**Petition to Withdraw or Reject New River Light & Power's Proposal for a Punitive

The undersigned residents of the Town of Boone and members of the Appalachian State University community urge you to withdraw or reject New River Light & Power's request for an additional "administrative" charge of \$8.25 per month (or \$99 per year) against solar customers in the Town of Boone and instead support beginning the process of replacing the utility's "forced sale" policy for solar, which has long restricted the ability of Boone residents and businesses to go solar, and stifled development of the rooftop solar industry in our town. Specifically, we urge that you:

1. Withdraw or reject NRLP's request to impose a \$8.25 monthly fee on customers in the town of Boone who choose to install solar;
2. Replace NRLP's "forced sale" (also referred to as a "buy all, sell all") policy for solar customers, which prevents them from using their own homegrown electricity and discourages solar investment, with a policy that encourages customer-owned generation and is consistent with the Town of Boone's Community Climate Action Plan, Appalachian State University's Climate Action Plan and the North Carolina Clean Energy Plan;
3. Provide ample opportunity for public input from members of our community on the anticipated Cost of Service Study and any new solar policy that NRLP plans to develop in the year ahead.

When we didn't actually receive that amount, Ed Miller's explanation was that we would be paid "an average of 5.9 cents... based on high credit during our peak months and a lesser credit during all non peak months." After one year of generating electricity for NRLP, our actual average paid was \$0.053 per kwh. NRLP's metering has also consistently lagged the actual generation logged by our system. In 2019, NRLP eliminated the demand credit, significantly reducing the amount we are paid for what we generate. Ed Miller blamed this on the reduction in energy costs and justified it by saying that the 10% reduction that year in consumer rates charged for consumed power would balance the loss in generation credit, but our reduction for what we generated was nearly 50%, not 10%. In short, NRLP has consistently changed the rules unilaterally to the disadvantage of solar customers, so it's time for the "buy all, sell all" arrangement to change, too, this time to our advantage. If NRLP isn't willing to make the long overdue and necessary changes, and if it continues to disincentivize solar generation in Boone and Watauga County, then both NRLP and ASU need to stop parading around with that sustainability feather in their public relations cap. It's a farce, and their handling of customer-generated solar energy is irresponsible in a world that is teetering on the edge of survival because of unrestrained, human-triggered climate change. Sticking to their current system and adding a solar-specific administrative charge to boot is both insulting and unconscionable.</p>
