BY THE CHAIRMAN: On June 22, 2018, the Commission issued an Order Accepting Stipulation, Deciding Contested Issues and Requiring Revenue Reduction (Rate Order) in the above-captioned dockets authorizing Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC (DEC) to adjust its rates and charges for retail electric service in North Carolina.

On July 20, 2018, the AGO filed a notice of appeal and exceptions to the Rate Order. On July 23, 2018, the North Carolina Justice Center, North Carolina Housing

Coalition, Natural Resources Defense Council, and Southern Alliance for Clean Energy (N.C. Justice et al.) filed a notice of appeal. On the same date, Sierra Club and the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association (NCSEA) filed notices of appeal. On August 8, 2018, the Public Staff – North Carolina Utilities Commission (Public Staff) filed a notice of cross appeal and exceptions.

On August 15, 2018, the AGO filed a Motion for Extension of Time to Serve Proposed Record on Appeal. In summary, the AGO states that the current deadline for serving the proposed record on appeal is August 24, 2018. The AGO indicates that the deadline may be extended by the Commissioner for up to thirty days pursuant to Rules 18(f) and 27(c)(1) of the North Carolina Rules of Appellate Procedure. Due to other workload of the attorneys involved in the case, the complexity of the issues, the many parties, and the large record, the AGO requests an additional 30 days to and including September 24, 2018, for any party to serve the proposed record on appeal. Finally, the AGO states that DEC, N.C. Justice et al., NCSEA and the Public Staff do not object to the requested extension of time, and no other party objected to the requested extension after notification via email.

Based on the AGO's motion and the record, the Chairman finds good cause to grant the requested extension of time.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED that the time for serving the proposed record on appeal shall be, and is hereby, extended to September 24, 2018.
