BY THE CHAIR: On February 7, 2022, Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP or Applicant), filed an application pursuant to Article 5A of Chapter 62 of the North Carolina General Statutes for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public convenience and necessity to construct approximately 1.3 miles of new 230 kV transmission line in Chatham County, North Carolina. In summary, DEP's application describes the details of the transmission line and the benefits to be provided by the line. Further, the application is supported by prefiled testimony and a Routing Study and Environmental Report. In addition, the application describes in detail the preferred route for the transmission line. Finally, as required by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-102(c) the application includes a proposed Public Notice that provides a summary of the application.

The Chair is of the opinion that good cause exists to schedule a public witness hearing and an expert witness hearing to consider DEP's application. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-104(b), the Commission may cancel the public witness and expert witness hearings if no significant protests are filed with the Commission. The Chair further concludes that DEP should be required to publish the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in the manner required by N.C.G.S. § 62-102(c) and Commission Rule R8-62(g), and to file an affidavit of publication with the Commission.

### IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That a public witness hearing shall be held on Tuesday, June 7, 2022, at 7:00 p.m., at the Historic Chatham County Courthouse, 9 Hillsboro Street, 2nd Floor, Pittsboro, North Carolina, for the purpose of receiving public witness testimony regarding DEP's application in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g). The Commission reserves the right to limit testimony at the public witness hearing. The public witness hearing may be canceled if no significant protests are filed with the Commission on or before May 18, 2022;

- 2. That a hearing solely for the purpose of receiving expert witness testimony of the parties regarding DEP's application shall be held on Tuesday, June 21, 2022, at 10:00 a.m., in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. *The expert witness hearing may be canceled if no significant protests are filed with the Commission on or before May 18, 2022*;
- 3. That any person having an interest in this proceeding may file a petition to intervene pursuant to Commission Rules R1-5, R1-19, and R8-62(i) stating such interest and may file expert witness testimony on or before Wednesday, May 18, 2022;
- 4. That the direct testimony and exhibits of the Public Staff shall be filed on or before Wednesday, May 18, 2022;
- 5. That DEP may file rebuttal testimony and exhibits on or before Wednesday, May 25, 2022;
- 6. That the Chief Clerk of the Commission shall deliver two copies of the application and the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A to the Clearinghouse Coordinator of the Office of Policy and Planning of the Department of Administration for distribution by the Coordinator to State agencies having an interest in the application;
- 7. That DEP shall publish the Public Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in the manner required by N.C.G.S. § 62-102 and Commission Rule R8-62(g) in newspapers having general circulation in Chatham County;
- 8. That DEP shall file affidavits of publication on or before the date of the public witness hearing; and
- 9. That the parties shall informally and cooperatively conduct discovery and share information about the facts and issues involved in this matter; however, if a discovery issue arises that the parties are unable to resolve, the party seeking information may file a motion to compel with the Commission.

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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on February 7, 2022, Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP or Applicant), filed with the North Carolina Utilities Commission (Commission) an application for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public convenience and necessity to construct approximately 1.3 miles of new 230 kV transmission line in Chatham County, North Carolina.

The preferred route's southern endpoint is a proposed tap of DEP's existing Harris Plant – Siler City 230 kV transmission line, approximately 200 feet southeast of the Bynum Tap 230 kV transmission line. From the southern endpoint, the line is proposed to travel north, paralleling DEP's existing Bynum Tap 230 kV transmission line for approximately 1.1 miles. The proposed line then continues northeast for approximately 0.25 miles into the northern endpoint, the planned substation site, south of Hanks Chapel Road.

The Commission has scheduled the application for a public witness hearing at 7:00 p.m., on June 7, 2022, at the Historic Chatham County Courthouse, 9 Hillsboro Street, Pittsboro, North Carolina. *This hearing may be canceled if no significant protests are received on or before May 18, 2022.* 

Persons desiring to intervene as formal parties of record should file a verified petition under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-103(b) and Commission Rules R1-5, R1-19, and R8-62(i) no later than Wednesday, May 18, 2022. Such a petition should be filed with the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh,

North Carolina 27699-4300. Intervenors shall also file the direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses with the Commission on or before May 18, 2022.

Persons desiring to send written statements to inform the Commission of their position in the matter should address their statements to the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300 and reference Docket No. E-2, Sub 1288. Such written statements will be included in the Commission's official files. If the public hearing is not canceled, however, such written statements cannot be considered competent evidence unless those persons submitting statements appear at a public witness hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their written statements.
