NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing in the annual fuel and fuel-related adjustment charge proceeding for Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP or Campany). The public hearing has been scheduled to begin at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 14, 2022, in Cammission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. This proceeding is being held pursuant to the provisions of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.2 and Commission Rule R8-55 for the purpose of determining whether an increment or decrement rider is required to reflect changes in fuel and fuel-related costs over or under the base fuel rate established for DEP in its last general rate case. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

On June 14, 2022, DEP filed its application and testimony relative to the fuel cost proceeding. By its application, DEP requests Commission approval for an increase in its fuel and fuel-related costs currently in effect, with the changes being effective for service rendered on or after December 1, 2022. The net effect of DEP's request as filed would increase the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours (kWh) per month by \$9.74, excluding the regulatory fee.

On July 8, 2022, the Commission issued an Order Scheduling Hearing, Requiring Filing of Testimony, Establishing Discovery Guidelines, and Requiring Public Notice (Scheduling Order). Among other things, the Scheduling Order required the Company to publish notice in a newspaper or newspapers having general circulation in its service area once a week for two successive weeks beginning at least 45 days perior to the hearing.

On August 12, 2022, DEP filed supplemental testimony and exhibits after the Public Notice of the original proposed fuel charges had been published, revising its proposed monthly fuel rates. The revisions, if approved by the Commission, would result in the present fuel and fuel-related rates, excluding regulatory fee, to increase by 1.0860 cents/kWh for residential customers, 1.2490 cents/kWh for small general service customers, 0.7620 cents/kWh for medium general service customers, 0.5090 cents/kWh for large general service customers, and 2.1920 cents/kWh for lighting customers.

Proposed changes in all customers' fuel rider rates would be effective for service rendered on and after December 1, 2022.
