NOW COMES Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC ("DEC"), pursuant to Rule R1-7 of the North Carolina Utilities Commission's (the "Commission") Rules and Regulations, and respectfully moves for a two-week extension of time to file its response to interventions, protests, and comments filed in the above-captioned docket. In support of this motion, DEC shows the following:

- 1. On August 16, 2022, DEC filed an application for approval of its Electric Vehicle-to-Grid Pilot Program ("Application").
- 2. On September 13, 2022, the Public Staff filed a Motion for Extension of Time, seeking an extension until November 14, 2022 to file its comments on this application, which was granted by Commission *Order Granting Extension of Time* issued on September 16, 2022.
- 3. On November 14, 2022, Vote Solar filed a Petition to Intervene and Comments.
 - 4. Also on November 14, 2022, the Public Staff filed Comments.

- 5. DEC respectfully requests a 2-week extension of time, to and including December 12, 2022, to work with the Public Staff on developing a reporting framework, as suggested in the Public Staff's comments.
- 6. Counsel for Vote Solar and the Public Staff have indicated that they do not object to this motion.
 - 7. The requested extension will not result in prejudice to any party.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth above, DEC respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order granting an extension of time to and including December 12, 2022, to file its response to the comments filed by the Public Staff and Vote Solar in this matter and for such other relief as the Commission deems just and proper.
