BY THE CHAIR: On June 11, 2020, in the above-captioned proceeding, the Commission issued its Order Denying Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for Merchant Generating Facility.

On August 10, 2020, Friesian Holdings, LLC, the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association, and the North Carolina Clean Energy Business Alliance (Movants), each filed notices of appeal and exceptions to the 11 June 2020 Order.

On September 9, 2020, Movants filed a Motion for an Extension of Time to Serve the Proposed Record on Appeal pursuant to Rules 18(d)(2) and 27(c) of the North Carolina Rules of Appellate Procedure seeking an additional 30 days within which to serve the proposed record on other parties in this proceeding. Movants explain that due to the workload of the attorneys involved in the case, the complexity of the issues, and the large record, additional time is required to prepare and serve the proposed record. Movants further represent that they contacted all other parties and that no party objected to the motion.


The Chair finds good cause to grant the requested extension of time.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Movants shall have an additional 30 days, or until October 14, 2020, within which to serve the proposed record on appeal on other parties in this proceeding.
