B. <u>NATURAL GAS</u>

P1. DOCKET NO. G-5, SUB 596 - APPLICATION OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF NORTH CAROLINA, INC., FOR AN ADJUSTMENT OF ITS RATES AND CHARGES TO TRACK CHANGES IN ITS WHOLESALE COST OF GAS

EXPLANATION: On October 18, 2018, Public Service Company of North Carolina, Inc. (PSNC or Company), filed an application, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.4, Commission Rule R1-17(k)(3)(a), and PSNC's Rider D, requesting authority to increase its sales rates by \$0.2524 per dekatherm (dt) and its transportation rates by \$0.0024 per dt effective November 1, 2018. The increase is a result of a change in PSNC's Benchmark Commodity Cost of Gas from \$3.00 per dt to \$3.25 per dt, as well as the change in the company use and unaccounted for gas as described in PSNC's Rider D.

The Public Staff has reviewed the proposed rate changes and recommends approval as filed.

EXHIBIT: A copy of the proposed order is attached as Exhibit No. P-1.

RECOMMENDATION: (Patel) That the Commission issue the proposed order approving PSNC's proposed rate changes as filed.

P2. DOCKET NO. G-9, SUBS 732 AND 733 – APPLICATION OF PIEDMONT NATURAL GAS COMPANY, INC., FOR APPROVAL OF BI-ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT OF RATES UNDER APPENDIX C OF ITS SERVICE REGULATIONS; AND APPLICATION OF PIEDMONT NATURAL GAS COMPANY, INC., FOR AN ADJUSTMENT OF ITS RATES AND CHARGES TO TRACK CHANGES IN ITS WHOLESALE COSTS OF GAS

EXPLANATION: On October 18, 2018, Piedmont Natural Gas Company, Inc. (Piedmont), filed an application pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.4, Commission Rule R1-17(k)(3), Appendices A & C of Piedmont's North Carolina Service Regulations and the terms of its approved settlement in Docket No. G-9, Sub 631. Piedmont filed for approval to adjust rates effective November 1, 2018, reflecting (1) a change in its Margin Decoupling Tracker (MDT) Deferred Account and (2) an increase in its Benchmark Commodity Cost of Gas.

Piedmont proposes to decrease the increment in its rates for Residential Service and increase the decrement in its rates for Small General Service and Medium General Service pursuant to the terms of its MDT mechanism set forth as Appendix C to its Service Regulations, which is based on the MDT Deferred Account balances as of August 31, 2018.

The proposed MDT temporaries, as well as the existing MDT temporaries and the corresponding rate changes, expressed in dollars per dekatherm (\$/dt), are as follows:

Piedmont also proposes to seek Commission approval to increase its sales rates by \$0.2547 per dekatherm (dt) and its transportation rates by \$0.0047 per dt effective November 1, 2018. The increases are the result of a change in its Benchmark Commodity Gas Cost from \$2.75 per dt to \$3.00 per dt, as well as the change in the company use and unaccounted for gas as described in Piedmont's Appendix A.

The Public Staff has reviewed these proposed rate adjustments and recommends approval as filed.

RECOMMENDATION: (Naba/Jayasheela) That the Commission issue the proposed order approving Piedmont's proposed rate changes as filed.

E. <u>WATER</u>

P1. <u>DOCKET NO. W-218, SUB 508 – AQUA NORTH CAROLINA, INC. – REQUEST FOR TARIFF REVISION</u>

EXPLANATION: On August 31, 2018, Aqua North Carolina, Inc. (Aqua), filed a verified petition, pursuant to G.S. 62-133.11, with the Commission requesting authority to amend its tariff for the purpose of passing along to its water customers in fifty subdivisions in Johnston County an increase in the cost of purchasing water service from Johnston County Department of Public Utilities (County).

Effective July 1, 2018, the County increased its rates charged to Aqua by \$0.12 per 1,000 gallons from \$2.28 per 1,000 gallons to \$2.40 per 1,000 gallons.

Aqua's current rates have been in effect since February 21, 2018, when they were approved by the Commission in its Order Approving Tariff Revision issued in Docket No. W-218, Sub 493. After taking into account the effect of the 0.14% regulatory fee, Aqua has requested authority to increase its water usage rates from \$2.33 to \$2.45 per 1,000 gallons to reflect the increase in the cost of purchasing water service from the County.

The Public Staff has reviewed Aqua's petition and recommends that the requested tariff revision be approved. The Public Staff is of the opinion that the tariff revision will allow Aqua to recover additional revenues that do not exceed the additional expenses.

