This biannual informational filing is provided to the North Carolina Utilities Commission ("Commission") in accordance with the March 23, 2021, *Order Modifying Solar Rebate Program and Allowing Comments* in the above-captioned dockets. Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC ("DEC") and Duke Energy Progress, LLC ("DEP", collectively "Duke Energy" or the "Companies") make their second biannual informational filing of 2023 for the Solar Rebate Program and request to provide a single, annual report on April 1 for future calendar years.

Overview of the January 2023 Rollover Allocation Period

The goal of the Solar Rebate Program is to provide an economic incentive for residential, non-residential and non-profit customers in North Carolina to adopt solar power by reducing the upfront costs of installing solar equipment. In accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-155(f)(3), the Companies accepted and selected applications through the random selection process beginning on January 11, 2023, for the unsubscribed capacity of 3320 kilowatts that was still available on January 1, 2023. This unsubscribed capacity was available to any customer meeting the rider qualifications without any set-asides. For the final January 2023 rollover allocation, a total of \$1,034,732.00 rebates have been paid, so

far, with an associated installed capacity of approximately 2,604 kilowatts ("kW"). The remaining capacity is fairly evenly divided between DEC and DEP. The waitlists that were established during the January 2023 random selection process will remain until all customers with rebate reservations are paid.

Rejected Applications

In accordance with the program terms and conditions, applications may be rejected for several reasons if they do not meet all the criteria to be eligible for a rebate. The charts below provide detail regarding the number of applications rejected as of January 18, 2023, for the January 2023 Rollover Allocation Period, and reasons those applications were rejected.

Program Costs

The Solar Rebate Program rebate payments and costs are still ongoing for this year. Program costs for the calendar year ending December 31, 2023, will be included in the April 1, 2024, program report. However, as stated above, for the final January 2023 rollover allocation, a total of \$1,034,732.00 rebates have been paid so far, \$21,000.00 to commercial customers and \$1,013,732.00 to residential customers with a total associated installed capacity of approximately 2,604 kilowatts ("kW").

Fraud

No potential instances of fraud were identified within the rebate application

process.

Early Termination

Per the Solar Rebate Rider, the contract period for service under the rider is 10 years from the date of initial participation. An early termination fee applies unless the termination is for good cause or a new customer takes over the site and assumes the previous customer's obligations under the rider. Prior to payment of the rebate, customers must be participating in the Net Metering Rider NM. The Solar Rebate Program team performs a review, typically on a quarterly basis, to ensure all customers paid a rebate have not disconnected their service and are still participating in the Net Metering Rider NM. So far this year, one DEC customer disconnected service, and the succeeding new customer did not submit Transfer of Ownership forms to take service under the Net Metering Rider NM. After the Companies attempted to contact the new customer over time periods exceeding three months, DEC invoked the fee clause under the Solar Rebate Rider. This customer has not yet paid the early termination fee invoiced by the Company.

Future Reports

In accordance with the March 23, 2021, *Order Modifying Solar Rebate Program and Allowing Comments*, the Companies began filing biannual Solar Rebate Reports when the Solar Rebate Program began offering biannual application periods. The Companies will no longer have application periods because under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-155(f) there is no more rebate capacity except for the capacity that was reserved in the final January 2023 rollover application period. With the Commission's approval, the Companies request to provide annual reports on April 1 of each calendar year going forward. The Companies will continue to report on the rebates paid until the final rebate has been paid and the waitlist is cancelled. The Companies will also report on the assessment of any early termination

fees and any other information that the Companies deem pertinent or that the Commission requests.

WHEREFORE, Duke Energy Progress, LLC and Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC respectfully that the Commission:

(1) grant their request to file one annual report for the Solar Rebate Program on April 1 of each calendar year until the final rebate has been paid and the waitlist is cancelled.
