MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

PURSUANT TO NCUC Rule R1-7, the Southern Environmental Law Center ("SELC"), through counsel, files this motion for extension of time. In support of its motion, SELC states as follows:

1. SELC is filing a contemporaneous petition to intervene in this proceeding.

2. Dominion North Carolina Power ("DNCP"), Duke Energy Carolinas ("Duke"), and Progress Energy Carolinas ("PEC") (collectively, the "IOUs") filed Integrated Resource Plans ("IRPs") on September 1, 2009.

3. On October 19, 2009, the Commission entered an order setting filing deadlines of December 11, 2009 for direct testimony of the IOUs, February 12, 2009 for direct testimony of intervenors and the Public Staff, and March 5, 2009 for rebuttal testimony of the IOUs. The Commission also scheduled an evidentiary hearing to commence March 16, 2010.

4. Duke filed a motion for extension of time until January 11, 2010 to file its 2009 Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard ("REPS") Compliance Plan, revisions to its 2009 IRP, and direct testimony and exhibits in support of its 2008 and 2009 IRPs. The Commission granted Duke's motion by order entered December 4, 2009.

5. DNCP and PEC filed direct testimony in support of their IRPs on December 11, 2009.

Duke filed its 2009 REPS Compliance Plan, revisions to its 2009 IRP, and direct testimony and exhibits in support of its 2008 and 2009 IRPs on January 11, 2010.

7. This proceeding involves numerous complex and technical issues, and the IRPs, supporting testimony and exhibits number in the thousands of pages.

8. Counsel for SELC has consulted with other parties to this proceeding regarding their position on an extension of time until February 19, 2010 for intervenors to file direct testimony, and until March 9, 2010 for the IOUs to file rebuttal testimony. The Attorney General, Carolina Industrial Groups for Fair Utility Rates, Carolina Utility Customer Association, DNCP, Duke, Fayetteville Public Works Commission, N.C. Waste Awareness and Reduction Network, PEC, and the Public Staff have indicated that they do not oppose the requested extension.

9. The proposed extension of time would allow intervenors a fair opportunity to present their analysis of the IRPs to the Commission, would not impose an undue inconvenience or hardship on other parties or the Commission, and would not require any change in the evidentiary hearing date.

WHEREFORE, SELC prays that the Commission extend the time for filing intervenor direct testimony in this docket until February 12, 2010, and extend the time for filing rebuttal testimony until March 9, 2010.