Under the new rates, the average residential customer's monthly water bill will increase by \$0.65, from \$29.57 to \$30.17 based upon 5,000 gallons usage.

BY THE COMMISSION: On October 18, 2018, Public Service Company of North Carolina, Inc. (PSNC or Company), filed an application, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.4, Commission Rule R1-17(k)(3)(a), and PSNC's Rider D, requesting authority to increase its sales rates by \$0.2524 per dekatherm (dt) and its transportation rates by \$0.0024 per dt effective November 1, 2018. The increase is a result of a change in PSNC's Benchmark Commodity Cost of Gas from \$3.00 per dt to \$3.25 per dt, as well as the change in the company use and unaccounted for gas as described in PSNC's Rider D.

The Public Staff presented this matter to the Commission at its October 29, 2018, Regular Staff Conference. The Public Staff stated that it had reviewed the proposed rate changes and recommended approval as filed.

Based upon review of the application and the recommendation of the Public Staff, the Commission is of the opinion that the proposed rate changes should be allowed to become effective as filed.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That PSNC is allowed to increase its sales rates by \$0.2524 per dekatherm effective for service rendered on and after November 1, 2018.
- 2. That PSNC is allowed to increase its transportation rates by \$0.0024 per dekatherm effective for service rendered on and after November 1, 2018.
- 3. That PSNC shall file revised tariffs consistent with Ordering Paragraphs 1 and 2 within five (5) days of the date of this Order.

Piedmont also requested authority to increase its sales rates by \$0.2547 per dekatherm (dt) and its transportation rates by \$0.0047 per dt effective November 1, 2018. The increases are the result of a change in its Benchmark Commodity Gas Cost from \$2.75 per dt to \$3.00 per dt, as well as the change in the company use and unaccounted for gas as described in Piedmont's Appendix A.

- 2. That Piedmont is authorized to increase its sales rates by \$0.2547 per dt effective for service rendered on and after November 1, 2018.
- 3. That Piedmont is authorized to increase its transportation rates by \$0.0047 per dt effective for service rendered on and after November 1, 2018.
- 4. That Piedmont shall file its revised tariffs consistent with Ordering Paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 within five (5) days of the date of this Order.

BY THE COMMISSION: On August 31, 2018, Aqua North Carolina, Inc. (Aqua), filed a verified petition, pursuant to G.S. 62-133.11, with the Commission requesting authority to amend its tariff for the purpose of passing along to its water customers in fifty subdivisions in Johnston County an increase in the cost of purchasing water service from Johnston County Department of Public Utilities (County).

The Public Staff is of the opinion that the tariff revision will allow Aqua to recover additional revenues that do not exceed the additional expenses.

Based upon the foregoing, the Commission finds that Aqua should be allowed to pass through the costs associated with the increased purchased water expense.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That Aqua North Carolina, Inc., is granted a revision to Appendix A-2 of its tariff for water utility service in fifty subdivisions in Johnston County in which it purchases and resells water from Johnston County Department of Public Utilities, as set forth herein.
- 2. That the revised Appendix A-2 attached hereto is approved and is deemed filed with the Commission pursuant to G.S. 62-138. This Schedule of Rates shall become effective for service rendered on and after the date of this Order.
- 3. That the Notice to Customers, attached hereto as Appendix B, be mailed with sufficient postage or hand delivered by Aqua to all of its affected customers in the thirty-five subdivisions contemporaneously with the next billing of customers; and that Aqua submit to the Commission the attached Certificate of Service, properly signed and notarized, no later than 10 days after the date of the next billing.

Aqua filed a verified petition, pursuant to G.S. 62-133.11, with the Commission on August 31, 2018, requesting authority to amend its tariff for the purpose of passing along to its water customers, the July 1, 2018, increase in the cost of purchasing water service from Johnston County Department of Public Utilities.

The new rates for water utility service are as follows:

	Old	New

Usage charge per 1,000 gallons	\$ 2.33	\$ 2.45

Under the new rates, the average residential customer's monthly water bill will increase by \$0.65, from \$28.92 to \$29.57 based upon 5,000 gallons usage.

The Public Staff – North Carolina Utilities Commission (Public Staff) reviewed Aqua's petition and recommended the requested tariff revision be approved. The Public Staff stated that the tariff revision will allow Aqua to recover additional revenues that do not exceed the additional expenses.
