CHAIR MITCHELL: Good morning. Let's go on the record. I'm Charlotte Mitchell, Chair of the Utilities Commission. With me this morning are the following Commissioners: Commissioner Brown-Bland, Commissioner Clodfelter, Commissioner Duffley, Commissioner Hughes, Commissioner McKissick, and Commissioner Kemerait.

In the compliance with the State Government Ethics Act, I remind Members of the Commission of our duty to avoid conflicts of interest and inquire, at this time, as to whether any member of the Commission has a known conflict of interest with respect to any matters coming before us this morning.

COMMISSIONER KEMERAIT: Chair Mitchell, I'll be recusing myself from Item No. 3.

CHAIR MITCHELL: The record will so reflect. Hearing no other conflicts, we'll proceed with Public Staff, Item. 1.

MR. SAILLOR: I'm Scott Saillor with the Public Staff Energy Division. Item 1 is a motion by Western Carolina University for authorization and approval to implement a mid-year supplemental Purchased Power Adjustment. The Public Staff reviewed

24	block of energy for the Renewable Advantage Rider.

The Public Staff recommends that the Commission accept the requested price increase, issue the proposed order. And I will note also that the Company did include in the filing a customer notice, and the Public Staff is also recommending that the Commission accept the public notice.

COMMISSIONER CLODFELTER: Second.

CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and seconded that the item be approved as recommended by the Public Staff. Questions or discussion on motion? Commissioner McKissick.

Do you have any idea how many customers are actually participating in this program, at this time? I know it was indicated that at the onset of the pandemic, there was a drop-off and they took marketing, I guess it was, from an outside entity and brought it in-house. So I was wondering, you know, has that drop-off stabilized or how many customers were there at the program's height compared to where they are today?

MR. LAWRENCE: I don't believe I have the

```
exact numbers in front of me, but I can speak
generally. The enrollments for the first year were
about -- they were protected 8 to 10,000 customers, I
believe, and the numbers have remained fairly steady
since the onset of the program. The issue comes in
where the number of customers was expected to
increase, not remain stagnant. It was expected to
increase fairly substantially over that. And I can't
remember if -- where the enroll is, whether it's above
or below where the initial was, but it's still in the
same area, well below what was expected.
         COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Madam Chair, it
looks like somebody from Duke might have --
         CHAIR MITCHELL: Ms. Fentress, come on up.
         MS. FENTRESS: Good morning. My name
Kendrick Fentress. I'm appearing on behalf of Duke
Energy Carolinas and Duke Energy Progress. I
appreciate the Public Staff addressing that question.
I just have a little bit to add. Public Staff is
entirely correct. The numbers at the outset were in
the 8,000 range for customers. However, last month
for DEC, the number of customers participating in the
program was 4,644. For DEP, 4,942. That's a total of

9,583, if my math is right, so we have seen that

drop-off due to the pandemic.

Additionally, because our costs for marketing had begun to increase, we had not been marketing it as aggressively or robustly as we had before. We have pulled our marketing in-house. It had been done by a third-party. That has helped cut cost, but it does drive the reason we came in and asked for the increase. We're hoping that those numbers will go up once we are able to start marketing again and we get further away from the pandemic. It's something we understand that our customers like, that it's a revenue-neutral program. It's something we give to customers. And the program itself funds itself, but due to the increase in marketing and the drop of customers, that's why we're here for you today.

COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Thank you. Just one quick follow-up, if I could. What are you projecting the rate of increase might be, particularly since, I guess, the average cost per customer is going from like \$12 a month up to \$16?

MS. FENTRESS: That's an excellent point.

We are hopeful that with renewed interest in renewable energy and with the effects of the pandemic waning
