BY THE COMMISSION: On October 6, 2015, the Commission issued an Order granting North 301 Solar, LLC (Applicant), a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-110.1(a) for construction of a 20-MW solar generating facility to be located at 15919 Highway 301, near Enfield, Halifax County, North Carolina. Applicant plans to sell the electricity to Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy North Carolina.

On September 12, 2018, Applicant filed an amended CPCN application. In summary, Applicant states that it has added two parcels of land to the facility site, and made additional changes to the equipment configuration. In addition, Applicant filed updated site maps correcting survey errors in the original site map.

On the basis of the amended application, the Commission concludes that Applicant should be required (1) to publish notice of the application in the manner required by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-82(a) and file an affidavit of publication with the Commission and (2) to mail a copy of the application and notice, no later than the first date that such notice is published, to the electric utility to which Applicant plans to sell and distribute the electricity and file a signed and verified certificate of service that the application and notice have been provided to the utility. The Chief Clerk of the Commission will deliver copies of the notice to the Clearinghouse Coordinator of the Office of Policy and Planning of the Department of Administration for distribution by the Coordinator to State agencies having an interest in the application.

If a complaint is received within ten days after the last date of the publication of the notice, the Commission will schedule a public hearing to determine whether a certificate should be awarded, will give reasonable notice of the time and place of the hearing to Applicant and to each complaining party, and will require Applicant to publish notice of the hearing in the newspaper in which the notice of the application was published. If no complaint is received within the time specified above, the Commission may, upon its own initiative, order and schedule a hearing to determine whether a certificate should be awarded. If the Commission orders a hearing upon its own initiative, it will require notice of the hearing to be published by Applicant in the newspaper in which the notice of the

application was published. If no complaint is received within the time specified and the Commission does not order a hearing upon its own initiative, the Commission will enter an order awarding the certificate.

The Commission cannot take any action until after Applicant has filed both the affidavit of publication and the certificate of service. Pursuant to Commission Rule R8-64(c)(2), the Commission will automatically dismiss the application, without prejudice to refile, if Applicant does not file the affidavit of publication and certificate of service within twelve months of the date of this Order.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That Applicant shall publish the Public Notice, attached as Attachment A hereto, once each week for four successive weeks in the manner required by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-82(a) and shall file an affidavit of publication with the Commission;
- 2. That Applicant shall mail a copy of the application and notice, no later than the first date that such notice is published, to the electric utility to which the Applicant plans to sell and distribute the electricity and file a signed and verified certificate of service that the application and notice have been provided to the utility;
- 3. That the Chief Clerk of the Utilities Commission will deliver copies of the amended application and Public Notice to the Clearinghouse Coordinator of the Office of Policy and Planning of the Department of Administration for distribution by the Coordinator to State agencies having an interest in the application;
- 4. That based on the existing CPCN Applicant may proceed with construction of the facility on the land initially identified as the project site;
- 5. That Applicant shall not commence construction on the two new parcels of land until the Commission issues an amended CPCN, or otherwise authorizes such construction;
- 6. That the Commission will proceed as it deems appropriate after the filing of the affidavit of publication and the certificate of service.
