEC filed supplemental testimony and exhibits after the Public Notice of the original proposed fuel charges had been published. In its filing, DEC revised its proposed monthly fuel rates. The revisions, if approved by the Commission, would result in fuel charges higher than the charges noticed in the original Public Notice. In the case of the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month, DEC revised its proposed increase to \$8.86, excluding the regulatory fee.
