**NCSEA’S MOTION FOR  
EXTENSION OF TIME**

**NCSEA’S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

NOW COMES the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association (“NCSEA”) pursuant to Commission Rule R1-7 and move the North Carolina Utilities Commission (“Commission”) for a six-day extension of time through and including Monday, April 8, 2019, for parties to file comments on *Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC and Duke Energy Progress, LLC’s Compliance Filing* (“Compliance Filing”) in the above-captioned docket, and a corresponding six-day extension of time through and including April 18, 2019 for Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC and Duke Energy Progress, LLC (collectively, “Duke”) to file reply comments. In support of this motion, NCSEA shows the Commission as follows:

1. The Commission’s February 1, 2019 *Order Modifying and Approving Green Source Advantage Program, Requiring Compliance Filing, and Allowing Comments* (“GSA Order”) directed Duke to make a compliance requesting approval of a revised GSA Program that complies with the conclusions reached in the *GSA Order*. Pursuant to the directive in the *GSA Order*, Duke made its Compliance Filing on March 18, 2019.

2. The Commission’s *GSA Order* also directed that within 60 days of the *GSA Order*, which would be April 2, 2019, all parties may, and the Public Staff shall, provide comments on the Compliance Filing. The *GSA Order* further directed that within 70 days

of the *GSA Order*, which would be April 12, 2019, Duke may file reply comments in response to such comments.

3. NCSEA is working diligently on its comments, but the press of other business has resulted in a need for additional time to finalize its filing.

4. For the foregoing reason, NCSEA requests a six-day extension of time for parties to file comments and a corresponding six-day extension of time for Duke to file reply comments. The undersigned counsel has contacted counsel for all parties of record that were involved in the interconnection stakeholder process regarding this motion via telephone and/or electronic mail, and none have advised that they object to this motion.

WHEREFORE, NCSEA respectfully requests that the Commission grant this Motion for a six-day extension of time through and including Monday, April 8, 2019 for parties to file comments on Duke's Compliance Filing and a corresponding six-day extension of time through and including April 18, 2019 for Duke to file reply comments and grant such further relief as the Commission deems just and proper.
